THE SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE

Now in its sixth decade of service, the Southland Conference continues to be a model of innovation, stability and consistent achievement as it celebrates the academic and athletic accomplishments of its member institutions.

Having commemorated its 50th anniversary in 2013, the Southland Conference has transformed itself into a dynamic and respected consortium of 13 member universities in three states. Beginning with a historic meeting of five institutions in Dallas on March 15, 1963, the Southland Conference set on an extraordinary course that has proven successful well into its five decades of existence.

The successful transformation continues, as the Southland Conference welcomed four additional members in 2013: Abilene Christian University, Houston Baptist University, the University of Incarnate Word in San Antonio, and the University of New Orleans.

In addition to its newest members, the Southland also consists of the University of Central Arkansas, Lamar University, McNeese State University, Nicholls State University, Northwestern State University, Sam Houston State University, Southeastern Louisiana University, Stephen F. Austin State University and Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi

An original Southland member from 1963-73, Abilene Christian rejoined the league as one of the most decorated athletic programs in NCAA history, and the addition of Houston Baptist, UIW and New Orleans gives the Southland a regular competitive presence in the key metropolitan areas of Houston, San Antonio and New Orleans. Southland cities encompass approximately 14 million people, and six of its television markets rank among the top 100 in the U.S.

All told, the membership of the Southland encompasses nearly 140,000 current students and an alumni base of nearly 800,000. Famous alums from current Southland Conference schools include former CBS news anchor Dan Rather (Sam Houston State), NBA executive Joe Dumars (McNeese State), ABC news anchor Robin Roberts (Southeastern Louisiana), Major League Baseball star Wade Miley (Southeastern Louisiana), NBA legend Scottie Pippen (Central Arkansas), and track and field Olympians Kenta Bell (Northwestern State), and Bobby Morrow and Billy Olson (both Abilene Christian).

Other notable alums from current members include Grammy Award-winning musicians Frank Ocean (New Orleans), Don Henley and Rodney Crowell (both Stephen F. Austin), and Ronnie Dunn (Abilene Christian), television personality and actress Ellen DeGeneres (New Orleans),

current NFL standouts Lardarius Webb (Nicholls State),
Terrence McGee (Northwestern State), and Daniel Manning
(Abilene Christian), professional golfers Shawn Stefani and
Chris Stroud (both Lamar) and Colin Montgomerie (HBU),
award-winning filmmaker Richard Linklater (Sam Houston
State), American Idol winner Kris Allen (Central Arkansas), NFL
Hall of Famer Jackie Harris (Northwestern State), former NFL
standouts Bobby Hebert (Northwestern State), Gary Barbaro
(Nicholls State), Wilbert Montgomery (Abilene Christian)
and Gary Reasons (Northwestern State), former MLB stars
Darryl Hamilton (Nicholls State) and Kevin Millar (Lamar),
NCAA football coach Charlie Strong (Central Arkansas),
actors John Larroquette (New Orleans), Ricardo Chavira
(UIW) and Jesse Borrego (UIW), and the late NFL coaching
legend O.A. "Bum" Phillips (Lamar and Stephen F. Austin).

The Southland sponsors 17 championship sports, all at the NCAA Division I level. The eight men's sports include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track and field. The women compete for nine championships in basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball. The conference earns automatic qualification to NCAA championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, and volleyball.

Continuing its tradition of innovation, the league launched the Southland Conference Television Network in the fall of 2008 and has broadcast more than 160 events. The network has expanded its reach to roughly 13 million households throughout Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas and Oklahoma in recent years, and has also gained national viewership through ESPN3 and Fox College Sports. In its first six years, the network has received recognition for its work, earning numerous College Sports Media and Telly Awards.

The Southland Conference, in conjunction with the city of Frisco, Texas, and Hunt Sports Group, also serves as the host to the NCAA Division I Football Championship Game in Frisco, which has been home to the conference headquarters since 2006. The game is played at Frisco's Toyota Stadium, and after a successful three-year run, the partnership was rewarded with a three-year renewal to serve as the national championship host site through the 2015 season.

Southland Conference football ranks among the best Football Championship Subdivision leagues in the nation, and enjoys an annual expectation of competing for the national championship with multiple teams advancing to the NCAA playoffs each year. In 2013, three Southland teams — Southeastern Louisiana, McNeese State and Sam Houston State — all qualified for the NCAA Division I Football Championship, and in 2011 and 2012, Sam Houston advanced to the national championship game. Also, in 2002 and 2003, McNeese State finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in the nation, and advanced to the 2002 national championship contest. The conference has been represented in eight national championship games since the league joined the FCS (formerly I-AA) in 1982. All told, Southland teams have played in 109 Division I playoff games in 32 years, winning 53 of the contests.

Historically, the Southland's successful football heritage has sustained itself through numerous membership and classification changes. The Southland joined the NCAA College Division in 1964, and was designated as NCAA Division II in 1973 before joining Division I in 1975. The Southland was an NCAA Division I-A league from 1978-81, before joining the ranks of FCS in 1982, its home ever since.

During its tenure as a Division I and I-A conference, the Southland Conference initiated the startup of the Shreveport, La.-based Independence Bowl in 1976. The Southland representative served as the host team of the bowl until 1980, compiling a 2-3 record in those contests.

The Conference can lay claim to five national championships, including College Division championships through former members Arkansas State (1970, UPI) and Louisiana Tech (1972, National Football Foundation). Louisiana Tech also won the first NCAA-sanctioned national title, winning the Division II playoffs in 1973. Tech followed that with the UPI's Division II national championship in 1974. Louisiana-Monroe won the 1987 Division I-AA national championship.

McNeese State, which has made 15 appearances in the national playoffs, also played in the 1997 NCAA Division I Championship game, while Stephen F. Austin played in the 1989 title contest and has six playoff appearances, including 2009 and 2010. Sam Houston State has earned seven trips to the football postseason, while Northwestern State has played in the playoffs six times. Nicholls has participated three times in the playoffs, and Central Arkansas has made consecutive playoff appearances in 2011 and 2012. On five occasions, the Southland has placed three teams in the NCAA playoffs.

The Southland has produced 172 first-team football

All-Americans during its history and in 2010, Stephen F. Austin quarterback Jeremy Moses became the first player in Southland history to receive the Walter Payton Award, which is presented annually to the most outstanding football player at the FCS level.

The Southland is one of five FCS conferences with at least 200 selections (206) in the National Football League draft. There have been 26 Southland players taken in the draft since 2000, including Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Robert Alford, who was picked as the first FCS player in the second round of the 2013 draft. There are more than 20 former Southland players on NFL rosters heading into the 2014 season.

Southland Conference alums in the NFL include Buffalo's Terrence McGee (Northwestern State) and Chicago's Josh McCown (Sam Houston State), who have each been in the league for the last 11 seasons. Other recent NFL additions from the Southland include Green Bay's Kevin Hughes (SoutheasternLouisiana), St. Louis' Jabara Williams (Stephen F. Austin) Washington's Devin Holland (McNeese State), Atlanta's Marcus Jackson (Lamar), Cleveland's Dominique Croom (Central Arkansas) and New Orleans' Tim Flanders (Sam Houston State).

The Southland has seen former Nicholls State players win Super Bowl rings in recent seasons, as former Colonel Antonio Robinson was a member of the Green Bay Packers' Super Bowl XLV champions. And, Nicholls-ex Lardarius Webb was a member of the Super Bowl XLVII champion Baltimore Ravens.

Among the former NFL stars from the Southland include Fred Dean, who was inducted to the Professional Football Hall of Fame in 2008 to become the first former Southland Conference player to earn induction in Canton. Other great NFL players from the Southland include Super Bowl XXIX quarterback Stan Humphries, Bill Bergey, Mike Barber, Fred Barnett, Bubby Brister, Ray Brown, Roger Carr, Larry Centers, Bruce Collie, Jackie Harris, Buford Jordan, Tim McKyer, Kavika Pittman, Billy Ryckman, Rickey Sanders, Eugene Seale, Rafael Septien, Terrance Shaw, Leonard Smith, Marcus Spears, Pat Tilley and Marvin Upshaw. Both Dean and Smith are recent inductees to the College Football Hall of Fame.

The Southland Conference has also seen its share of great coaches during its history in Maxie Lambright, Ernie

Duplechin, Sam Goodwin, Jack Doland, Bennie Ellender, Bobby Keasler, Larry Lacewell, Bill Davidson, Dennis Franchione, Pat Collins, and Ron Randleman.

In addition to football, the Southland Conference can point to a number of accomplishments in all sports.

Men's basketball has experienced a tremendous amount of success during the Southland's 50 years. The league has sent four teams to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen, as well as a squad to the NIT Final Four. Basketball stars Karl Malone, Joe Dumars, Jeff Foster, Dwight "Bo" Lamar, Andrew Toney and Mike Oliver played in the Southland Conference.

In 2013-14, Stephen F. Austin set numerous Southland records, including marks for victories in a season (32) and consecutive wins overall (29 straight) and in Conference play (23 in a row), and playing as a 12th seed, knocked off fifth-seeded Virginia Commonwealth, 77-75, in the NCAA's Second Round. In 2006, Northwestern State, playing as the No. 14 seed in the NCAA tournament, defeated No. 3 seed lowa, 64-63, in first-round action. The league also saw three of its men's teams reach the postseason in 2012.

Coaches such as Billy Tubbs, Mike Vining, Scotty Robertson, Jack Martin, Andy Russo, Bob Marlin, Danny Kaspar, Mike McConathy, Bobby Paschal and Pat Foster have led very successful teams in the Southland.

In women's basketball, the Southland also has its share of tradition with former member Louisiana-Monroe advancing to the 1985 NCAA Women's Final Four, and Stephen F. Austin sustaining itself as one of the most successful programs in the history of the sport. In 2014, the Ladyjacks became the fifth program in NCAA Division I history to record more than 950 wins

In each of the last five seasons, at least three Southland teams reached the postseason, and in 2013, four women's squads earned postseason berths. A Southland team has played in the WNIT 14 times, including each of the last eight years. Women's basketball all-stars have included Eun Jung Lee, Lisa Ingram, Portia Hill, Deneen Parker, Katrina Price, and Joskeen Garner, and coaches such as Gary Blair, Linda Sharp, James Smith and Linda Harper.

Baseball has emerged as a constant Southland Conference strength with the league earning numerous national rankings and NCAA tournament berths. The Southland consistently ranks among the top-10 conferences in the country. In

2011, 50 of the league's 150 non-conference victories came against the Big 12, Conference USA, Sun Belt and SEC. Major leaguers such as Wade Miley, Paul Goldschmidt, Ben Sheets, Micah Hoffpauir, Hunter Pence, David Segui, Brian Lawrence, Ben Broussard, Chuck Finley, Jerald Clark, and Terry Matthews once played in the Southland.

In 2012, Southeastern Louisiana's Stefan Lopez became the league's second winner of the national Stopper of the Year Award, which is selected by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers. Sam Houston State's Luke Prihoda won the award in 2007. Only the Big 12 has had more players win this award.

The Southland also fares well each year in the Major League Draft, but for the first time in conference history, two Southland players were selected in the first round of the 2013 draft. Stephen F. Austin shortstop Hunter Dozier was picked eighth by the Kansas City Royals making the Southland player and hitter of the year the league's top draft pick in any sport. Later in the first round, the Texas Rangers selected Oral Roberts right-handed pitcher Alex Gonzalez, Southland pitcher of the year, with the 23rd overall pick. The Southland has had eight first-round picks in its history.

In 2013, Lamar mentor Jim Gilligan became the first Southland coach to reach 1,250 career victories, ranking him sixth-best in the NCAA among active Division I coaches and 14th all-time. He leads an impressive list of coaches who have patrolled Southland Conference dugouts, including Mark Johnson, Mike Bianco, John Cohen, Mitch Gaspard, Smoke Laval, Butch McBroom, Pat Patterson, Tony Robichaux, Dave Van Horn and Jim Wells.

Softball continues to enjoy success on a national level, beating nationally-ranked opponents every year since 1995, including McNeese State's win at No. 1 Arizona State early in the 2012 season. In 2013, the league had six wins against ranked opponents, including wins by McNeese State at No. 7 Alabama and No. 8 Texas A&M. In NCAA tournament competition, the Southland has racked up 15 wins.

The Southland also has a proud history in volleyball with former member Texas-Arlington representing the conference numerous times in the NCAA tournament, including a run to the NCAA Volleyball Final Four in 1989.

Track and field has also served as a proud asset for the Southland Conference as the league has produced numerous

national champions and Olympic medalists. The Southland boasts 28 men and three women student-athletes who have won NCAA track and field national championships, including Northwestern State's Trecey Rew, who won the women's discus in 2011, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi's Shadrack Songok (10,000-meter run) in 2007 and 2008 and McNeese State's Brad Gebauer (pole vault) in 2007. The league has also produced U.S. Olympic track and field medalists Earl Bell, Thomas Hill, Al Joyner, Charles Austin, and Liudmila Litvinova, along with other Olympians. With the addition of 10 more All-Americans in 2012, the league continues to find national success in both indoor and outdoor track and field. In the indoor circuit, the Southland boasts 66 unique all-time All-Americans that have won a combined 11 national championships. Likewise, in the outdoor season, the league has seen 158 different All-Americans, including 128 men and 30 women, who have combined to win 21 national championships.

Golf has traditionally been a strong Southland sport as exemplified by Lamar men's golfer Chris Stroud, who finished third individually at the 2003 NCAA National Championship and has 21 top ten PGA finishes since joining pro tour in 2007. Another Lamar alum, Shawn Stefani, had a pair of top seven finishes on the 2013 PGA tour. The league has sent multiple teams into postseason play on numerous occasions, including in 2012 when three Southland teams — Lamar, Southeastern Louisiana and Texas-Arlington — competed in the NCAA tournament. Additionally, during the past five seasons the Southland has sent 12 golfers to compete as individuals in regional play with five in 2009, three more in 2010, one each in 2011 and 2012 and two in 2013. Lamar won a pair of NCAA Division II national championships in 1967 and 1968.

In 2005, Lamar's Dawie Van Der Walt finished fourth individually and Lamar tied for 12th place at the NCAA Men's Golf Championship, before the Cardinals tied for ninth in 2006 and tied for third in 2007.

