THE SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE

Well into its sixth decade of service, the Southland Conference continues to be a model of innovation, stability and consistent achievement as it celebrates the academic and athletic accomplishments of its member institutions and approximately 4,200 student-athletes.

Having commemorated its 50th anniversary in 2013, the Southland Conference has transformed itself into a dynamic and respected consortium of 13 member universities in three states. Beginning with a historic meeting of five institutions in Dallas on March 15, 1963, the Southland Conference set on an extraordinary course that has proven successful well into the 21st Century.

The successful transformation continues, as the Southland Conference welcomed four additional members in 2013: Abilene Christian University, Houston Baptist University, the University of Incarnate Word in San Antonio, and the University of New Orleans

In addition to its newest members, the Southland also consists of the University of Central Arkansas, Lamar University, McNeese State University, Nicholls State University, Northwestern State University, Sam Houston State University, Southeastern Louisiana University, Stephen F. Austin State University and Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi.

An original Southland member from 1963-73, Abilene Christian rejoined the league as one of the most decorated athletic programs in NCAA history, and the addition of Houston Baptist, UIW and New Orleans gives the Southland a regular competitive presence in the key metropolitan areas of Houston, San Antonio and New Orleans. Southland cities encompass approximately 14 million people, and six of its television markets rank among the top 100 in the U.S.

All told, the membership of the Southland encompasses nearly 140,000 current students and an alumni base of nearly 800,000. Famous alums from current Southland Conference schools include former CBS news anchor Dan Rather (Sam Houston State), NBA executive Joe Dumars (McNeese State), ABC news anchor Robin Roberts (Southeastern Louisiana), Major League Baseball star Wade Miley (Southeastern Louisiana), NBA legend Scottie Pippen (Central Arkansas), and track and field Olympians Kenta Bell (Northwestern State), and Bobby Morrow and Billy Olson (both Abilene Christian).

Other notable alums from current members include Grammy Award-winning musicians Frank Ocean (New Orleans), Don Henley and Rodney Crowell (both Stephen F. Austin), and Ronnie Dunn (Abilene Christian), television personality and actress Ellen DeGeneres (New Orleans),

current NFL standouts Lardarius Webb (Nicholls State), Terrence McGee (Northwestern State), and Daniel Manning (Abilene Christian), professional golfers Shawn Stefani and Chris Stroud (both Lamar) and Colin Montgomerie (HBU), award-winning filmmaker Richard Linklater (Sam Houston State), American Idol winner Kris Allen (Central Arkansas), NFL Hall of Famer Jackie Harris (Northwestern State), former NFL standouts Bobby Hebert (Northwestern State), Gary Barbaro (Nicholls State), Wilbert Montgomery (Abilene Christian) and Gary Reasons (Northwestern State), former MLB stars Darryl Hamilton (Nicholls State) and Kevin Millar (Lamar), NCAA football coach Charlie Strong (Central Arkansas), actors John Larroquette (New Orleans), Ricardo Chavira (UIW) and Jesse Borrego (UIW), and the late NFL coaching legend O.A. "Bum" Phillips (Lamar and Stephen F. Austin).

The Southland sponsors 17 full championship sports, all at the NCAA Division I level. The eight men's sports include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track and field. The women compete for nine championships in basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball. The conference earns automatic qualification to NCAA championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, and volleyball. The Southland Bowling League, an affiliated Conference sport, originated in 2015, and four of its members filled out half of the eight-team bracket, with Stephen F. Austin advancing to the national title match.

Continuing its tradition of innovation, the league launched the Southland Conference Television Network in the fall of 2008 and has broadcast more than 160 events. The network has expanded its reach to roughly 13 million households throughout Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas and Oklahoma in recent years, and has also gained national viewership through ESPN3 and Fox College Sports. In its first seven years, the network has received recognition for its work, earning numerous College Sports Media and Telly Awards.

The Southland Conference, in conjunction with the city of Frisco, Texas, and Hunt Sports Group, also serves as the host to the NCAA Division I Football Championship Game in Frisco, which has been home to the conference headquarters since 2006. The game is played at Frisco's Toyota Stadium, and after a successful three-year run, the partnership was rewarded with a three-year renewal to serve as the national championship host site through the 2015 season.