In women's tennis, Southeastern Louisiana won 46 consecutive conference matches during a four-year period that began in 2005, while in men's tennis Texas A&M-Corpus Christi has played in the NCAA tournament six times in the last eight years.

The conference has increased sponsorship and championship opportunities for female student-athletes in recent years, adding women's golf and soccer as league sports.

In women's soccer, Stephen F. Austin midfielder Kylie Louw became the first player in conference history to earn All-America honors, when she earned third-team mention by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. A member of the South Africa Olympic team during the 2012 London Olympics, she also garnered first-team Academic All-America Honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America. Abilene Christian's Brie Buschman was a first-team Academic All-American in 2013.

In women's golf, the Southland sent two teams to 2012 NCAA regional play for the first time since the league added the sport in 2002. Lamar has a league-best five Southland championships during that span.

The Southland Conference has repeatedly demonstrated its commitment to the academic and athletic success of its student-athletes. With the F.L. McDonald Postgraduate Scholarship Award, the league annually honors one male and one female scholar-athlete with a stipend for postgraduate study. The Scholar-Athlete Award is given to each institution's male and female student-athlete with the highest grade-point average. The Steve McCarty Citizenship Award, initiated in 2005-06 and named after the former Stephen F. Austin athletic director, properly recognizes accomplishments off the court for a male and female student-athlete. Also, student-athletes with grade-point averages above 3.0 are honored on the Southland's annual All-Academic teams

and Commissioner's Honor Roll. A record total of 1,253 student-athletes appeared on the honor roll following the 2014 spring semester, and total of 2,164 student-athletes earned a spot on the honor roll at the end of the fall and spring semesters during the 2013-14 academic year.

While successful on the fields and courts, the Southland Conference has repeatedly demonstrated its commitment to the academic and athletic success of its student-athletes.

The conference continues to make great strides in the classroom. During the last seven years, no other Division I conference has improved its Academic Progress Rate as well as the Southland Conference has. In fact, in 2009-10, the Southland ranked 10th among the 31 Division I leagues in men's basketball APR. The academic progress the league has shown ultimately leads to higher graduation rates for our student-athletes.

In addition to providing expanding opportunities for student-athletes, the Southland Conference and its member institutions are very involved in various community outreach programs. Many of these programs provide positive life skills training such as academics, citizenship and leadership to school-aged students in Southland communities.

Southland Conference Commissioner 12th Year

Tom Burnett was named the Southland Conference's sixth commissioner on Dec. 23, 2002, and brought a diverse background in athletics administration experience at the conference and national levels. Now the second-longest tenured full-time commissioner in league history, Burnett is now in his 12th year of service with the Southland, and has a conference administrative background reaching over 25 years.

Burnett has helped to enhance the Southland's membership, with the 2013 additions of Houston Baptist University, the University of New Orleans, Abilene Christian University and the University of the Incarnate Word. The new member institutions give the Southland 13 members in Texas, Louisiana and Arkansas.

The league's television exposure has expanded under his watch with the creation of the Southland Conference Television Network in 2008. This broadcast venture has since featured over 150 unique sports and promotional telecasts to a potential viewing audience of more than 13 million television households. The Southland also signed a multi-year agreement with the ESPN family of networks in 2010, and the league has enjoyed beneficial relationships with Fox Sports Net Southwest, Cox Sports Television and Comcast SportsNet Houston.

He also led the successful community-wide effort to bring the 2011-13 NCAA Division I Football Championship Games to Frisco, Texas, as the Southland serves as the host conference for the national title contests at Toyota Stadium. The NCAA subsequently renewed the agreement to keep the national championship game in Frisco through the 2016 event. A leading proponent for the Football Championship Subdivision, Burnett also organized the FCS Summit, a na-

tional gathering of athletic directors, commissioners, NCAA staff and other key football stakeholders held annually prior to the national championship games in Frisco.

A former member of both the NCAA's Division I Committee on Academic Performance and the Division I Football Academic Working Group, Burnett also served as the FCS Vice President for the Collegiate Commissioners Association (CCA) in 2007-08. He currently serves on the NCAA's FCS Working Group that consists of presidents, commissioners, athletic directors and coaches. He is also a member of the Board of Managers for College Football Officiating (CFO), LLC, an entity created by the NCAA and the Collegiate Commissioners Association to enhance college football officiating in Division I and act as a central point-of-contact for college football officiating issues. He also formerly served on the Board of Directors for NCAA Football.

In 2004, Burnett also began the league's renewed efforts to secure corporate sponsorships. Since then, the Southland has secured sponsorship agreements with State Farm Insurance, Capital One Bank, Toyota, American Airlines, Royal Purple Motor Oil, Best Western Hotels, O'Reilly Auto Parts, BellSouth, Aeropostale, Holiday Inn, MidSouth Bank, Academy Sports and Outdoors, and Advantage Rent-A-Car.

He also initiated efforts in 2007 to bring the Southland Conference basketball tournaments to a neutral site in the Houston area, giving the league a year-end celebration of the sport at a centralized location near much of the Southland's largest alumni and student bases. The tournament has remained in the Houston area since, and league administrators recently agreed to extend the stay at least through the 2017 event.

Prior to joining the Southland, Burnett spent nearly 11 years in a number of roles with the Sun Belt Conference, including stints as associate and assistant commissioner, and director of communications. He also served two years on the staff of the American South Conference, and started his career on the athletic staff at Louisiana Tech University.

His previous responsibilities included championships administration, public and media relations, television production and negotiation, scheduling, marketing, NCAA championship and committee service, and football bowl experience.

While at the Sun Belt, Burnett worked in the development of football as a league-sponsored sport, and was an administrator with the New Orleans Bowl, which began in 2001. He also produced the Sun Belt's television packages with ESPN Regional Television, which debuted in 2002. In addition, he has experience negotiating television agreements with regional sports networks such as Fox Sports Net, Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast and numerous local television stations and cable systems.

He also provided oversight of Sun Belt championship events and administered more than 100 league tournaments. In 2000, he began exclusively administering the Sun Belt's men's and women's basketball tournaments, which grew from minimal financial successes into events that grossed the conference \$1.2 million during a three-year period.

Burnett has also served in an administrative capacity with numerous NCAA events, including national championships in men's and women's basketball, track and field, baseball and volleyball.

He represented the Southland Conference on the NCAA Division I Management Council in 2004-05, and served on the Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Governance Committee from 2004-06. Burnett previously served on the NCAA Playing Rules Oversight Panel, and the NCAA Baseball Rules Committee.

Burnett, 50, is a native of Houston, Texas, and is a 1988 graduate of Louisiana Tech University, where he studied journalism and spent one year as the sports editor of the school's student newspaper.

He and his wife Tracy, a native of Baton Rouge, La., are the parents of a son, Cole, and a daughter, Jesse.

SOUTHLAND BROADCAST PACKAGE



The Southland Conference men's basketball championship game is set for Saturday primetime coverage on ESPN2 again this season. The matchup, with an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament on the line, is set for March 15.

ESPN2's audience will see Southland basketball during the first week of the season, as well. Defending regular-season and tournament champion Stephen F. Austin will host Northern lowa in the College Hoops Tip-Off Marathon on Nov. 18. In addition to that appearance, Southland teams will be seen on ESPNEWS, Fox Sports 1, Fox Sports Net, Big Ten Network, SEC Network and other national outlets during non-conference play.

ESPN3 enters its third year as the home of the Southland's primary television package. Coverage includes eight conference doubleheaders, with women's and men's games carried back-to-back. There are seven pre-determined broadcasts, plus a wild card selection on the season's final weekend.

The conference slate on ESPN3 begins in Huntsville, Texas when Sam Houston State hosts Houston Baptist on Jan. 31. The Bearkats are coming off a 24-win season that concluded in the second round of the CollegeInsider. com Tournament.

On Feb. 7, a pair of games are schedule for coverage. In the afternoon, New Orleans visits Central Arkansas. Then in primetime, it'll be a battle of Cardinals, as Lamar takes on UIW in San Antonio.


Hammond is the next stop, as Abilene Christian meets Southeastern Louisiana on Feb. 21.

Stephen F. Austin Picked to Defend Conference Title by League Coaches, Sports Information Directors

Defending Southland Conference regular-season and tournament champion Stephen F. Austin has been named the preseason favorite following a vote of the league's coaches and sports information directors who are eligible to win the conference this season. The Lumberjacks are coming off a school-record 32-3 record, including a perfect 18-0 mark in conference play. Stephen F. Austin, which advanced to the third round of the NCAA tournament, returns three starters including reigning conference player of the year Jacob Parker. The Lumberjacks earned the No. 12 seed in the NCAA Tournament and defeated No. 5 VCU before falling to No. 4 UCLA. SFA received 11 first-place votes from the coaches for 143 total points while picking up 10 first-place nods from the SIDs and 144 total points.

Northwestern State was picked second in both polls with 129 total points from both the coaches' and SIDs. The Demons received one first-place vote from the coaches and the final three first-place votes from the SIDs. Sam Houston State was slotted third followed by Texas A&M-Corpus Christi in the coaches' poll while the Bearkats and Islanders tied for third in the SID poll. A&M-Corpus Christi received the coaches' last first-place vote. Five through 10 in the two polls are identical with McNeese State at No. 5 followed by UIW, Southeastern Louisiana, Nicholls, New Orleans and Lamar. Abilene Christian is 11th in the coaches' poll with Central Arkansas and Houston Baptist at 12th and 13th, respectively. In the SID balloting, UCA is 11th while ACU and HBU tied for the 12th position.

Seven All-Conference Selections Return for 2014-15 Season

Seven All-Southland Conference selections return from last year including three award winners from last season. Conference Player of the Year Jacob Parker, a forward from Stephen F. Austin, headlines the preseason teams along with Northwestern State's Jalan West, the league's defender of the year, and Sam Houston State guard Jabari Peters, the top newcomer from last season. As returning all-league players, the three automatically earned first-team all-conference preseason honors.

Also earning automatic selections to the preseason teams were Texas A&M-Corpus Christi quard John Jordan, UIW guard Denzel Livingston, SFA guard Thomas Walkup and Sam Houston guard Kaheem Ransom. Walkup and Ransom were slotted on the second team while Parker, West, Jordan, Livingston and Peters complete the first team.

Parker earned player of the year honors after leading the Lumberjacks to their best season in school history. SFA finished the year with a 32-3 overall mark, including an unblemished 18-0 conference record. SFA won its second consecutive regular-season title and fourth overall and earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament after claiming its second tournament title. Parker finished the year with a 14.2 scoring average while pulling down 7.1 rebounds per game and 1.4 steals a game.

Completing the second team are McNeese State guard Kevin Hardy, Northwestern State guard Zeek Woodley, last's season's freshman of the year, and A&M-Corpus Christi forward Rashawn Thomas.

Thirteen Teams Represent Southland Basketball

For the fourth time in as many season, the Southland Conference will have a different look in basketball. The league reached an all-time high 14 members last season with the additions of Houston Baptist University, University of New Orleans, Abilene Christian and University of the Incarnate Word. However, after only two years in the league, Oral Roberts returned to the Summit League. The 2014-15 season will feature thirteen schools with ACU, Central Arkansas, HBU, UIW, Lamar, McNeese State, UNO, Nicholls, Northwestern State, Sam Houston State, Southeastern Louisiana, Stephen F. Austin and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. ACU and UIW are still transitioning from NCAA Division II and will not be eligible to win the conference championship during their transition periods, which should be completed in time for the 2017-18 season.

Katy Remains the Destination for Eighth Consecutive Year

The 2015 Southland Conference Men's and Women's Basketball Tournament returns to the Leonard E. Merrell Center in Katy, Texas. This will be the eighth consecutive year for the tournament to be held in Katy. This year's tournament will begin on Wednesday, March 12 with first-round action beginning at 5 p.m. The second round will follow on Thursday, March 13. All four games in the first two rounds will be streamed live for free on the Southland Conference Digital Network. The semifinals, which will be shown on ESPN3, will take place on Friday, March 14 and the championship will be played Saturday, March 15 with an 8:30 p.m. tipoff and be televised on ESPN2. The 2015 tournament will be the 16th in league history to be played at a neutral site. The tournament was played in Shreveport, La., from 1995-2001 and was held in Houston before moving to Katy in 2008.

Southland to Play 40 Non-Conference Games against Teams in 2014 Postseason Tournaments

All 13 Southland Conference teams will play a combined 40 non-conference games against teams that reached the postseason in 2014. Included in that total are 20 games against teams that played in the NCAA tournament, seven games against teams that participated in the National Invitational Tournament, eight games against teams in the College Basketball Invitational and another five game against teams that reached the CollegeInsider.com Tournament. Southeastern Louisiana and UIW will both play a league-high five opponents that reached the postseason a year ago with the Lions facing three teams in the NCAA tournament and the Cardinals two teams. Nicholls is the only school to play a team that reached the 2014 Final Four when it travels to Wisconsin, Dec. 13. November 14 and Dec. 2 are scheduled to have three games against teams in last season's NCAA tournament. On the opening day of the season (Nov. 14), Central Arkansas travels to Creighton, McNeese State visits Baylor and Southeastern Louisiana goes to Oklahoma State. On Dec. Lamar visits Iowa State, Stephen F. Austin faces Memphis and Southeastern Louisiana goes west to play Gonzaga.

SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE PREVIEW



Stephen F. Austin Runs Through Conference PLay Unblemished in 2013-14

The Lumberjacks became the first Southland team to navigate a perfect 18-game league schedule to win its second consecutive conference title and fourth overall in 2013-14. SFA capped its regular season with an 85-61 victory over Central Arkansas to extend its home-court win streak to a national-best 33 games and ran its overall win streak to 26 games, second only two Wichita State. SFA also tied the conference record for wins in a season with 29 against only two losses.

Lumberjacks Clinch NCAA Berth with Southland Tournament Title

Stephen F. Austin used a 21-5 second-half run to turn a tight game into a 68-49 rout of Sam Houston State to win the 2014 Southland Conference Men's Basketball Tournament Championship at the Leonard E. Merrell Center to earn the automatic bid into the NCAA tournament. The win was also the 28th straight for the Lumberjacks, the nation's second-longest streak in the nation at the time. SFA went undefeated in 18 Southland Conference games en route to earning the school's second tournament championship. Tournament most valuable player Thomas Walkup scored 19 points and added five rebounds and four assists for the Lumberjacks, who led just 35-32 with 18:12 remaining before going on their decisive run, which put them up 56-37 with 7:08 left after a basket from Conner Brooks. Sam Houston hit just 2 of 8 shots and committed six turnovers during the pivotal run and the Bearkats were held to only 38.6 percent shooting on the night. The Bearkats were up 22-17 following Terrance Motley's jumper at the 6:45 mark of the first half, but the Lumberjacks responded with a 14-2 run that was highlighted by a pair of treys from Deshaunt Walker.