Southland Conference football ranks among the best Football Championship Subdivision leagues in the nation, and enjoys an annual expectation of competing for the national championship with multiple teams advancing to the NCAA playoffs each year. In 2014, three Southland teams – Southeastern Louisiana, Sam Houston State and Stephen F. Austin– all qualified for the NCAA Division I Football Championship, and in 2011 and 2012, Sam Houston advanced to the national championship game. Also, in 2002 and 2003, McNeese State finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in the nation, and advanced to the 2002 national championship contest. The conference has been represented in eight national championship games since the league joined the FCS (formerly I-AA) in 1982. All told, Southland teams have played in 115 Division I playoff games in 33 years, winning 56 of the contests.

Historically, the Southland's successful football heritage has sustained itself through numerous membership and classification changes. The Southland joined the NCAA College Division in 1964, and was designated as NCAA Division II in 1973 before joining Division I in 1975. The Southland was an NCAA Division I-A league from 1978-81, before joining the ranks of FCS in 1982, its home ever since.

During its tenure as a Division I and I-A conference, the Southland Conference initiated the startup of the Shreveport, La.-based Independence Bowl in 1976. The Southland representative served as the host team of the bowl until 1980, compiling a 2-3 record in those contests.

The Conference can lay claim to five national championships, including College Division championships through former members Arkansas State (1970, UPI) and Louisiana Tech (1972, National Football Foundation). Louisiana Tech also won the first NCAA-sanctioned national title, winning the Division II playoffs in 1973. Tech followed that with the UPI's Division II national championship in 1974. Louisiana-Monroe won the 1987 Division I-AA national championship.

McNeese State, which has made 15 appearances in the NCAA Division I playoffs, played in the 1997 NCAA Championship game, while Sam Houston State has earned eight trips to the football playoffs, most recently advancing to the 2014 national semifinals. Stephen F. Austin played in the 1989 NCAA title contest and has seven total playoff appearances, including 2009, 2010 and 2014. Northwestern State has advanced to the NCAA playoffs six times, Nicholls State has participated three times in postseason, Southeastern Louisiana played in the 2013 and 2014 NCAA Championships, and Central Arkansas made consecutive playoff appearances in 2011

and 2012. On six occasions, the Southland has placed three teams in the NCAA playoffs.

The Southland has produced 177 first-team football All-Americans during its history and in 2010, Stephen F. Austin quarterback Jeremy Moses became the first player in Southland history to receive the Walter Payton Award, which is presented annually to the most outstanding football player at the FCS level.

The Southland is one of five FCS conferences with at least 200 selections (208) in the National Football League draft. There have been 28 Southland players taken in the draft since 2000, including Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Robert Alford, who was picked as the first FCS player in the second round of the 2013 draft. There are more than 15 former Southland players on NFL rosters heading into the 2015 season.

Southland Conference alums in the NFL include Cleveland's Josh McCown (Sam Houston State), who has been in the league for the last 12 seasons, and Baltimore's Lardarius Webb, who is currently the second-longest tenured player with six seasons of experience. Other recent NFL additions from the Southland include New England's Kevin Hughes (Southeastern Louisiana) and Dax Swanson (Sam Houston State), Seattle's Jeremy Lane (Northwestern State), Chicago's Malcolm Bronson (McNeese State), Atlanta's Robert Alford (Southeastern Louisiana) and Washington's Chase Dixon (Central Arkansas).

The Southland has seen former Nicholls State players win Super Bowl rings in recent seasons, as former Colonel Antonio Robinson was a member of the Green Bay Packers' Super Bowl XLV champions. And, Nicholls-ex Webb was a member of the Super Bowl XLVII champion Baltimore Ravens.

Among the former NFL stars from the Southland include Fred Dean, who was inducted to the Professional Football Hall of Fame in 2008 to become the first former Southland Conference player to earn induction in Canton. Other great NFL players from the Southland include Super Bowl XXIX quarterback Stan Humphries, Bill Bergey, Mike Barber, Fred Barnett, Bubby Brister, Ray Brown, Roger Carr, Larry Centers, Bruce Collie, Jackie Harris, Buford Jordan, Tim McKyer, Kavika Pittman, Billy Ryckman, Rickey Sanders, Eugene Seale, Rafael Septien, Terrance Shaw, Leonard Smith, Marcus Spears, Pat Tilley and Marvin Upshaw. Both Dean and Smith are recent inductees to the College Football Hall of Fame.

The Southland Conference has also seen its share of great coaches during its history in Maxie Lambright, Ernie Duplechin,

Sam Goodwin, Jack Doland, Bennie Ellender, Bobby Keasler, Larry Lacewell, Bill Davidson, Dennis Franchione, Pat Collins, and Ron Randleman.

In addition to football, the Southland Conference can point to a number of accomplishments in all sports.

Men's basketball has experienced a tremendous amount of success during the Southland's 52 seasons. The league has sent four teams to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen, as well as a squad to the NIT Final Four. Basketball stars Karl Malone, Joe Dumars, Jeff Foster, Dwight "Bo" Lamar, Andrew Toney and Mike Oliver played in the Southland Conference.

In 2013-14, Stephen F. Austin set numerous Southland records, including marks for victories in a season (32) and consecutive wins overall (29 straight) and in Conference play (23 in a row), and playing as a 12th seed, knocked off fifth-seeded Virginia Commonwealth, 77-75, in the NCAA's Second Round. In 2006, Northwestern State, playing as the No. 14 seed in the NCAA tournament, defeated No. 3 seed lowa, 64-63, in first-round action. The league saw a record five men's basketball teams reach the postseason in 2015.

Coaches such as Billy Tubbs, Mike Vining, Scotty Robertson, Jack Martin, Andy Russo, Bob Marlin, Danny Kaspar, Mike McConathy, Bobby Paschal and Pat Foster have led very successful teams in the Southland.

In women's basketball, the Southland also has its share of tradition with former member Louisiana-Monroe advancing to the 1985 NCAA Women's Final Four, and Stephen F. Austin sustaining itself as one of the most successful programs in the history of the sport. In 2014, the Ladyjacks became the fifth program in NCAA Division I history to record more than 950 wins.

In each of the last six seasons, at least three Southland teams reached the postseason, and in 2013, four women's squads earned postseason berths. A Southland team has played in the WNIT 15 times, including each of the last nine years. Women's basketball all-stars have included Eun Jung Lee, Lisa Ingram, Portia Hill, Deneen Parker, Katrina Price, and Joskeen Garner, and coaches such as Gary Blair, Linda Sharp, James Smith and Linda Harper.

Baseball has emerged as a constant Southland Conference strength with the league earning numerous national rankings and NCAA tournament berths. The Southland consistently ranks among the top-10 conferences in the country. In 2011, 50 of the league's 150 non-conference victories came against the

Big 12, Conference USA, Sun Belt and SEC. Major leaguers such as Wade Miley, Paul Goldschmidt, Ben Sheets, Micah Hoffpauir, Hunter Pence, David Segui, Brian Lawrence, Ben Broussard, Chuck Finley, Jerald Clark, and Terry Matthews once played in the Southland.

In 2012, Southeastern Louisiana's Stefan Lopez became the league's second winner of the national Stopper of the Year Award, which is selected by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers. Sam Houston State's Luke Prihoda won the award in 2007. Only the Big 12 has had more players win this award.

The Southland also fares well each year in the Major League Draft, but for the first time in conference history, two Southland players were selected in the first round of the 2013 draft. Stephen F. Austin shortstop Hunter Dozier was picked eighth by the Kansas City Royals making the Southland player and hitter of the year the league's top draft pick in any sport. Later in the first round, the Texas Rangers selected Oral Roberts right-handed pitcher Alex Gonzalez, Southland pitcher of the year, with the 23rd overall pick. The Southland has had eight first-round picks in its history.

In 2014, Lamar mentor Jim Gilligan became the first Southland coach to reach 1,300 career victories, ranking him sixth-best in the NCAA among active Division I coaches and 14th all-time. He leads an impressive list of coaches who have patrolled Southland Conference dugouts, including Mark Johnson, Mike Bianco, John Cohen, Mitch Gaspard, Smoke Laval, Butch McBroom, Pat Patterson, David Pierce, Tony Robichaux, Dave Van Horn and Jim Wells.