Stephen F. Austin Rallies to Defeat VCU in Second Round of NCAA Tournament

No. 12 seed Stephen F. Austin closed out regulation on a four-point play from senior Desmond Haymon to tie the game at 67-67 and then outscored VCU 10-8 in overtime to advance to the third round of the NCAA tournament with a 77-75 victory, the program's first-ever win in the big dance. Haymon and the Lumberjacks trailed the Rams by five points (66-61) with 32 seconds remaining and made a charge in the final minute. After a made jumper from Haymon, who finished with 17 points, cut the lead to three, VCU's Briante Weber hit a free throw to push it to 67-63 with 21 seconds remaining. In the next possession, sophomore Thomas Walkup made a move in the paint to open up Haymon, who then knocked down a 3-pointer with five seconds remaining, drawing the foul for the and-one. After a timeout, Haymon went to the line with the season on the line and sunk his free throw to tie it 67-67 in the waning seconds. Haymon finished 5-of-12 from the field, with three made shots beyond the arc, and 4-of-5 from the line, while collecting seven rebounds. Junior Jacob Parker led SFA offensively with a game-high 22 points. The native of Bixby, Okla., was 9-of-14 from the field in the win, finishing 2-for-2 from both the 3-point and free-throw lines. Walkup recorded his third double-double of the season, with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

Stephen F. Austin Falls to UCLA in Third Round

Stephen F. Austin had its memorable season come to an end in a 77-60 loss to No. 4 seed UCLA in the third round of the NCAA tournament. The Lumberjacks suffered their first defeat since Nov. 23, to end their 29-game overall win streak. Sophomore Thomas Walkup recorded his fourth double-double of the season, with a game-high 22points and 11 rebounds, to pace the SFA against the Bruins. The native of Pasadena, Texas, finished 10 of 17 from the field with two free throws. Senior Desmond Haymon finished with 17 points, on 3-of-11 shooting, with all coming beyond the arc, and 8 of 10 from the charity stripe; senior Nikola Gajic finished with 10 points. Junior Jacob Parker was limited to five points, but pulled in nine boards, seven on the defensive end, in the loss. UCLA limited the Lumberjacks to 20-of-57 shooting for a 35.1 shooting percentage, a season-low.

Sam Houston State, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi Lose in Second Round of CIT

The season came to an end for the two Southland Conference teams in the College Insider Tournament. Texas A&M-Corpus Christi lost 89-60 at Pacific while Sam Houston State dropped a 77-72 contest at home against San Diego. The Islanders finish the year 18-16 while the Bearkats end with an overall record of 24-11. Joy Williamson led the Islanders with 17 points in a losing effort in his final game of his collegiate career. Sam Houston State rallied from 10 points down in the second half and led by five at one point but in the end a 3-point attempt rattled in and out and San Diego sealed a 77-72 victory.

Islander's Wilson Wins Ben Jobe Coach of the Year Award

Texas A&M-Corpus Christi men's basketball coach Willis Wilson was presented with the 2014 Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, which is presented annually to the top minority coach in Division I men's basketball. Wilson led the Islanders to 18 wins and a second-place finish in the Southland this year. A&M-Corpus Christi finished with 12 more wins in 2013-14 than it did the previous season, the third biggest turnaround in the nation this year. Only Wisconsin-Milwaukee and Old Dominion (both plus-13) posted more improvement than the Islanders.

SFA's Underwood Named 2014 Joe B. Hall Award Winner

Stephen F. Austin men's basketball coach Brad Underwood was named the recipient of the 2014 Joe B. Hall award, given to the nation's top first-year coach. Underwood becomes the first SFA head coach to win the award, guiding the Lumberjacks to a 32-3 overall record and berth in the third round of the NCAA tournament. Under Underwood's guidance, the Lumberjacks became the first Southland school in the league's 51-year history to win 29 games in the regular season and first 30-game winner, passing the 1984-85 Louisiana Tech squad that went 29-3 and reached the Sweet 16 with Karl Malone. Along the way, SFA joined top-ranked Florida and second-ranked Wichita State as the only schools to go undefeated in conference play this season. The Lumberjacks became just the 18th team all-time to do so at the Division I level in conference schedules of 18 games or more.

SOUTHLAND BASKETBALL

Now in its 52nd year of basketball, the Southland Conference has experienced a tremendous amount of success, initially at the Division II level before advancing to Division I:

- 49 NBA Draft Picks
- 24 NCAA Tournament Victories
- . 9 Victories in the NIT
- 6 NBA First-Round Draft Picks
- 4 NCAA Sweet 16 Appearances
- 2 Basketball Hall of Fame Members
- 1 NIT Final Four Appearance

The league has sent teams to the NCAA Division I Sweet Sixteen in 1972, 1973, 1980 and 1985, as well as a squad to the 1986 NIT Final Four, the 1968 Division II national championship game and the 1966 DII Final Four. Basketball stars Karl Malone, Joe Dumars, Jeff Foster, Dwight "Bo" Lamar, Andrew Toney, Devin Brown and Mike Olliver played in the Southland Conference and NBA.

The league's basketball history has experienced recent success in the Division I tournament, which expanded to 68 teams in 2011. Stephen F. Austin earned the league's most recent postseason victory when it came from behind in the final seconds to defeat No. 5-seed VCU 77-75 in overtime in the second round. The Lumberjacks, which were the No. 12 seed, relied on a four-point play from senior Demond Haymon with 3.6 second left to force overtime.

In 2011, Texas-San Antonio posted a first round win when it defeated Alabama State, 70-61. In 2006, Northwestern State, as the No. 14 seed, defeated No. 3-seed lowa, 64-63 in the first round, thanks to a three-point basket with 0.5 seconds remaining from Jermaine Wallace. Former member Trinity University was the first Southland Conference school to qualify for the NCAA Division I tournament, qualifying for the 1969 event, after playing in the 1968 Division II Final Four. Abilene Christian won four Division II Tournament games in the 1960's and advanced to the 1966 Division II National Championship Game.

Although vacated later following NCAA sanctions, Southwestern Louisiana (now Louisiana-Lafayette) posted

three wins as it advanced to the 1972 and 1973 NCAA Division I Sweet Sixteen.

The league's first recognized win in the NCAA DI Tournament came in 1979, as No. 10-seed Lamar knocked off No. 7-seed Detroit, 95-87. A year later, Lamar advanced to the Sweet Sixteen with wins over No. 7 Weber State and No. 2 Oregon State. Lamar continued its run of success with a 1981 NCAA first round win over No. 9-seed Missouri, and a 1983 first round victory over No. 6-seed Alabama. Former member Louisiana Tech added a 1986 NCAA first-round win over Fresno State, and added the league's next Sweet Sixteen berth in 1985, it posted wins over No. 12 Pittsburgh and No. 4 Ohio State. Northwestern State also recorded an opening-round game over Winthrop in the

2001 NCAA tournament.

The Southland has also experienced success in the National Invitational Tournament, beginning in 1980, when Louisiana-Lafayette advanced to the quarterfinals with wins over UAB and Texas. In 1986, the league sent a record three schools to the NIT – Louisiana Tech, McNeese State and Lamar – with Tech advancing to the NIT Final Four after wins against Northern Arizona, McNeese State

and Providence, before falling to Ohio State in the semifinals at Madison Square Garden. Louisiana Tech then won the consolation game against Florida.

The Southland has also seen six league players selected in the opening round of the NBA Draft, including a league-best two players in the 1985 draft. Louisiana Tech's Karl Malone was drafted 13th overall by Utah and McNeese State's Joe Dumars was drafted 18th by Detroit. Both have been enshrined the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, as Dumars was inducted in 2006 and Malone in 2010. Malone was also honored as one of the NBA's Top 50 Players in 1996.

The highest Southland draftee was Louisiana Tech's Mike Green, taken fourth by Seattle in 1973. Other Southland first-round selections include Louisiana-Lafayette's Andrew Toney, drafted eighth overall by Philadelphia in 1980, Lamar's Tom Sewell selected 22nd by Philadelphia in 1984 and Texas State's Jeff Foster, taken 21st by Indiana in 1999. Stephen F. Austin, although not yet a member of the Southland Conference, had five players drafted in the 1970 NBA Draft, and is one of only seven schools to have five players selected in a single draft, joining UCLA, UNLV, North Carolina, Indiana, Florida and Kentucky.

Southland teams have also received recognition in the final national polls, as Louisiana-Lafayette finished No. 8 and No. 7 in the 1972 and 1973 polls, respectively, while Louisiana Tech finished No. 8 in 1985.

Over the years, Southland Conference teams have earned victories over Texas Tech, Houston, Kentucky, Mississippi State, Iowa, Oklahoma State, Missouri, Texas A&M, Oklahoma, LSU, Alabama, Auburn, Pittsburgh, Oregon, Oregon State, Southern California, Texas, Arizona and Gonzaga.

Three league teams reached the postseason a year ago. Stephen F. Austin, which won the Southland's automatic bid by winning the conference tournament, played in the NCAA tournament, while Sam Houston State and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi each picked up first round wins in the Collegelnsider.com Tournament. It was the first postseason win for either program.

FANS SELECT 'DEMONS OF DESTINY' AS LEAGUE'S TOP MOMENT

The storied season of the 2005-06 Northwestern State men's basketball team, also known as the "Demons of Destiny," has been chosen by fans as the Southland Con-

ference's Greatest Moment in the sport. In balloting on the Southland's Facebook page during the league's 50th basketball season in 2013, the "Demons of Destiny" outpaced a field of outstanding candidates vying for the honor of greatest men's basketball moment.


The Demons dominated the Southland Conference schedule with a 15-1 mark

and rolled to three more wins in the league tournament to secure an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. Garnering a No. 14 seed, the Demons were matched with the formidable task of facing No. 3 seed and Big Ten tournament champion lowa at Auburn Hills, Mich. The Demons trailed 28-24 at halftime. The Hawkeyes rebuilt a daunting lead in the second half as well, stretching their advantage to 54-37 with 8:29 left to play.

Just when it looked like the Demons' season was coming to an end, NSU's Clifton Lee went on an amazing run, scoring 16 points in a 20-6 spurt that narrowed lowa's

advantage to 60-57 with less than two minutes to play. As the game reached its waning moments, a Hawkeye free throw gave lowa a 63-61 lead with 14 seconds left, leading to one of the greatest moments in NCAA tournament history. The Demons had an initial shot at tying the game when Kerwin Forges' two-point attempt rattled off the rim high and into the

hands of NSU's Jermaine Wallace. With only 0.5 seconds left, Wallace heaved a fade-away 3-point attempt from the corner that found nothing but net, giving the Demons a 64-63 lead, and following a desperation half-court miss by the Hawkeyes, Northwestern State owned one of the greatest comebacks in the history of March Madness.



ABOUT THE WILDCATS



For the first time in his four seasons as the Abilene Christian men's basketball head coach, Joe Golding returns a nucleus of players that Golding and his coaching staff believe can finally help begin the turnaround process for the Wildcat basketball program.

And for a program that has just one winning season in the last seven and four in the last 18, that's going to be quite a turnaround. But with seniors like LaDarrien Williams and Harrison Hawkins returning to the lineup, along with juniors Parker Wentz and Austin Cooke and sophomore Michael Grant and newcomers like junior college transfers Jalen Little and Duran Porter and freshmen Drake Green, K.J. Maura and Isaiah Tripp, Golding believes the Wildcats might finally be ready to make a move upward.

"We're trying to get more accountability in the classroom, on the floor, in the locker room, and in the weight room," Golding said. "Our guys worked hard in the offseason on the floor and in the weight room getting into better shape. Nowwe've gotto translate that into becoming a better team when the lights come on."

The Wildcats will be immediately better with the return of their starting backcourt in guard LaDarrien Williams and Harrison Hawkins, each of whom missed the entire spring semester. Williams was injured and missed the final 16 games, while Hawkins was ruled ineligible and missed the same amount of games.

When each was lost to the Wildcats, they were averaging 12.7 points (Williams) and 12.3 points (Hawkins) per game to lead the team. However, Williams underwent off-season surgery on his lower leg and will be back in time for the start of the season, while Hawkins worked during the spring and summer to regain his eligibility and return to the team.

"Having both of those guys will be huge for our team," Golding said. "Obviously it really hurt us not having either one of those in games for almost the entirety of the conference schedule. LD isn't completely back yet, but he's working his way back into shape and he'll be ready to go. I'm also extremely happy with Harrison and how hard he's worked and how he's handled his business to regain his eligibility. He needed a second chance and that's what this school and this program is about."

Williams and Hawkins will be joined on the floor by returning starters in Wentz at guard and Cooke at forward.

"Those two guys (Wentz and Cooke) had great offseasons, and I'm looking forward to what the season holds for each of them," Golding said. "I think Parker is one of the best shooters in the country, and Cooke has the chance to be one of the top big men in the league before he's done."

The Wildcats also return sophomore Riley Payne, senior Aleksander Milosalvjevic, sophomore guard Chris Blakeley and redshirt freshman center Christian Albright. Those players will provide the Wildcats with solid depth and also help some of the young freshmen and transfers acclimate themselves to ACU.

While last year's early season schedule was a Murderer's Row of sorts with Duquesne, St. Bonaventure, Maryland, lowa, TCU, Xavier and Towson all on the schedule in the season's first month, the Wildcats will enjoy a bit of a reprieve in 2014-15. They'll still play several solid teams from places like Tulsa and Houston (American Athletic Conference), Duquesne (Atlantic 10), Boise State (Mountain West) and Grand Canyon (WAC).

RECORD AT SCHOOL 35-50 (THREE SEASONS)

Former Abilene Christian letterman and assistant basketball coach Joe Golding is at the start of his fourth season as the head men's basketball coach at his alma mater. He was hired July 18, 2011, by his former teammate, former ACU director of athletics Jared Mosley.