Softball continues to enjoy success on a national level, beating nationally-ranked opponents every year since 1995, including McNeese State's win at No. 1 Arizona State early in the 2012 season. In 2013, the league had six wins against ranked opponents, including wins by McNeese State at No. 7 Alabama and No. 8 Texas A&M. In NCAA tournament competition, the Southland has racked up 15 wins.

The Southland also has a proud history in volleyball with former member Texas-Arlington representing the conference numerous times in the NCAA tournament, including a run to the NCAA Volleyball Final Four in 1989.

Track and field has also served as a proud asset for the Southland Conference as the league has produced numerous national champions and Olympic medalists. The Southland boasts 28 men and four women student-athletes who have

won NCAA track and field national championships, including Stephen F. Austin's Demi Payne, who won the 2015 women's pole vault, Northwestern State's Trecey Rew, who won the women's discus in 2011, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi's Shadrack Songok (men's 10,000-meter run) in 2007 and 2008 and McNeese State's Brad Gebauer (men's pole vault) in 2007. The league has also produced U.S. Olympic track and field medalists Earl Bell, Thomas Hill, Al Joyner, Charles Austin, and Liudmila Litvinova, along with other Olympians. With the addition of 10 more All-Americans in 2012, the league continues to find national success in both indoor and outdoor track and field. In the indoor circuit, the Southland boasts 66 unique all-time All-Americans that have won a combined 11 national championships. Likewise, in the outdoor season, the league has seen 158 different All-Americans, including 128 men and 30 women, who have combined to win 21 national championships.

Golf has traditionally been a strong Southland sport as exemplified by Lamar men's golfer Chris Stroud, who finished third individually at the 2003 NCAA National Championship and has 21 top ten PGA finishes since joining pro tour in 2007. Another Lamar alum, Shawn Stefani, had a pair of top seven finishes on the 2013 PGA tour. The league has sent multiple teams into postseason play on numerous occasions, including in 2012 when three Southland teams — Lamar, Southeastern Louisiana and Texas-Arlington — competed in the NCAA tournament. Additionally, during the past five seasons the Southland has sent 12 golfers to compete as individuals in regional play with five in 2009, three more in 2010, one each in 2011 and 2012 and two in 2013. Lamar won a pair of NCAA Division II national championships in 1967 and 1968.

In 2005, Lamar's Dawie Van Der Walt finished fourth individually and Lamar tied for 12th place at the NCAA Men's Golf Championship, before the Cardinals tied for ninth in 2006 and tied for third in 2007.

In women's tennis, Southeastern Louisiana won 46 consecutive conference matches during a four-year period that began in 2005, while in men's tennis Texas A&M-Corpus Christi has played in the NCAA tournament seven times in the last nine years.

The conference has increased sponsorship and championship opportunities for female student-athletes in recent years, adding women's golf and soccer as league sports.

In women's soccer, Stephen F. Austin midfielder Kylie Louw became the first player in conference history to earn All-America honors, when she earned third-team mention by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. A member of the South Africa Olympic team during the 2012 London Olympics, she also garnered first-team Academic All-America Honors

from the College Sports Information Directors of America. Abilene Christian's Brie Buschman was a first-team Academic All-American in 2013, and Stephen F. Austin's Megan Glick earned the same honor in 2014.

In women's golf, the Southland sent two teams to 2012 NCAA regional play for the first time since the league added the sport in 2002. Lamar has a league-best six Southland championships during that span.

The Southland Conference has repeatedly demonstrated its commitment to the academic and athletic success of its student-athletes. With the F.L. McDonald Postgraduate ScholarshipAward, the league annually honors male and female scholar-athletes with a stipend for postgraduate study. The Scholar-Athlete Award is given to each institution's male and female student-athlete with the highest grade-point average. The Steve McCarty Citizenship Award, initiated in 2005-06 and named after the former Stephen F. Austin athletic director, properly recognizes accomplishments off the court for a male and female student-athlete. Also, student-athletes with grade-point averages above 3.0 are honored on the Southland's annual All-Academic teams and Commissioner's Honor Roll. A total of 856 student-athletes appeared on the honor roll following the 2013 spring semester, and total of 1,553 student-athletes

earned a spot on the honor roll at the end of the fall and spring semesters during the 2012-13 academic year.

While successful on the fields and courts, the Southland Conference has repeatedly demonstrated its commitment to the academic and athletic success of its student-athletes.

The conference continues to make great strides in the classroom. During the last decade, no other Division I conference has improved its Academic Progress Rate as well as the Southland Conference has. In fact, in 2009-10, the Southland ranked 10th among the 31 Division I leagues in men's basketball APR. The academic progress the league has shown ultimately leads to higher graduation rates for our student-athletes.

In addition to providing expanding opportunities for student-athletes, the Southland Conference and its member institutions are very involved in various community outreach programs. Many of these programs provide positive life skills training such as academics, citizenship and leadership to school-aged students in Southland communities.

Tom Burnett was named the Southland Conference's sixth commissioner on Dec. 23, 2002, and brought a diverse background in athletics administration experience at the conference and national levels. The second-longest tenured full-time commissioner in league history, Burnett is now in his 13th year of service with the Southland, and has a conference administrative background reaching over 25 years.

Burnett has helped to enhance the Southland's membership, with the 2013 additions of Houston Baptist University, the University of New Orleans, Abilene Christian University and the University of the Incarnate Word. The new member institutions give the Southland 13 members in Texas, Louisiana and Arkansas.

The league's television exposure has benefitted under his watch with the expansion of national and regional coverage, including the Southland's recent national broadcast agreement with ESPN Networks that guarantees over 120 broadcasts through 2019-20. Additionally, the Conference has recently announced a new regional and national broadcasting partnership with the American Sports Network that will provide dozens of telecasts annually.

The Southland Conference Television Network originated in 2008, and this creative in-house broadcast venture has featured over 150 unique sports and promotional telecasts to a potential viewing audience of more than 13 million television households. The Southland has also enjoyed beneficial relationships with Fox Sports Net Southwest, Cox Sports Television and Root Sports Southwest.

Burnett led the successful community-wide effort to bring the 2011-13 NCAA Division I Football Championship Games to the Southland's home base of Frisco, Texas, as the league serves as the host conference for the national title contests at Toyota Stadium. The NCAA subsequently renewed the agreement to keep the national championship game in Frisco through the 2016 event. A leading proponent for the Football Championship Subdivision, Burnett also organized the FCS Summit, a national gathering of athletic directors, commissioners, NCAA staff and other key football stakeholders held annually prior to the national championship games in Frisco.

A former member of both the NCAA's Division I Committee on Academic Performance and the Division I Football Academic Working Group, Burnett also served as the FCS Vice President for the Collegiate Commissioners Association (CCA) in 2007-08. He currently serves on the NCAA's FCS Working Group that consists of presidents, commissioners, athletic directors and coaches.

He is also a member of the Board of Managers for College Football Officiating (CFO), LLC, an entity created by the NCAA and the Collegiate Commissioners Association to enhance college football officiating in Division I and act as a central point-of-contact for college football officiating issues. He also formerly served on the Board of Directors for NCAA Football.

He represented the Southland Conference on the NCAA Division I Management Council in 2004-05, and served on the Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Governance Committee from 2004-06. Burnett previously served on the NCAA Playing Rules Oversight Panel, and the NCAA Baseball Rules Committee.

In 2004, Burnett began the league's renewed efforts to secure corporate sponsorships. Since then, the Southland has secured sponsorship agreements with State Farm Insurance, Capital One Bank, Toyota, American Airlines, Royal Purple Motor Oil, Best Western Hotels, O'Reilly Auto Parts, BellSouth, Aeropostale, Holiday Inn, MidSouth Bank, Academy Sports and Outdoors, and Advantage Rent-A-Car.

He also initiated efforts in 2007 to bring the Southland Conference basketball tournaments to a neutral site in the Houston area, giving the league a year-end celebration of the sport at a centralized location near much of the Southland's largest alumni and student bases. The tournament has remained in the Houston area since, and league administrators recently agreed to extend the stay at least through the 2017 event.