Last year in the Wildcats' first season at the NCAA Division I level, Golding led ACU to an 11-20 mark against one of the toughest schedules in the nation. The Wildcats hit the road to play Duquesne, St. Bonaventure, Maryland, Iowa, TCU, Xavier and Towson all in the season's first month.

The Wildcats were 2-12 in Southland Conference play, but lost four games by four points or less and another three games by eight points or less. ACU also led the Terrapins of Maryland through the game's first 28 minutes before finally falling to the 2002 NCAA national champion.

Golding's Wildcats won 12 games for the second consecutive year in 2012-13, but were 6-2 against non-conference teams and improved on their standing within the Lone Star Conference. And even though the 2012-13 squad posted the same scoring average (71.5 ppg) as Golding's first ACU team, the Wildcats became much better overall at shooting (.460) and rebounding (35.5) while reducing their number of turnovers.

Before returning to Abilene, Golding coached the previous three seasons for head coach Steve Shields at Arkansas-Little Rock, helping the Trojans to the Sun Belt Conference title and an appearance in the NCAA Division I national tournament.

Golding joined the UALR coaching staff on July 1, 2008, bringing with him nine years of coaching experience at the junior college and high school levels. Prior to joining the Trojans, Golding spent three seasons (2005-08) as the top assistant to head coach Jason Copeland at Abilene Christian, where his primary duties included recruiting, scouting and on-floor coaching. A former point guard at ACU from 1994-98, he was also responsible for coaching the Wildcat guards.

In 2007-08, Golding helped guide the Wildcats to a 20-9 record, marking the program's first 20-win season since the 1998-99 campaign. The 2007-08 ACU squad qualified for the Lone Star Conference Tournament for the first time since 1998, Golding's senior season.

Golding was a four-year letterwinner at ACU from 1994-98, playing in all 108 games, and was given the Teague Point Guard Award as a senior. He shot 46 percent from the floor over his four-year career, and averaged 4.3 points and 4.2 assists per game.

Wentz returns for his third season as a Wildcat after averaged 14.0 points per game and earning national honors for his work in the classroom ... Wentz was voted first team Capital One Academic all-District 7 and first team Academic all-Southland Conference ... during the 2013-14 season, Wentz led the Southland in 3-point field goals made per game (2.9), was second in total 3-point field goals made (79), was second in free throw percentage (.870), and was fourth in steals (1.6 per game) and 3-point field goal percentage (.444) ... he also finished in the league's top 18 in minutes played per game, scoring, assists and field goal percentage ... his .444 3-point field goal percentage is tied for the single-season ACU record, and his career .422 3-point field goal percentage makes him ACU's all-time leader through two seasons.

ABOUT THE BEARS



The University of Central Arkansas Bears will have a completely new look this season, both on the floor and on the bench.

Coach Russ Pennell, a former player for the Bears, took the reins of the program in March and has completely revamped the roster to the tune of 11 new players and only one returning player.

Pennell, who set the career assist record at UCA in only two seasons in the early 1980s, retained sophomore Ethan Lee, a 6-foot-7 forward from Camden, Ark., and brought in 11 new players to fill out the 2014-15 roster.

Heading the list is 6-9, 230-pound center Jake Zuilhof from Grand Canyon University, the school at which Pennell coached from 2009-13. Zuilhof graduated from Grand Canyon but has two years of eligibility remaining at UCA. He will provide size and athleticism inside for the young Bears squad.

Junior Michael Martin, a 6-0 guard from Wichita, Kan., transfers in from Coffeyville Community College and is expected to bring much-needed experience from a highly competitive Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference.

Lee, the lone holdover, played in all 29 games at UCA as a true freshman last season, with eight starts. He averaged 4.3 points and 2.6 rebounds a game, with season highs of 16 points and 6 rebounds against Northwestern State. A bigger, stronger Lee is expected to contribute even more this season.

The remainder of the roster is made up of freshman with the exception of junior Joel Fiegler, a 6-10 forward from Las Vegas, who transferred from Phoenix College.

Jordan Howard, a 5-11 freshman from Chandler, Ariz., could fill the role of point guard. Freshman Albert Christensson from Lund Sweden, will add additional size at 6-9, 220, while freshman Otas Oyekekpolor is an athletic 6-8 forward from Edmonton, Canada.

Michael Milligan, Jr., of Los Angeles has good size at forward (6-6, 195), while another Canadian product, Mathieu Kamba of Calgary, Alberta, brings similar size to the guard position (6-5, 205). Thatch Unruh, a 6-5 guard from Branson, Mo., will be counted on for perimeter shooting.

Walk-ons Tyler Simmons of Greenbrier, Ark., and Hunter Ball of Waldron, Ark., will provide roster depth for the Bears.

Pennell brought associate head coach Anthony Boone with him to UCA. Boone, who coached with Pennell at Grand Canyon, is a Forrest City, Ark., native who played collegiately at Ole Miss.

The Bears open the 2014-15 season with a three-game swing through Nebraska, facing perennial power Creighton, Nebraska-Omaha and the University of Nebraska in a five-day span. Also on the non-conference schedule are in-state rivals Arkansas-Little Rock and Arkansas State, as well as Southeast Missouri, Charleston Southern, Troy, New Mexico, Coastal Carolina and Morehead State.

The Bears open their 18-game Southland Conference slate at Abilene Christian on Jan. 3, closing the regular season with a road trip to Nicholls and McNeese State.

Russ Pennell returned to the University of Central Arkansas in March 2014 as head men's basketball coach, 30 years after playing for the Bears.

Pennell brings not only 25-plus years of coaching experience with him to Conway, but also a passion for the game of basketball and a commitment to the teaching and molding of young men. Pennell looks to bring stability and success to a program that has struggled since moving to NCAA Division I in 2006-07.

Pennell, who led the Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference in assists as a senior at UCA in 1984 with an 8.2 average, coached the Phoenix Mercury in the WNBA in 2013. He was the head men's basketball coach at Grand Canyon University from 2009 to 2013, leading the Antelopes to back-to-back NCAA Tournaments and an overall record of 72-44. The Antelopes were 42-16 from 2011-2013.

Pennell was the interim head coach at Arizona State in 2008-09, replacing Hall of Famer Lute Olsen. He led the Wildcats to 21 victores and a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16. That season, Arizona had victories over No. 4 Gonzaga, No. 6 UCLA, No. 23 Washington, No. 25 Utah and perennial powerhouse Kansas.

Prior to his stint at Arizona, Pennell founded the Arizona Premier Basketball Academy, a skill-developing academy for boys and girls ages 8-18. From 1998 to 2004, Pennell was an assistant coach at Arizona State under Rob Evans, helping the Sun Devils to four postseason appearances.

Pennell was also an assistant coach on Evan's staff at Ole Miss from 1992-98, helping the Rebels win consecutive SEC West titles and reach a national ranking as high as No. 10. Prior to Ole Miss, Pennell was an assistant to legendary coach Eddie Sutton at Oklahoma State from 1990-92. The Cowboys reached back-to-back Sweet 16s and reached No. 2 in the national polls.

Pennell transferred to UCA after two seasons at the University of Arkansas. Pennell holds the career assist record at UCA with 341 and is second in season assists with 220 in 1983-84. His career assist average is 5.9 per game and also a school record. Pennell was a 77.2 percent free-throw shooter and a 52.6 percent field-goal shooter during his UCA career.

ABOUT THE HUSKIES



Houston Baptist will celebrate its 50th season of basket-ball in 2014-15, as head coach Ron Cottrell enters his 24th season at the school, the eighth-longest tenure in NCAA Division I basketball. The Huskies return nine letterwinners from last season, including four starters in senior guard Marcel Smith, senior center Ricmonds Vilde, junior guard/forward Caleb Crayton, and sophomore forward Colter Lasher. Senior guard Tyler Russell primarily came off the bench last season after starting for much of his career, and while the Huskies do not return any double-figure scorers, he and Lasher have shown high-volume scoring ability.

Russell is the team's leading returning scorer at 8.3 points per game, after returning from a season-ending knee injury midway through his sophomore season. He averaged 11.6 points per game as a freshman and 11.4 points in 2012-13 prior to his injury. Lasher averaged 5.7 points per game in his first season at HBU, but scored in double figures in 10 of the Huskies' last 13 games. Both have the ability to score from just about anywhere on the floor, as Lasher shot 41 percent and Russell shot 35 percent from behind the arc.

Senior guard Marcel Smith has led HBU in assists in each of his first three seasons, currently ranks as the Huskies' all-time leader in free throw percentage, and is among the school's all-time leaders in three-point field goal percentage. Vilde and Crayton expect to be 100 percent after battling through injuries last season. Vilde led the team in double-doubles, was the team's top rebounder on 10 occasions, and led the Huskies in blocked shots. Crayton started in 28 of 29 games, and averaged 7.1 points and 4.1 rebounds per game. He scored in double figures seven times and posted a 20-point performance at Central Arkansas.

Sophomore guard Reveal Chukwujekwu and sophomore forwards Cody Stetler and Alex Fountain should see increased roles, with each appearing in 24 games as freshmen. Junior guard Mike Turner earned more time on

the floor last season by hitting 50 percent from long distance. Chukwujekwu, Fountain, and Turner each recorded a double-digit scoring effort against a Southland opponent.

Two years removed from having only one Houston-area product on its roster, HBU has restocked with local talent. The Huskies now have five players from Texas, including four from the Houston area.

The Huskies have put together a solid recruiting class with transfers Jourdan Stickler (Annapolis, Md.) and Anthony Odunsi (Sugar Land, Texas), as well as incoming freshmen Josh Ibarra (Angleton, Texas), Trey Patterson (Plano, Texas), Terry Harris (Dix Hills, N.Y.), and Stephen O'Suji (Houston, Texas). Stickler gives HBU another shooter, hitting nearly 40 percent from 3-point range at Blinn last season, while Ibarra adds another formidable post presence along with Vilde and Stetler. Patterson and Odunsi are long, athletic combo guards who have great defensive instincts. Patterson was a member of the one of the top AAU programs in the country and accepted the challenge of defending each opponent's top scoring guard. Harris provides the Huskies with much depth at the wing position and is the younger brother of Orlando Magic forward Tobias Harris.

While HBU's first season in the Southland did not go as planned in 2014, the Huskies were more competitive in the league than their record would suggest. HBU lost seven games that were decided by six points or fewer or in overtime, including four two-point games.

HBU opens the season at Northwestern Nov. 14, and also has non-conference road games at UT Arlington, San Francisco, UC-Riverside, and cross-town rivals Rice and Houston. In Southland Conference play, the Huskies open at home against Northwestern State, before three-straight road games in Louisiana. HBU returns home for three in a row and finishes the season with 14-straight games within the state of Texas.

He led the Huskies back to the NCAA Division I ranks after 16 seasons building a perennial power at the NAIA Division I level and led them into their first season in the Southland Conference in 2014. In addition to his coaching duties, Cottrell assumed the role of associate director of athletics in 2009, after spending 15 years as director of athletics at HBU. He was one of the driving forces, working closely with HBU President Robert B. Sloan, in the Huskies' transition back to the NCAA.

While HBU's first season in the Southland did not go as planned in 2014, the Huskies were more competitive in the league than their record would suggest. HBU lost seven games that were decided by six points or fewer or in overtime, including four two-point games. The 2012-13 season was Cottrell's most successful campaign as a Division I head coach, leading the Huskies to a 14-17 record and an appearance in the Great West Conference championship game to close out HBU's affliation with the league. Cottrell solidified his place as HBU's all-time winningest basketball coach in 2011-12 as HBU defeated Campbell, 87-76, on Dec. 14, 2011, for the head coach's 400th career victory.

During the NAIA years, the Huskies won nine consecutive Red River Athletic Conference championships and competed in the NAIA national tournament 10 straight years. He built the basketball program into one of national prominence, perennially ranked in the NAIA Top 25, and finishing the season as one of the NAIA's top 10 teams six times.

Cottrell is known for his up-tempo offense and pressure defense, a philosophy he learned from his mentor, former Arkansas coach Nolan Richardson. As an assistant to Richardson at Arkansas, Cottrell helped coach the Razorbacks to two Southwest Conference championships and three trips to the NCAA tournament, culminating in the Hogs appearance at the 1990 NCAA Final Four where they lost to Duke in the semifinals. During Cottrell's tenure on the bench at Arkansas, the Razorbacks posted a record of 88-36.

Cottrell was one of six members of the 2012 HBU Sports Hall of Honor class, recognizing his many contributions to the University as both a coach and administrator. He is married to the former Jacque George, and they have two daughters, Scottlyn Rose, a sophomore manager for the women's basketball program at HBU, and Sydney-Anne.

ABOUT THE CARDINALS



The UIW Cardinals head into the 2014-15 season with a lot of excitement percolating throughout the school and the program after a 21-6 campaign in their initial foray into Division I and the Southland Conference. Eighth-year head coach Ken Burmeister noted that the home court atmosphere created by all of the conference schools make it an exciting league.

The Cardinals lost two starters from a year ago, but return two of the top six scorers in the league in senior Denzel Livingston and junior Kyle Hittle. Livingston earned second team all-conference and all-defensive team honors last year and Burmeister expects both players to lead the team and have great seasons. Livingston averaged 20.3 points, 6.4 rebounds, 3.8 assists, 2.5 steals and 1.4 blocks per game while Hittle chipped in with 16.3 points and 5.7 rebounds per game. Both players knocked down over 50 three-pointers. Livingston has already been getting some national publicity in the offseason with an article from Bleacher Report entitled The Most Exciting Basketball Players from Schools You've Never Heard Of.

Sophomore Sam Burmeister and junior Mitchell Badillo are two other returnees that will be counted upon and Burmeister is confident in their abilities. After that, the Cardinals will be looking to youth for some major contributions. However, a strong recruiting class has the coach cautiously optimistic about his team's chances for the season. "I know we will shoot the ball well," Burmeister said, "but rebounding will be the key to the season."

The two freshmen that Burmeister is most optimistic about for the season are Jontrell Walker and Traylin Farris. Walker is a 6-0 point guard from a storied Aurora West

High School program in the Chicago area while Farris is a 6-8 forward from Pearland, Texas who spent the past year at Brewster Acaemy, a top prep school in Wolfeboro, New Hampshire. Walker will likely share time with Badillo at the point while Farris will be crucial to the team's rebounding and inside game.