Prior to joining the Southland, Burnett spent nearly 11 years in a number of roles with the Sun Belt Conference in New Orleans, including stints as associate and assistant commissioner, and director of communications. He also served two years on the staff of the American South Conference, and started his career on the athletic staff at Louisiana Tech University.

Burnett, a native of Houston, is a 1988 graduate of Louisiana Tech University, where he studied journalism and spent one year as the sports editor of the school's student newspaper. He and his wife Tracy are the parents of a son, Cole, and a daughter, Jesse.

INSTANT REPLAY

The Southland Conference announced on May 21, 2014, that it would become the first Division I FCS league to implement full NCAA instant replay at all home football games, regardless of television coverage, effective with the 2014 season. In the first succesful season, the Southland partnered with DVSport, Inc., the leader in collegiate football high-definition, to provide the league and its 11 football-playing institutions with the cutting-edge technology for instant replay.

The initiative, proposed by the Southland coaches and ratified by the league's athletic directors, was ultimately approved by the Southland's presidential Board of Directors. The Southland staffs the replay operations within a press box booth at each stadium with a replay official, a communicator, a technician and a sideline assistant.

The permanent installation of replay highlighted another positive aspect of the Southland's longstanding officiating consortium with the Big 12 and Mountain West conferences, as qualified replay officials and communicators are readily available for Southland home games.

2015 NCAA FOOTBALL PLAYING RULES - RULE 12, Instant Replay

SECTION 1. Purpose and Philosophy

Purpose

ARTICLE 1. Instant replay is a process whereby video review is used to confirm, reverse or let stand certain on-field decisions (Rule 12-3) made by game officials.

Philosophy

ARTICLE 2. The instant replay process operates under the fundamental assumption that the ruling on the field is correct. The replay official may reverse a ruling if and only if the video evidence convinces him beyond all doubt that the ruling was incorrect. Without such indisputable video evidence, the replay official must allow the ruling to stand.

SECTION 2. Eligibility for Instant Replay

Participation

ARTICLE 1.

- a. Any member institution may use instant replay, but there is no requirement to do so. If instant replay is used, it must be used in full compliance with this rule.
- b. For any nonconference game, if the home team is using instant replay, the visiting team does not have the option of declining its use for that game.
- c. If the home team is not using instant replay, it is not required to honor a request by the visiting team that it be used.

SECTION 3. Reviewable Plays

Scoring Plays

ARTICLE 1. Reviewable plays involving a potential score include:

- a. A potential touchdown or safety. [Exception: Safety by penalty for fouls that are not specifically reviewable.]
- b. Field goal attempts if and only if the ball is ruled (a) below or above the crossbar or (b) inside or outside the uprights when it is lower than the top of the uprights. If the ball is higher than the top of the uprights as it crosses the end line, the play may not be reviewed.

Passes

ARTICLE 2. Reviewable plays involving passes include:

- a. Pass ruled complete, incomplete or intercepted anywhere in the field of play or an end zone.
 - b. Forward pass touched by a player (eligible or ineligible) or an official.
- Forward pass or forward handing when a ball carrier is or has been beyond the neutral zone.
- d. A forward pass or forward handing after a change of team possession.
- e. Pass ruled forward or backward when thrown from behind the neutral zone.
- 1. If the pass is ruled forward and is incomplete, the play is reviewable only if the ball goes out of bounds or if there is clear recovery of a loose ball in the immediate continuing action after the loose ball. If the replay official does not have indisputable video evidence as to which team recovers, the ruling of incomplete pass stands.
- If the replay official reverses an incomplete forward pass ruling and the ball is recovered, it belongs to the recovering team at the spot of the recovery and any advance is nullified.
- f. Location of the passer when he is obviously in the field of play and a ruling of intentional grounding would result in a safety by penalty.