The Cardinals were one of the top offensive teams in the nation last year finishing eighth in Division I in scoring (82.1 points per game), 14th in field goal percentage, 15th in assists per game and 28th in three-point percentage. Burmeister's teams will always try to set a style of play where the opposition has to adapt and not the other way around. "We run as hard as we can to get an open shot and then run pro sets," Burmeister said. "It helps our players get prepared to play professionally in the future."

The Cardinals have a challenging schedule ahead of them with eight teams on the marker who played in a post season tournament in 2013-14, including a trio of NCAA Tournament teams in Nebraska, Stephen F. Austin and Tulsa. Early season opponents Princeton and UTEP combined for 44 wins and each made the CBI Tournament with the Tigers going all the way to the semifinals. Grand Canyon, Sam Houston State and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi each made the CIT Tournament. "Nebraska will be the toughest non-conference game we play this year in their new arena," Burmeister said. "We want to play a Big Ten school each year for the added exposure to our program."

Despite not being eligible for the NCAA Tournament until the 2017-18 season, the Cardinals have hopes of going to the CIT Tournament this year which was one of the reasons for the added difficulty of the schedule.



Head Coach Ken Burmeister enters his eighth season at the helm of Incarnate Word with a proven track record. He has posted eight straight winning seasons with the Cardinals including two conference titles and a pair of appearances in the NCAA Division II South Central Region Tournament. He has accumulated a 276-200 (.580) record in 17 seasons as a head coach and his record with the Cardinals is 148-76 (.661).

Burmeister did an exceptional job of leading the Cardinals in their first year as a member of Division I and the Southland Conference in 2013-14. The team blitzed through its nonconference schedule with just one loss and then went 9-5 in conference play. They were nearly perfect at home going 14-1 with the only loss coming on a last second shot.

Prior to joining the Southland Conference, Burmeister led UIW in their move from the Heartland Conference to the Lone Star Conference. In his three seasons in the Lone Star, he guided UIW to a pair of conference tournament appearances, including a semifinal appearance in 2012-13.

Burmeister led the Cardinals to back-to-back Heartland Conference titles in 2008-09 and 2009-10. Those Cardinal squads had a total of six all-conference players.

In 2007-08, Burmeister took the Cardinals to the Heartland Conference Tournament.

Burmeister took over a program in 2006-07 that was coming off a pair of losing seasons, the first since 1989-90. He led the team to an 18-11 record.

It truly was a starting over moment when Burmeister accepted the head men's basketball coaching position at Incarnate Word. It was a time of renewal for Burmeister who had not coached in seven years. And, it had to be a time of regeneration for the Cardinals who had not won a single conference game the year before and finished last in the league standings.

Burmeister revels in coaching basketball and that is something he had not been able to do for a while. However, he never quit talking the game, he never lost his myriad of hoops contacts, and he not once ceased attending games, seminars and clincs. This is his passion.

Burmeister has been a head coach at four schools. His first was at the University of Texas-San Antonio where his four-year mark was 72-44 and included one trip to the NCAA Division I Tournament.

His second job was at Loyola of Chicago. He improved the team's record each season he was there. After that, he coached one year as the interim head coach at Trinity University in San Antonio leading them to a 16-9 record.

Hittle had a break-out season for the Cardinals finishing as one of the top six scorers in the Southland Conference with 16.3 points per game ... the shooting guard had a 32-point barrage against McMurry where he was a stunning 9-for-9 from three-point range ... he scored in double figures in all but two games of the season and led the team with 59 3-pointers ... early in the season he went for 23 points on 8-of-12 shooting from the field in a win over local rival Trinity ... he had 21 points, 11 rebounds and four assists in a win at Huston-Tillotson ... his second double-double of the season came in a win at Southwestern ... in conference play, his high for points was 23 on the road at Northwestern State ... he shot 53.1 percent from the field and averaged 5.7 rebounds per game for the year.

ABOUT THE CARDINALS



Entering his first full campaign with Lamar basketball, head coach Tic Price enters the 2014-15 season looking to rebuild a historically dominant program. Since winning the 2012 Southland Conference Tournament title and advancing to the NCAA Championships, Lamar has won a total of seven games in the two years since.

The process of rebuilding began during the offseason as Price, and his staff, brought in seven new players, including five junior college transfers, to join Lamar's seven returning letterwinners from last season.

In addition to the new signees, Lamar will also have the services of 6-6 forward Tyran de Lattibeaudiere who sat out last season.

Price will look to seniors Donovan Ross and Anthony Holliday to provide the leadership for his squad. Ross is the team's top returning scorer and rebounder averaging nearly 11 points and better than five rebounds per game last season. Holliday averaged better than six points per game, but he was slowed by an injury at the start of the season. He got stronger as the year wore on averaging nearly nine points per game in the final 19 games, including two 18-point outings in the final five games.

Sophomore Preston Mattingly should also provide the Cardinals with added depth heading into his second season in the red and white. Mattingly played in 19 games during his rookie season, but earned a spot in the starting lineup when Price was named interim head coach late in the season.

The Cardinals addressed a huge need during the offseason adding size in the post. Last year, Lamar only had one player taller than 6-6 on its roster, and the Cards finished last in the Southland in rebounding. This season, Lamar has seven players who are 6-5, or taller, including two players listed at 6-10. The added muscle in the low post should provide Lamar with more of a presence on the glass, as well as the potential for some easy looks under the basket.

In addition to the seven newcomers the coaching staff added during the offseason, Lamar will also benefit from the addition of de Lattibeaudiere.

A native of Jamaica, de Lattibeaudiere came to Beaumont after two successful seasons at junior college power Vincennes University where he was one of the nation's top shot blockers (5.0 blocks per game).

The additions of Zjori Bosha, Benquan Petty and Dontavious Sears will add offensive punch to a lineup that finished last in the conference averaging 66.7 points per game. Bosha (Sour Lake, Texas) averaged better than 28 points per game during his senior season at Hardin-Jefferson High School, while Petty is an NJCAA All-American who scored 27 points per game last season at Cedar Valley College. Sears shot 50 percent from the field, including a 40-percent clip from beyond the arc for Eastern Oklahoma on his way to averaging 17 points per game.

Coach Price has continued Lamar's tradition of putting together a tough non-conference schedule. The Cardinals tip off the season Friday, Nov. 14 at SMU - which will be one of seven road dates in the first eight games for Lamar. That stretch will consist of games at Texas State, Indiana, Arkansas State and Iowa State. The 2014-15 schedule is also highlighted by a home date against Rice (Dec. 22).

The Cardinals open Southland Conference play, and the New Year, Jan. 3rd at home against Nicholls. The 2014-15 season will see a return of a home-and-home series with rival McNeese State.

Tic Price was named interim head coach of the Lamar men's basketball team Feb. 16, 2014. Ten days after the conclusion of the 2013-14 season the interim tag was removed from his title and Price became the full time head coach of the Cardinals. A former NCAA Division I head coach with 32 years coaching experience, including three as an assistant at Lamar, Price becomes the 11th head coach of a Lamar program that has won only seven games in the past two seasons. Among his 32 seasons working at the collegiate level, Price has helped coach 12 different squads to the NCAA or NIT as either an assistant or head coach.

His head coaching career began in 1994 at the University of New Orleans, and includes stints at Memphis and McNeese State. During his time at UNO, the Privateers won 20 games each season, and advanced to the 1996 NCAA Championships and the 1997 NIT.

Price set the Sun Belt Conference career record for winning percentage in conference games, while his teams set new league records for three-pointers in consecutive seasons. UNO's teams were also known for their strong defense, leading the SBC in field goal percent defense all three seasons.

Following his time in New Orleans, Price was hired as the head coach at Memphis where he spent two seasons as the Tigers head coach. Price posted a 30-27 (.526) record at Memphis, leading the team to the second round of the 1998 NIT.

Price has a full understanding of the Southland, after spending six seasons, including five as head coach, at McNeese State. He was named associate head coach prior to the 2000-01 season where he helped the Cowboys produce the nation's largest turnaround going 22-9 (.710), winning a conference title and advancing to the NIT. The following season, Price was named head coach where he led the Cowboys to a 20-win season, an SLC regular-season title and a berth in the 2002 NCAA Championships. The Cowboys won 74 games during Price's five seasons in Lake Charles, La.

During his time as head coach, Price has won 10 different coaching honors including Southland Conference Coach of the Year, Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year, Louisiana Sports Writers Association Collegiate Coach of the Year and NABC District 8 Coach of the Year.

Price's coaching career began in 1980 as an assistant at Roanoke College. Following his four seasons at Roanoke, Price took an assistant position at Tennessee-Chattanooga before taking a similar position at Virginia Tech. Price has also made coaching stops at Old Dominion and Auburn.

ABOUT THE COWBOYS



The past few seasons have been building up to this one for the McNeese State Cowboys.

That's because the Cowboys will field their most experienced squad since winning the 2010-11 Southland Conference regular season championship and following that up with a conference tournament championship game berth in 2011-12 behind the likes of standout athletes such as Patrick Richard, Diego Kapelan, P.J. Alawoya, and others.

Interestingly enough, freshmen on that '11-'12 squad that placed second in the SLC East Division, just one game out of the title, included this year's seniors in Kevin Hardy, Craig McFerrin and Desharick Guidry.

That trio will be the main force in the Cowboys looking to win their first conference title since that 2010-11 season.

Both Hardy and Guidry are Lake Charles natives and have established themselves in several school all-time career charts.

Hardy, who has started in 61 consecutive games, will enter the season ranked 10th on the school's all-time assist list with 304 dishes and is sixth on the steals chart with 156. He's also scored 749 points in his career and needs just 251 points and 44 steals to become the only player in school history to score 1,000 points, dish out 300 assists, and 200 steals in a career.

Hardy played just about the entire season out of position last year when he was delegated to the point guard spot. He's most effective at the three-guard position where he can use his athleticism and jumping ability to out-duel his defenders. He's expected to move back to that spot this season as a couple of young players — Marcus Mathieu and Jamaya Burr, assume the role as the point guards.

Guidry became the first McNeese Cowboy to lead the league in rebounding last season since 1991 after he averaged 8.0 boards per contest. He'll enter his final season with the Cowboys with 586 career boards (16th on the career list) and with 817 points scored. He needs just 183 points and 114 rebounds to become just the eighth

player in school history to join the 1,000 pt/700 reb club, joining an elite group that includes Edmond Lawrence, David Lawrence, Henry Ray, Jermone Batiste, Anthony Pullard, Fred Gentry, and George Murphy.

McFerrin will be called upon to provide an advantage both on the boards and blocking shots.

The Baton Rouge native led the team with 30 swats last season to go along with 201 rebounds as well as 286 points scored. He sank 49 percent of his shots as well.

The Cowboys will also get some help from senior Keelan Garrett and junior Shaun Johnson at the two-guard position. Both players are capable of lighting it up from long range. Garrett is the top returning three-point shooter on the squad after he made 36 last year and sank 33 percent while Johnson hit 31 percent after he connected on 25 of 80 from long range.

Junior center Austin Lewis will be looking to return to form after his sophmore campaign wasn't as dominate as his freshman year. As a freshman, the Houston native ranked fourth in the league with 38 blocked shots. That came down a bit last year with 25 swats but he's had a great offseason and is looking to be a force in the paint for the Cowboys this season.

Freshman forward Stephen Ugochukwu (u-go-chew-koo) really caught the eyes of the coaching staff in the offseason and has them comparing the Lewisville, Texas native to players like Patrick Richard and P.J. Alowoya with his talent and work ethic.

Last season the Cowboys played one home game prior to the conference slate. That has changed quite a bit this season as they've chalked in seven non-conference contests, including home games against Louisiana-Lafayette (Dec. 6), Toledo (Dec. 20), and Central Michigan (Dec. 22).

McNeese will open the conference schedule with backto-back home games against defending league champion Stephen F. Austin (Jan. 3) and Houston Baptist (Jan. 5).

Throughout his eight seasons as the head coach of the Mc-Neese State Cowboys, Dave Simmons has etched his name not only in the McNeese record book but also the Southland Conference history guide.

In 2012-13, Simmons coached the Cowboys to a Southland Conference first when his team defeated Sam Houston State 59-58 in overtime on Feb. 7. That win marked the 300th conference win for the Cowboys – the first league team in history to reach the milestone.

Also that season, Simmons became just the fourth head coach in school history to reach the 100-win milestone at Mc-Neese after a 91-88, double-overtime victory at Nicholls in the regular-season finale on March 9.

And three years ago, Simmons did something for McNeese State that no other head coach in school history has ever done – take his teams to national postseason tournaments in backto-back years (2011 National Invitational Tournament and the 2012 CollegeBasketballInsider.com tourney).


That kind of production led to the Louisiana Association of Basketball Coaches to award Simmons the Tommy Joe Eagles Memorial Award as the state's major college coach of the year two years straight in 2011 and 2012.

In the 2010-11 season, Simmons guided the Cowboys to their first Southland Conference regular-season championship since the 2001-02 season, and led the team into the National Invitational Tournament where it hosted Boston College, and that season, he led the Pokes to their second straight conference tournament title game appearance and later took part in the CollegeInsider.com tournament. McNeese did make back-to-back postseason appearances in 2000-01 (NIT) and 2001-02 (NCAA) but that was under two different head coaches .

The 20-win season Simmons' Cowboys produce in 2010-11 was also the first for the school in nine years and the 15-2 home record was one of the very best. McNeese knocked on the 20-win door once again last year where the 17-win season saw four games where the Cowboys came up short by four points or less.

He earned the league's coach of the year honor as well as that for the state of Louisiana in 2011 and was also named the district coach of the year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

He's now 112-136 in eight seasons with the Cowboys and is 139-165 in 10 seasons overall.

Hardy started all 31 games for the Cowboys and led the league in minutes played (35.5) and was third in steals (2.0), fifth in assists (4.3), 10th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.7), 11th in rebounding (6.7) and 18th in blocked shots (0.9) ... he finished the season ranked second on the squad with 11.0 points per game and netted 10 or more points 16 times on the season ... he scored 20 or more two times and recorded five double-doubles, which ranked tied for the fifth-most in the league ... Hardy earned league all-academic honors for the second straight year ... he was named to the SLC All-Defensive team for the second consecutive season along with being named honorable mention all-SLC ... he ended the season having climbed the school's all-time career records list in both steals (6th all-time with 156) and assists (tied for 17th all-time with 205).





ABOUT THE PRIVATEERS



The New Orleans Privateers men's basketball team heads into the 2014-15 season after a competitive first year in the Southland Conference that saw the squad go 8-10 in league play, but were not postseason eligible. This year, New Orleans is eligible for postseason and will boast a mix of young returning players along with a promising incoming recruiting class.

Coach Mark Slessinger enters his fourth season with the program after recording a 36-48 record in his first three seasons on the Lakefront. Slessinger scheduled tough for the Privateers whose banner moment was a road win against UTEP. The Privateers had the toughest non-conference schedule in the nation, which also included games against Michigan State, Minnesota, LSU, and Boise State.

Kevin Hill is looking to pick up where he left off at the end of his sophomore year. Hill closed the year with four consecutive double-doubles while averaging 16.3 points and 12.5 rebounds per game in that stretch. On the season, Hill averaged 7.9 points and 6.9 rebounds. Hill was second on the team in blocks with 25, and had seven for a careerhigh in a late January win at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

Accompanying Hill in the post will be Terrance Syon who is entering his senior year. Syon played in all 26 contests for the Privateers, averaging 4.0 points and 4.3 rebounds per game. In a road win at Central Arkansas in February, Syon landed just shy of his first career double-double as a Privateer, recording nine points and nine rebounds.

Both players who saw time at the point guard position return for their sophomore seasons. Christavious Gill had a hot start in Southland play by recording double figure scoring efforts in eight of the first nine league contests. The only game Gill did not record double digits in scoring was in a home game against Incarnate Word where he only played seven minutes before exiting due to injury. In addition to his strong start, Gill shot 34.2 percent from three-point range in his freshman season.

Nate Frye spelled Gill at the point and played in 25 games while averaging 10.6 minutes. Frye's highest scoring output was a 13-point effort at home against Incarnate Word. Frye shot 40.3 percent from the field and was 11-for-22 from three-point range.

Leading the Privateer newcomers is fifth-year senior, Kevin Brown who comes over from the 2013-14 Sun Belt champion Louisiana-Lafayette Ragin' Cajuns. Brown averaged 5.5 points per game for the Cajuns. His cousin is former Privateer basketball star, Ervin Johnson who is the only player in program history to have his number retired.

Several incoming freshmen look to have an early impact for the squad. Colton Weisbrod was the Class 4A Player of the Year in Texas while at Nederland High School. Travin Thibodeaux averaged 17 points, 15 rebounds, and 3.9 blocks per game in his senior year at Brusly High School. Bryce Jackson was a two-time All-District selection in his final two years of high school. Michael Zeno was named his district's offensive MVP as a senior while averaging nearly a double-double (14.1 points, 9.9 rebounds).

The Privateers schedule features a few long trips including one against a historic program. New Orleans will travel to Indiana to take on the Hoosiers three days before Christmas. The Privateers also will have road tussles Texas A&M, TCU, San Diego, Southern Illinois, and Denver. In New Orleans' three home non-conference bouts, they will face non-Division I opponents in Pensacola Christian, Crowley's Ridge, and Central Baptist.

New Orleans will open Southland play at home against Lamar on Jan. 5. The Privateers will then take on Sam Houston State at the Lakefront before heading on the road for three straight games against Incarnate Word, Houston Baptist, and defending league champion Stephen F. Austin.

RECORD AT SCHOOL 36-48 (THREE SEASONS)

The 2014-15 season will be the fourth at the helm of the New Orleans Privateers men's basketball program for Mark Slessinger. He is the 12th leader chosen in the Privateers rich basketball history.

"Coach Sless" as he is affectionately known on the Lakefront hit the ground running in his first season. In his first season at New Orleans, Slessinger had less than two months to re-recruit student-athletes from the previous season in addition to eight newcomers from the state of Louisiana.

Forcing turnovers and pushing the pace, every member of the Privateers roster is always involved in the game on both ends of the floor. For example, a school-record 13 players topped double-figures at least once in the 2011-12 campaign as the team posted a 17-15 mark against a schedule of full-scholarship teams in his first season. The same held true in the 2013-14 season where the Privateers recorded double digit wins and produced All-Southland Conference selection Cory Dixon.

The effort put forth by the team in 2012-13, while playing a full Division I schedule, was equally as impressive. Ten different players topped double-figures at least once on the season, in large part to the fast-paced offense and the school history altering performance by guard Rarlensee Nelson. Nelson finished the campaign ranking second in school history in single-season assists, and in games with 10 or more assists in a season.

Slessinger prepared for his first NCAA head coaching job by working for 11 years under Northwestern State's Mike Mc-Conathy. Slessinger was the top assistant for McConathy while also serving as the Demon's recruiting coordinator.

During Slessinger's tenure at NSU, the Demons won three Southland Conference titles and compiled signature victories over Oklahoma State, Mississippi State, Oregon State and a 2006 NCAA Tournament first round victory over lowa.

Slessinger graduated from Aurora University with a Bachelor of Arts in Physical Education. He then coached at his alma mater as an assistant basketball coach during the 1995-96 season before moving on to Central Michigan, where he served as an assistant during the 1996-97 campaign.

Following his run at CMU, Slessinger spent three years at Northland Pioneer College (Ariz.), the last two as head coach. His teams posted a 36-25 record with eight players signing on at the Division I level before he departed to join McConathy's staff at Northwestern.

ABOUT THE COLONELS



The Nicholls State University men's basketball team, under head coach J.P. Piper, opens the season with three of its five returning starters from a team that made it to a record sixth-straight Southland Conference Tournament in 2013-14

Becoming just the fourth head coach in team history to have tenure last at least nine seasons, Piper led the Colonels to another conference tournament berth under his watch. With a group of talented scorers and influx of youth, Piper led Nicholls to the fifth seed in the conference tournament and defeated Southeastern in its tournament opener.

Dantrell Thomas and Jeremy Smith were the two top scorers for the Colonels last season, both finishing in the top 20 scorers in the Southland. With the loss of Dantrell Thomas and Smith to graduation, the Colonels will be looking to a string of underclassmen and eight newcomers this year to fill the void on the offensive end of the court.

Injuries were a major issue for Nicholls with the loss of sophomore center Lachlan Prest before the season started, while senior Pedro Maciel, sophomore forward Sam McBeath and sophomore forward Liam Thomas dealt with injuries all year.

Maciel's injuries didn't allow him to make the trip to conference tournament, while McBeath broke his foot for a fourth time in the first-round win over Southeastern Louisiana. Liam Thomas was sidelined for much of the conference schedule.

But, the injuries allowed for unexpected contributions from several underclassmen, which should make the team better going forward. Nicholls had an extremely young group last season with just four upperclassmen on its 17-man roster. The 2014-15 Colonels squad brings a wealth of experience with nine upperclassmen, led by junior T.J. Carpenter and senior Shane Rillieux.

Carpenter took a huge step forward for Nicholls last season, starting at guard for the Colonels against Troy University and the University of Texas at San Antonio before securing the starting role for good in week 10 against the University of New Orleans. Carpenter started the remaining 19 games while averaging 9.3 points and 1.2 assists per game. He finished the season with 17 steals and a team-high 58 3-pointers.

Shane Rillieux started 27 of 29 games for Nicholls last season, while playing a team-high 30 minutes per game and has only missed three contests in his entire Colonel career. Rillieux averaged six points and 2.6 assists per game, while shooting 40 percent from the field.

Nicholls will look to get the rest of its scoring punch from its group of freshmen and sophomores, while relying on Rillieux and Liam Thomas for defensive leadership. Thomas finished 10th in the Southland Conference in blocked shots, averaging 1.3 per game. He was also third on the club in field goal percentage, averaging 3.3 points and 3.2 rebounds in his first year. In the postseason, Thomas came up big, registering five points, 12 rebounds and three blocked shots in the team's Southland tournament win over Southeastern Louisiana.

The Colonels have a slew of newcomers including freshmen Quinton Thomas, Zach Young and Chad Simpson. Sophomores Richie Lewis and Luka Kamber also join the squad, along with juniors Denzel Flemings and Adam Ward.

Thomas, a 6-foot-2 combo-guard from Baton Rouge, was named first-team 2A All-State last season after averaging 22.4 points, 10.5 rebounds and 2.8 assists for the Tigers. Along with all-state accolades, Thomas garnered all-metro honors and was named District 6-2A MVP, leading his squad to a district championship. As a junior, Thomas earned first-team all-district.

Simpson will play forward for the Colonels, and becomes the seventh Australian player to join the Nicholls basketball team for the upcoming season. The 6-foot-7 Mandurah, Australia native averaged 23.7 points, 7 rebounds and 4 assists for John Tonkin College. Simpson shot 49 percent from the field and 85 percent from the free-throw line over his senior season.

Kamber, a 6-for-7 forward, comes to Thibodaux after playing last season with Louisiana-Lafayette. The Berlin native maintains Croatian citizenship, and was a member of the Croatian U18 National team, averaging 13 points, 8 rebounds, 3 assists and 1.5 steals in 28 minutes a game, while shooting .500 from the field, .460 from the three-point line and .780 from the free-throw line.

The schedule sets up to be another daunting task for the team as the group will square off with the likes of North Texas, UCLA, Wake Forest, Michigan and Louisiana Tech in the non-conference portion before jumping into an expanded Southland Conference lineup in January. The Colonels will have 13 home games, including hosting Loyola, Arkansas-Monticello, Troy and Spring Hill, along with nine home conference matchups.

J.P. Piper enters his 11th season at the helm of the Colonel basketball program, having amassed a 111-182 overall record through 10 seasons.

Becoming just the fourth head coach in team history to have tenure last at least nine seasons, Piper led the Colonels to a record fifth consecutive conference tournament berth during the 2012-13 season. With a mix of upperclassmen leadership and influx of youth, Piper led the Colonels to the fifth seed in the tournament – the highest placing for the squad since the 2008 season. Under his watch, Fred Hunter was selected as a first team All-Southland guard, as well as first team All-LSWA, USBWA All-District and second team NABC All-District.

With the second youngest team in the country in the 2011-12 season, Piper helmed a squad that only had one win through the first half of Southland play, before rallying the team to win five of their last eight games to make an appearance in the conference tournament for the fourth straight year. It's the third time in program history that Nicholls has made the postseason tournament in four straight years, and with his fifth-straight double-digit winning season, ties coach Ricky Broussard for the second-longest streak in coaching history.

In 2010-11, Piper guided the Colonels to their fourth straight double-digit win season and third straight appearance in the Southland Conference Tournament. It's the third time in Colonel history that the team has made at least three consecutive appearances in the tournament since joining the league in basketball.

In 2009-10, Piper led the Colonels to their third consecutive double-digit win season and their second consecutive Southland Conference Tournament appearance. The Colonels' 2010 Southland Conference Tournament berth marked the first time that the Colonels have qualified for consecutive postseason berths since Nicholls qualified for three straight tournaments from 1998-99 through 2000-01.

Piper engineered one of the strongest regular seasons in school history in 2008-09, leading the Colonels to a 20-11 record and a 12-4 Southland Conference mark. The 2008-09 season marked the second 20-win campaign since Nicholls moved up to Division I in 1980-81, and the first one since 1994-95.

Before being named head coach at Nicholls in 2004, Piper served two seasons as the top assistant for the Colonels (2002-04) under the direction of head coach Ricky Blanton.

Rillieux started 27 of 29 games on the season as a junior, averaging 30.8 minutes per game totaling 832 minutes ... he averaged six points per game, shooting 40.3 percent (56-139) from the field and 21.9 percent (7-for-32) from behind the 3-point line, with a 44.9 percent (44-for-98) mark at the charity stripe ... he finished second on the team in assists with 2.6 a game, with seven games of four or more assists ... he had a season-high 11 assists against Loyola on Dec. 11 ... he had four double-digit scoring games on the season, with a season-high 13 coming against Sam Houston State on Jan. 11 ... Rillieux had back-to-back double-digit scoring games against Sam Houston State and Houston Baptist ... he tied a career-high seven rebounds against McNeese on Feb. 22, averaging 2.6 rebounds per game.





ABOUT THE DEMONS



With one of the best point guards and one of the best shooters in college basketball both back this season at Northwestern State, veteran coach Mike McConathy has a couple of cornerstones in junior Jalan West and sophomore Zeek Woodley to blend with some talented newcomers in 2014-15.

The newcomers will be more significant than normal in the Demons' program for McConathy's 16th season in charge. NSU returns only seven lettermen from the always deep rotation employed by the winningest college coach in Louisiana history, eight wins away from 600 in his 32nd season overall

West, a 5-10 junior, and Woodley, a 6-2 sophomore, are the last two Southland Conference Freshmen of the Year.

West had a spectacular sophomore year. He was the only player in major college basketball to average at least 19 points (19.4), 4 rebounds (4.0), 6 assists (6.4, 8th NCAA) and 2.5 steals (8th NCAA). No NCAA player since Hofstra's Speedy Claxton in 1999-2000 has had that kind of stat line, according to Sports-Reference.com.

He sank 46 percent of his shots, 41 percent on 3-pointers, and 88 percent at the free throw line while earning Mid-Major All-America honors from Collegelnsider.com and College Sports Madness, along with Southland Conference Defensive Player of the Year and first-team All-Southland honors.

Woodley ranked fourth nationally, best among guards, with a 61.7 percent shooting average while averaging 13.9 points and 4.6 rebounds, dropping in 80.2 percent of his free throws and 41.7 percent of his 24 3-point tries. He also blocked 25 shots.

West and Woodley were two of the top three scorers for last year's 17-14 team. Four of the top seven are back this season, along with three of the top four rebounders.

Senior 6-8 center Marvin Frazier surged at the end of last season. He averaged a modest 5.3 points and 4.6 rebounds, along with 2.1 blocks, but in two Southland Conference Tournament games, averaged 14 points and six rebounds. If he can approach that level of production the NSU inside game will not wilt from the departure of second-team All-Southland forward DeQuan Hicks (15.1 points, 7.3 rebounds), one of five 2013-14 seniors.

Senior 6-7 forward Ryan King (3.0 ppg, 2.6 rpg) steadily improved in the second half of his first year in the Demon program, bolstering the interior defense and rebounding. Newcomer Deji Adekunle (6-11) should pad the post rotation as a defender and rebounder.