Dead Ball and Loose Ball

 $\label{lem:article} \textbf{ARTICLE 3.} \ \ \text{Reviewable plays involving potential dead balls and loose balls include:}$

- a. Loose ball by a potential passer ruled a fumble.
- b. Loose ball by a passer ruled incomplete forward pass when there is clear recovery in the immediate continuing action after the loose ball.
- If the replay official does not have indisputable video evidence as to which team recovers, the ruling of incomplete pass stands.
- If the replay official rules fumble, the ball belongs to the recovering team at the spot of the recovery and any advance is nullified.

- c. Live ball not ruled dead in possession of a ball carrier.
- d. Loose ball ruled dead, or live ball ruled dead in possession of a ball carrier when the clear recovery of a loose ball occurs in the immediate continuing action.
- f the ball is ruled dead and the replay official does not have indisputable video evidence as to which team recovers, the dead-ball ruling stands.
- 2. If the replay official rules that the ball was not dead, it belongs to the recovering team at the spot of the recovery and any advance is nullified.
- e. Ball carrier's forward progress, spot of fumble, or spot of out-of-bounds backward pass, with respect to a first down.
- f. Catch or recovery of a fumble by a Team A player other than the fumbler before any change of possession during fourth down or a try.
- g. Ball carrier in or out of bounds. If a ball carrier is ruled out of bounds, the play is not reviewable, except as in Rules 12-3-1-a and 12-3-3-d.
 - h. Catch, recovery or touching of a loose ball by a player inbounds or out of bounds.
- i. A loose ball touching on or beyond a sideline, goal line, or end line, touching a pylon, or breaking the plane of a goal line.
- j. Catch or recovery of a loose ball in the field of play or an end zone.
- k. Forward fumble that goes out of bounds with respect to a first down.

Kicks

ARTICLE 4. Reviewable plays involving kicks include:

- a. Touching of a kick.
- b. Player beyond the neutral zone when kicking the ball.
- c. Kicking team player advancing a ball after a potential muffed kick/fumble by the receiving team.
 - d. Scrimmage kick crossing the neutral zone.
 - e. Blocking by Team A players before they are eligible to touch the ball on an on-side kick.

Miscellaneous

ARTICLE 5. Situations that may be addressed by the replay official:

- a. The number of players on the field for either team during a live ball.
- b. Clock adjustment and status when a ruling is reviewed.
- c. Clock adjustment at the end of any quarter. (Exception: Rule 3-2-5-b)

If at the end of any quarter the game clock expires, either during a down in which it should be stopped by rule when the ball becomes dead or following the down upon a request for an available team timeout, the replay official may restore time only under these conditions:

 The replay official has indisputable video evidence that time should have remained on the game clock when the ball became dead or when the team timeout was granted;

- 2. In the second and fourth quarters only the team in possession when the ball became dead would next put the ball in play from scrimmage;
- 3. In the fourth quarter only, either the score is tied or the team that will next snap the ball is behind by eight points or fewer; and
- 4. The replay official's video evidence includes the timeout signal by an official in the case where the game clock should have stopped for a requested team timeout.
 - d. Correcting the number of a down.
- 1. This includes the result of a penalty enforcement that includes an automatic first down or loss of down.
- 2. The correction may be made at any time within that series of downs or before the ball is legally put in play after that series.
- e. Any person who is not a player interfering with live-ball action occurring in the field of play (Rule 9-2-3).
- f. The player-disqualification portion of the penalty for targeting fouls under 9-1-3 and 9-1-4. The point of forcible contact and use of the crown of the helmet are reviewable; however, the targeting action itself is not reviewable. Note that if the disqualification is reversed the 15-yard penalty remains only if there is another personal foul in conjunction with the targeting. See the Penalty at Rules 9-1-3 and 9-1-4.

Limitations on Reviewable Plays

ARTICLE 6. No other plays or officiating decisions are reviewable. However, the replay official may correct egregious errors, including those involving the game clock, whether or not a play is reviewable. This excludes fouls that are not specifically reviewable (Reviewable fouls: Rules 12-3-2-c and d, 12-3-4-b and 12-3-5-a).

SECTION 4. Instant Replay Personnel, Equipment and LocationPersonnel

ARTICLE 1. Instant replay personnel shall consist of the number of persons needed to operate the replay equipment within the necessary time constraints. There shall be a minimum of three persons to ensure that all plays are reviewed in an efficient and timely manner. Such persons are normally referred to as replay official, communicator and technician. Additional personnel may be used as needed.