Newcomers Ta'Jon Welcome and Tony Dobbinson should help compensate for the graduation of guard Brison White, whose 13.1 scoring average was rooted in his ability to fly downcourt in transition. Dobbinson can spell West at point guard.

Sophomore 6-3 guard Sabri Thompson (4.1 ppg) flashed scoring punch and was a solid addition in his rookie year. Another sophomore, swingman Tra'von Joseph (2.5 ppg), helped the Demons defend taller backcourts with his 6-5 frame, along with 6-5 junior guard Matt Killian (0.7 ppg).

More size is added to the perimeter with 6-11 freshman swingman Reggie Kissoonlal and 6-8 senior squadman Matt LeBato, who missed his first NSU season with an ankle injury. True freshman DeVonte Hall, a 6-1 guard, was a two-time All-Stater at West's alma mater, Bossier High School, while another true freshman, 6-4 Peyton Prudhomme, could help from behind the 3-point circle.

The Demons have been second nationally in scoring each of the past two seasons, while also ranking high in NCAA stats in team steals (over 9.0 both years) and blocked shots in McConathy's high-tempo style that typically employs 10-12 players each game.

In Southland Conference basketball history, Mike McConathy has a unique and remarkable place as a player and head coach.

He's regarded as one of the greatest players in league history, scoring 2,033 points (20.7 per game) from 1973-77 at Louisiana Tech, leading the Bulldogs to the 1976 conference crown as the Southland Player of the Year.

He ranks among the greatest coaches too, entering his 16th season at Northwestern State, where his father, his sons, and his uncles all played.

McConathy is poised to post his 600th career collegiate coaching victory and coach his 1,000th college contest this season, his 32nd overall. He is the winningest college coach in Louisiana basketball history. McConathy is 592-386 overall with a 240-227 record at NSU.

His teams have scored road wins over Oklahoma State, Mississippi State, Auburn and Oregon State, and also knocked off No. 15 lowa in a 14 vs. 3 seed upset in the 2006 NCAA Tournament.

He is a master of March Madness. McConathy's Demons have made seven Southland Tournament championship game appearances in their 11 conference tourney trips during his 15 seasons. Only the Demons and Louisiana-Monroe (1990-93) have made four straight championship game appearances in the five decades of Southland basketball competition. NSU is 17-8 in Southland Tournament play, including a tournament title in 2013.

That 2013 title gave NSU its third NCAA Tournament appearance under McConathy, the most by any current Southland member. The Demons won their first games in the 2001 and 2006 NCAA brackets, dumping Winthrop in the inaugural Opening Round game in 200 and overcoming a 17-point deficit in the last 8:32 to stun lowa 64-63 in 2006 at Auburn Hills, Mich., in one of the most memorable games in modern March Madness history.

The Demons are 27-9 in conference regular-season play in the last two years, 43-23 in the last four. McConathy is 163-122 (.572) against Southland foes, including 146-114 in regular-season matchups.

He received the 2012 National Association of Basketball Coaches Guardians of the Game Pillar Award for Education during NCAA Final Four weekend in New Orleans. It is among the most prestigious awards presented by the NABC, representing one of the four core values of the Guardians of the Game program – education, leadership, advocacy and service.





ABOUT THE BEARKATS



With eight lettermen including four starters returning from a 24-11 squad, Sam Houston State looks to contend for the 2015 Southland men's basketball championship.

The list of accomplishments for head coach Jason Hooten's squad last season is extensive.

The 24 wins marked Sam Houston's seventh 20-plus victory season as an NCAA Division I competitor. The total fell one short of tying as SHSU's most victories in a single Division I season.

The Bearkats placed third in the 2014 conference race, Sam Houston's eighth time to finish among the league's top three in the past decade.

In post-season play, Sam Houston defeated Oral Roberts and A&M-Corpus Christi to reach to Southland tournament final for the fourth time.

The Bearkats capped the outstanding year by earning a post-season berth in the 2014 Collegelnsider.com Tournament. The SHSU men defeated Alabama State in the first round of the CIT to post their first NCAA post-season tournament win

The 2014 Bearkats showed ability to win in the clutch, going 8-0 in games decided by five or less points.

With a 283-168 record and two NCAA appearances (2003 & 2010), Sam Houston ranks behind only Texas in total victories by Division I teams in the state since 2000. The Bearkats' past Southland Conference championships have come in 2000, 2003 and 2010. SHSU won Southland post-season titles to advance to the NCAA Regional in both 2003 and 2010.

Seven players who accounted for 52.4 of SHSU's 75.6 points return in 2014-15. Another letterman who started two years, senior guard DeMarcus Gatlin, is back after missing the 2013-14 season with an injury.

Five experienced seniors will provide strong leadership for the 2015 squad.

Jabari Peters (12.6 ppg) and Kaheem Ransom (11.6 ppg) earned both All-Southland third team and Southland All-Tournamenthonors. Peters was the Southland Conference's "Newcomer of the Year." Both came to Sam Houston from Seward County Community College in Kansas.

Peters led the Bearkats in scoring in 12 games and posted double figures in 22 contests last year. The 6-3 guard from Brooklyn, NY, scored 20 or more points five times.

Ransom totaled double figures in 19 games last year. The Wichita, Kansas, product led the team in scoring in nine contests.

Paul Baxter (9.1 ppg) and Michael Holyfield (6.5 ppg., 6.7 rpg) are the other two returning starters.

Baxter, a 6-1 junior guard from Austin/Bowie, ranked among the top 20 in four Southland Conference statistics categories last year. Hitting double figures in 21 games the past two years, Baxter has been the third-leading scorer for SHSU in both 2013 and 2014.

Holyfield, a 6-11 senior from Albuquerque, N.M., was the most improved player on the 2013-14 squad. He averaged 7.1 points and 6.9 rebounds and totaled 61 blocked shots. He looks to be a factor inside for the Bearkats.

Gatlin, a 6-4 guard who started 22 games and averaged 8.1 points per game before a season-ending injury in 2013, looks to further strength the Kats on the perimeter.

Other returning lettermen include 6-3 guard Marquel McKinney, 6-2 guard Dakarai Henderson and 6-8 post player Aurimas Majauskas. Jesse Lopez, a 6-6 forward, red-shirted in 2014.

A quality recruiting class is expected to further strengthen the Bearkats. Three freshmen and two transfers could contribute immediately.

Sean Goodwin, 6-7 power forward from Butler Community College, averaged 10.4 points and 4.5 rebounds for a 22-10 squad to earn All-Kansas JC honors. A true power forward, Goodwin brings toughness and tenacity to the Kat program.

Marcus Burwell, a 6-5 forward from Wallace State, started 31 games last year for a 28-7 team in the Alabama Community College Conference. He averaged 4.7 points and 5.3 rebounds.

Jamal Williams, a 6-4 guard from Episcopal High School, averaged 24.3 points and 8.1 rebounds as a senior. He was on the top 25 list for the Guy V. Lewis Award in Houston.

Albert Almanza, a 6-5 forward from Austin Saint Stephens, averaged 15.2 points and 5.1 rebounds as a senior. He finished ninth in scoring in the Central Texas area and earned team MVP honors.

Josh Delaney, 6-0 point guard from Killeen Harker Heights, scored 11.2 points and averaged 5.9 assists on a 2014 district championship team. He earned all-district, all-region and district MVP honors on a squad that reached the state quarterfinals.

Sam Houston looks to test itself against a challenging non-conference schedule that includes contests with UNLV, Texas A&M, LSU and other top programs before league play begins in January.

Head coach at Sam Houston State University since April 2, 2010, and an assistant for the Bearkats for six seasons, Jason Hooten has been a key contributor in the Bearkats' outstanding men's basketball program that has rolled up a record of 199 victories and only 119 losses the past 10 years.

Since Hooten joined the Bearkat staff in July 2004, SHSU men's basketball has earned Southland Conference tournament berths each year, won three West Division titles and finished among the top three teams in the league standings eight times. Hooten has directed Sam Houston to a 72-60 record in his four seasons as head coach. As an assistant coach, Hooten helped direct SHSU to a 127-59 record, four 20-plus victory seasons plus both Southland regular season and tournament championships and an NCAA tournament appearance in 2010. Last year, the SHSU men made their third Division I post-season tournament appearance, reaching the second round of the CollegeInsider.com Tournament. The Kats' victory over Alabama State in the first round is Sam Houston's first NCAA post-season victory.

In his first season as Bearkat head coach in 2011, Hooten directed the Bearkats to their third consecutive Southland Conference West Division championship and the program's seventh consecutive winning season. The Bearkats' 18 wins represented the most victories by a first-year head coach in the program's NCAA Division I history.

The 25-8 record for Sam Houston in 2009-10 marked the highest victory total for a Bearkat squad in SHSU's 23 seasons at the NCAA Division I level. Sam Houston stands as the "winningest team" in the Southland Conference during the last 12 years.

Only one of the 20 NCAA Division I men's basketball programs in the state (the University of Texas) has won more games since 2000 than Sam Houston.

Hooten joined the SHSU staff July 1, 2004, helping run practice, recruiting, scouting, scheduling and academics. In 2009, RecruitingRumors.com selected Hooten as one of the top 100 NCAA assistant coaches and CollegeInsider.com named him Mid-Major Top 25 assistant coaches honorable mention.

Previously, Hooten served as assistant men's basketball coach at Tarleton State University for Lonn Reisman. During his tenure, the Texans posted a combined 204-111 record.

Hooten also played basketball at Tarleton, helping lead the Texans to a 52-10 mark. He returned to Tarleton in August 1993 after serving as a part-time assistant coach at Weatherford Junior College.

ABOUT THE LIONS



In April, the face of the Southeastern Louisiana basketball program changed as Jay Ladner was named the 12th head coach in program history, fresh off an NJCAA Division I national title at Jones County Junior College.

At the time Ladner said, "I'm ready to hit the ground running. At Southeastern, our goal is to make it the best we can possibly make it in a short period of time. We want to be competitive immediately."

Already behind in recruiting, the coaching staff went right to work and made up for lost time, bringing in several high-profile transfers. A few will have to sit out the 2014-15 season because of NCAA transfer rules, but Southern Miss transfer Cedric Jenkins, a native of LaPlace, Louisiana, will be eligible immediately.

Jenkins teams with returning players Joshua Filmore, Andrew Guillory, JaMichael Hawkins, Onochie Ochie and Devonte Upson to form the core of Ladner's first team.

"I really like our attitude and openness to change," Ladner said. "Our style of play will be different from the previous coaching staff's, and the players have worked really hard.

"We're going to have an up-tempo style of play and then be more man-to-man oriented on the defensive end. We want to apply pressure and disrupt the offensive schemes we play against. Offensively, we'll really try to push the ball. It's going to be a faster pace than what our fans have grown accustomed to seeing, but we won't just run down the floor and shoot it. Our philosophy is to score early in transition or score late. If we can't score early in transition, which we'll try to every possession, we'll take the shots we can make."

Hawkins, the Lions' leading scorer last season (12.3 points per game), is expected to miss considerable time with an injury. Ochie (8.4 ppg), Upson (8.3 ppg) and Filmore (6.9 ppg) are the only other returners with playing time in a Southeastern uniform. Guillory red-shirted last season following an injury.

Operating under a new system, the Lions face a tough opening stretch to the season.

Following a Nov. 6 exhibition game against Loyola (New Orleans) at the University Center, the Lions will play 12 of their next 14 regular-season games on the road.

"The most important thing for us is the conference tournament," Ladner said. "Our win-loss record is probably not going to be the best because we might have the toughest non-conference schedule in Division I, and we'll be on the road most of the time. We're not going to make excuses about it. We're going to embrace the challenges and use them to prepare us for conference play. We can then use conference play to prepare us for the tournament."

Southeastern opens the regular season with a pair of games at Oklahoma State (Nov. 14) and Oklahoma (Nov. 16). Games at Tennessee Tech (Nov. 20) and Western Illinois (Nov. 22) precede the Nov. 26 home opener against Tennessee Tech.

Both games against Tennessee Tech are part of Tulane's Green Wave Classic, an event in which the Lions will also face Alcorn State (Nov. 28) and Tulane (Nov. 29) in New Orleans. Louisiana.

To open December, Southeastern travels to Gonzaga (Dec. 3), a perennial Top 25 contender. Last season, the Bulldogs finished with a 29-7 record, advancing to the third round of the NCAA Tournament. The Lions also travel to Southeast Missouri (Dec. 6) and UTEP (Dec. 16) before returning home to host Winthrop (Dec. 19).

Following a trip to Florida to face Central Florida (Dec. 22) and South Florida (Dec. 23), Southeastern hosts Dillard in an exhibition contest on Dec. 29.

Southeastern opens Southland Conference play at Stephen F. Austin (Jan. 5), but then returns to the University Center for five of its next seven contests.

The Lions will host conference foes Houston Baptist (Jan. 10), Sam Houston State (Jan. 12), Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (Jan. 26), Northwestern State (Jan. 31), McNeese State (Feb. 2), Central Arkansas (Feb. 10), Abilene Christian (Feb. 21), New Orleans (Feb. 23) and Nicholls State (March 7).

Southeastern heads out for road contests at Incarnate Word (Jan. 17), Lamar (Jan. 19), Abilene Christian (Feb. 7), Nicholls (Feb. 14), McNeese (Feb. 16), Central Arkansas (Feb. 28), Northwestern State (March 2) and New Orleans (March 5).

Fresh off a junior college national championship, Jay Ladner was named the 12th head coach in the history of the men's basketball program at Southeastern Louisiana University on April 10, 2014.

"To say that I'm excited would be an understatement," Ladner said. "I'm ready to hit the ground running. At Southeastern, our goal is to make it the best we can possibly make it in a short period of time. We want to be competitive immediately."

Ladner spent the past two seasons as head coach at Jones County Junior College in Ellisville, Miss. The Bobcats were 17-8 in his first season, finishing second in the MACJC's South Division, and this past season Jones County became the first Mississippi junior college to win a national championship.

Eleventh-seeded Jones County, which set a school record for wins after finishing the season 28-5, became the lowest-seeded school to win a NJCAA basketball title in any division and the first school in tournament history to win five games in five days to win the championship.

To grab the NJCAA Division I title, Ladner's squad defeated, in succession, No. 22-seeded Highland College (III.), No. 6-seeded Hill College (Texas), No. 3-seeded Chipola College (Fla.), No. 2-seeded Vincennes College (Ind.) and finally knocked off top-seeded Indian Hills Community College, 87-77, at the Hutchinson Sports Arena on March 22.

Ladner spent the 2011-12 season as head coach at his alma mater, Oak Grove High School, in Hattiesburg, Miss.


Prior to taking the reins at his alma mater, Ladner spent the first 20 seasons of his career as the head coach at St. Stanislaus College in Bay St. Louis, Miss.

He led the Rockachaws to the 2011 MHSAA 4A state championship and a state runner-up finish in 2010. Following the state title, Ladner was named the Mississippi Association of Coaches (MAC) Coach of the Year. During his tenure, the Hattiesburg, Miss., native coached St. Stanislaus to 10 state tournament appearances.

Three times Ladner was named South Mississippi Coach of the Year by the Biloxi Sun-Herald. He served as head coach of the Mississippi squad in the 2010 Alabama/Mississippi All-Star Game, leading his squad to a 114-88 victory.

Ladner compiled a 511-189 high school coaching record.

A member of Southern Miss' 1987 NIT Championship team, Ladner received his bachelor's degree in pre-medicine/biology, with a minor in chemistry, from Southern Miss in 1988. He received his master's degree in educational administration from Southern Miss in 1999.







ABOUT THE LUMBERJACKS



The 2013-14 Stephen F. Austin Lumberjack basketball season will forever be remembered as the Cinderella story of the 2014 NCAA Tournament after knocking off fifth-seed VCU 77-75 for the program's first-ever win in the big dance. Among all the highlights during the team's win streaks, both at home and on the road, that brought national acclaim to first-year head coach Brad Underwood and SFA, it will be Desmond Haymon's four-point play to tie Shaka Smart's havon-run VCU squad and send the game into overtime that will live on as part of the definition of what has become known as March Madness.

The 2014-15 Lumberjacks now enter their second campaign under Underwood, the 2014 Joe B. Hall award recipient, given to the nation's top first-year coach, as the two-time defending Southland Conference champions.

SFA saw the departure of one of the most dominant senior classes to come through Nacogdoches in Haymon (starter), Nikola Gajic (starter) and Deshaunt Walker (sixth-man).

The Lumberjacks returns three of its starters from last season in senior forward Jacob Parker, junior forward Thomas Walkup and junior point guard Trey Pinkney.

Parker averaged 14.2 points and 7.1 rebounds per game as a junior, recording 10 double-doubles. The native of Bixby, Okla., ended the season ranked among the conference leaders in several statistical categories, including fifth in offensive rebounds (2.5), seventh in rebounding (7.1) and free throw percentage (.799), eighth in field goal percentage (.538), 11th in defensive rebounds (4.6), 12th in scoring (14.2) and 14th in steals (1.4).

Parker boasts a plethora of accolades from last season. He was tabbed a Lou Henson All-American, a Lou Henson Award Finalist, the Southland Conference Player of the Year, a first-team All-Southland selection, a NABC District 23 First Team member, USBWA All-District VII honoree and TABC University Men's Player of the Year.

Walkup, the sixth-man for SFA as a redshirt freshman, made a major impact in his transition into the starting lineup. A native of Pasadena, Texas, was an All-Southland third team selection, also garnering Southland All-Defensive Team honors. Walkup led the team and ranked fifth in the conference in field goal percentage (.568), ranking third in the league in conference-only games (.629). Walkup also led the team and ranked 11th the league in average offensive rebounds (2.3) and conference-only scoring average (14.7), finishing third on the team and 18th in the SLC in scoring (460). Walkup recorded four doubledoubles, with two coming in the second and third round of the NCAA Tournament.

Pinkney, who started every game at point guard as a sophomore, averaged 3.5 assists, 3.0 points and 1.9 rebounds per game. A native of Katy, Texas, Pinkney led the team and finished fifth in the Southland in assist-to-turnoverratio (2.0) and 10th in assists (121). Pinkney tallied four assists or more in 12 games, including a career-high nine, which he set against Incarnate Word (2/1) and later tied against Northwestern State (3/14) in the Southland Conference Tournament.

The Lumberjacks also return Connor Brooks (Sr., G/F), Tanner Clayton (Sr., F), Dallas Cameron (So., G), Justin Dotson (So., G) and Jason Martin (So., G).

Underwood welcomes six newcomers from his early signing class in Ty Charles (Fr., G), Demetrious Floyd (Jr., G), Clide Geffrard (Jr., F), Jared Johnson (Jr., G), Jaxon Holden (Fr., G) and Caleb Johnston (Fr., G/F), along with Bobby King, a senior transfer from Florida A&M.

Underwood, the 11th head coach in Stephen F. Austin history, enters his second season at the helm of the Lumberjack men's basketball team. Underwood has the Lumberjacks coming off of one of the most storied seasons in program history, putting SFA on the national map with the upset of fifth-seeded VCU in the second round of the 2014 NCAA Tournament on a four-point play to send the game into overtime, their first NCAA Tournament win.

Under his guidance, the Lumberjacks finished the 2013-14 season 32-3, a program and conference record for most wins in a single season and his first-year success also has him among the NCAA's elite, ranking third all-time in the NCAA's top 10 for best career starts at the Division I level.

Underwood's quick success at SFA garnered him not just the 2013-14 Southland Conference Coach of the Year honor, but also the 2014 Joe B. Hall Award, given to the nation's top first-year coach, along with being named a finalist for the Jim Phelan award (top Division I coach) and Hugh Durham (top mid-major coach). Underwood was also named the 2014 Texas Association of Basketball Coaches (TABC) Coach of the Year and the 2013-14 NABC UPS Division I District 23 Coach of the Year.

Underwood had heads already turning as he led the SFA to a program- and conference-best 29 wins in the regular season and a perfect 18-0 record in league play. The Lumberjacks became the first Southland school in the league's 51-year history to win 29 games in the regular season and first 30-game winner. Along the way, SFA joined top-ranked Florida and second-ranked Wichita State as the only schools to go undefeated in conference play that season. The 2013-14 squad also became just the 18th team all-time to do so at the Division I level in conference schedules of 18 games or more.

The Lumberjacks enter the 2014-15 season tied with Duke for the longest active home winning streak at 33 straight and tied with Wichita State for the longest active road win streak at 12 games.

Underwood came to Nacogdoches after an extensive coaching career that included 27 years in the coaching profession, spending his last two as an associate head coach at both South Carolina and Kansas State with current Gamecock head coach Frank Martin.

Prior to USC, Underwood served on the Kansas State staff for six years, beginning in May 2006 as the director of operations for then-head coach Bob Huggins.

ABOUT THE ISLANDERS



After being the second-most improved squad in all of Division I a season ago, the Texas A&M-Corpus Christi men's basketball team looks to continue its upward trajectory in year four of the Willis Wilson era. The 2014-15 team is coming off its first postseason win in program history, and the 2014 Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award winner has his most experienced team to date at the Island University.

Leading the way for the Islanders will be First Team All-Southland selection John Jordan, now a senior, and his classmate, Hameed Ali, a four-year starter. Along with those two, A&M-Corpus Christi also sees starter Brandon Pye return to the fold after leading the league in three-point shooting, along with Rashawn Thomas, who came off the bench but was second among all Southland freshmen in both scoring and rebounding. Also entering the fold as a key piece is junior Bryce Douvier, who redshirted last season after transferring from Northern Colorado.

Jordan enters the season in range of setting school records in points, assists, steals and free throws, and will look to cap off his Islanders career by helping the team to a conference title. Jordan averaged 14.5 points and 5.4 assists to go along with 4.5 rebounds a season ago in becoming the first player to earn First Team All-Southland recognition since Kevin Palmer in 2009-10.

Along with Jordan, Ali returns as a veteran presence after averaging 8.0 points and 2.4 assists in 2013-14. The senior has started 72 games in an Islanders uniform entering his final campaign. Pye also returns after hitting 50 percent of his three pointers last season, one of the best marks in the nation. The Islanders also return the veteran presence of Jelani Currie and Cole Martinez in the backcourt. Currie showed explosive athleticism in his 25 games and six starts, while Martinez brought hustle and an outside shooting touch in his 32 games. Emmanuel Toney also returns to the squad after playing in two games last year.

Newcomers in the backcourt include freshmen Joe Kilgore, Ehab Amin and David Bloom. Kilgore is more of a

swingman with his 6-foot-4 inch frame, as he averaged 19 points and five rebounds for Spring Dekaney a season ago. Amin missed all of last year, but showed strong ability on the international stage, serving as part of the Egyptian National Team and representing Pan-Africa in the Nike Global Challenge. Bloom is a walk-on from Plano.

Up front, Thomas is the leader of the pack for the Islanders, with Douvier also potentially providing all-conference numbers. Thomas missed the first nine games of the season with an injury, but in the final 25 games he averaged a stellar 10.7 points and 5.2 boards along with 1.3 blocks playing mostly at power forward. Douvier will be hungry to return to the court after being one of the top practice players on the team a year ago while sitting out due to NCAA transfer rules.

Junior Dale Francis also returns for the Islanders after playing 26 games and scoring 19 points for the Islanders. He showed moments of promise throughout the year, including at Minnesota, where he went 3-for-4 from the field and poured in seven points. A pair of newcomers up front will also provide depth for the Islanders. T.J. Traylor joins the squad after averaging 11 points and eight rebounds at Cerritos College in Norwalk, Calif., a year ago. Viktor Juricek will also provide depth, but only on the practice court, as the transfer from South Alabama will have to sit out the year due to NCAA transfer rules.


The Islanders face a challenging schedule for 2014-15, with 15 home games and 15 road games on the slate. Highlights include a November trip to face perennial power Georgetown and the Corpus Christi Coastal Classic, which sees A&M-Corpus Christi travel to St. Louis and Bradley along with playing Mississippi Valley State and either N.C. A&T or Radford at the American Bank Center. Key matchups in conference play include a Valentine's Day clash with reigning champ Stephen F. Austin and the Homecoming game, slated for Feb. 28 against rival Sam Houston State. The Islanders will be looking to return to the 2015 Southland Conference Tournament for their second consecutive postseason trip in Wilson's tenure.

From the first day of Willis Wilson's tenure at the Island University on March 25, 2011, he made it instantly clear what his goal for the program was.

"We want to be the premier program in the Southland Conference and follow down the paths of a Butler, Gonzaga, George Mason or Virginia Commonwealth."

Taking a program with one NCAA Tournament appearance and just 12 years of Division I history into a place alongside the premier names in college basketball is a tall task. The first step is building a culture and foundation for the Islanders.

The program's philosophy for recruiting student-athletes – Character, Toughness, Talent – will be a major step in the building process for the Islanders. These attributes in basketball players that work hard will build Islanders Basketball into a championship program.


During the 2013-14 season, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi took a huge step toward those goals, as the team had the third-largest turnaround in the nation, finishing with 12 more wins than it did the season before. The Islanders rolled to a 14-4 record and a second-place finish in the Southland, and earned a berth in the College Insider Tournament. With a win over Northern Colorado in the CIT, the Islanders posted the program's first victory in a postseason tournament since its inception in 1999. Individual accolades came with the team success, most notably for Wilson, who was the recipient of the Ben Jobe Coach of the Year Award, presented annually to the top minority coach in Division I.

Players were also in on the recognition, most notably junior John Jordan, who picked up First Team All-Southland honors and Second Team All-Region 23 recognition.

Before coming to the Island University, Wilson served two seasons as an assistant to Josh Pastner at the University of Memphis. In two years, he saw the Tigers go 49-19 and advance to the postseason both years.

Wilson became one of the most respected coaches in the country in his time as the head coach at his alma mater, Rice. In 16 years leading the Owls, Wilson posted a career record of 219-246, leading the team to the postseason three times in his tenure. He is the school's all-time winningest coach.

Prior to taking over the reins of the Rice program, Wilson spent the 1991-92 campaign as an assistant on Mike Montgomery's staff at Stanford. Wilson began his collegiate coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater in 1985-86. After a one-year stint as a head coach at Houston's Strake Jesuit Prep, Wilson returned to Rice as an assistant from 1987-91.




JOHN JORDAN

Jordan had one of the best all-around seasons in program history, earning First-Team All-Southland honors and Second-Team All-District 23 recognition ... he was named the Athletics Department's Male Athlete of the Year ... Jordan averaged 14.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 5.4 assists ... he was second in the Southland and 34th nationally with his 5.4 dimes per game ... he set a new school record for the third consecutive year in assists, posting 177 ... he also finished seventh in the league with his 1.5 steals per game ... Jordan averaged 33.9 minutes, fourth in the Southland ... he posted 10 games with 20 points or more and 25 with 10 points or more ... he scored a career-high 28 points with four rebounds and three assists against IPFW (11/15), hitting the game-winning shot with 4.2 seconds left.



HAMEED ALI

Ali was an outstanding leader on and off the court for the Islanders, playing in all 34 games and starting 30 ... he averaged 8.0 points per game and 2.0 rebounds ... he served as the team's secondary point guard, posting 82 assists to 35 turnovers, one of the best ratios in the conference ... Ali shot .412 (96-for-233) from the field and .383 (31-for-81) from beyond the arc ... he also totaled 39 steals and nine blocks ... he posted 13 points in the win over IPFW (11/15) ... added 12 points and a block against Tennessee Tech (11/16) ... he went 6-for-10 from the field for 17 points against Texas-Pan American (11/17), grabbing four rebounds and four assists ... he scored a career-high 21 points off the bench against UTSA, adding four steals and four assists ... he netted 12 points and four boards against Northwestern State (1/9).

SOTH ANNIVERSARY ALL-DECADE TEAMS HISTORY & RECORDS



Throughout the 2012-13 season, the Southland Conference announced alldecade teams for the five decades the league has played men's basketball.

To best assess the candidate pool for the all-decade team, the Southland Conference developed a metric that analyzed numerous elements of a studentathlete's performance and value within the league at the time. Most notably, the conference honored "real-time" factors such as all-conference selection by coaches and a player's statistical performance among his peers at the time.

Further, other components of selection

including a player's effort toward helping his team win a championship or finish near the top of the conference, whether he earned individual honors from the league, if he participated in postseason tournaments, and if he was drafted by the NBA or ABA at the time.