Equipment

ARTICLE 2. The type of equipment used to carry out necessary instant replay duties shall be determined by each conference or member institution using instant replay.

Location

ARTICLE 3.

- a. All equipment used reviewing a play during the replay process and the personnel using that equipment shall be located in a separate, secure location in the press box. This room shall not be available or accessible to any person not directly involved in instant replay.
- b. Additional telephonic equipment needed to allow instant replay personnel to communicate with the game referee when a game has been stopped for a play review shall be located on a sideline near the field of play and preferably outside a team area. Such equipment shall provide the game referee and the replay official a secure and private means of communication.

SECTION 5. Initiating the Replay Process

Game Stop

ARTICLE 1. There are two methods to stop a game to review a ruling on the field.

- a. The replay official and his crew shall review every play of a game. He may stop a game at any time before the ball is next legally put in play (Exception: Rule 12-3-5-c) whenever he believes that:
- There is reasonable evidence to believe an error was made in the initial on-field ruling.
 - 2. The play is reviewable.
 - 3. The outcome of a review would have a direct, competitive impact on the game.
- b. The head coach of either team may request that the game be stopped and a play be reviewed by challenging the on-field ruling.
- 1. A head coach initiates this challenge by taking a team timeout before the ball is next legally put in play (Exception: Rule 12-3-5-c) and informing the referee that he is challenging the ruling of the previous play. If a head coach's challenge is successful, he retains the challenge, which he may use only once more during the game. Thus, a coach may have a total of two challenges if and only if his initial challenge is successful.
- After a review has been completed, if the on-field ruling is reversed, that team's timeout will not be charged.
- After a review has been completed, and the on-field ruling is not reversed, the charged team timeout counts as one of the three permitted that team for that half or the one permitted in that extra period.



- 4. A head coach may not challenge a ruling in which the game was stopped and a decision has already been made by the replay official.
- 5. If a head coach requests a team timeout to challenge an on-field ruling and the play being challenged is not reviewable, the timeout shall count as one of the three permitted his team during that half of the game or the one permitted in that extra period.
- 6. A head coach may not challenge an on-field ruling if all the team's timeouts have been used for that half or in that extra period.

When To Stop a Game

ARTICLE 2.

- a. A game may be stopped, either by the replay official or by a head coach's challenge, at any time before the ball is next legally put in play (Exception: Rule 12-3-5-c).
 - b. No game official may request that a game be stopped for a play to be reviewed.

SECTION 6. Reviewing an On-field Ruling

Procedures

ARTICLE 1.

- a. When a game is to be stopped either by the replay official or by a head coach's challenge, the designated officials on the field will be notified by a buzzer system or other appropriate means.
- b. If the review is initiated by the replay official, the referee shall announce:

"The ruling on the previous play is ... (brief description of ruling). The play is under further review."

If the game has been stopped due to a head coach's challenge, the referee shall announce: "The (name of institution) head coach has challenged the ruling of (state the ruling). The play is under further review."

- c. All reviews shall be based upon video evidence provided by and coming directly from the televised production of the game or from other video means available to the replay official.
- d. After the referee has conferred with the replay official and the review process has been completed, he shall make one of the following announcements:
 - If the video evidence confirms the on-field ruling:

"After further review, the ruling on the field is confirmed."

- If there is no indisputable (conclusive) evidence to reverse the on-field ruling: "After further review, the ruling on the field stands."
 - 3. If the on-field ruling is reversed (Rule 12-7):

"After further review, the ruling is [followed by a brief description of the video evidence]. Therefore, [followed by a brief description of the impact of the ruling]."

e. f a ruling is reversed, the replay official shall supply the referee with all pertinent data as needed (next down, distance, yard line, position of the ball, clock status/adjustment) in order to resume play under the correct game conditions.

Restrictions

ARTICLE 2.

- a. There is no restriction on the number of times the replay official may stop a game for reviews.
 - b. The replay official is under no time limit for a review.

SECTION 7. Reversing an On-Field Ruling

Criterion for Reversal

ARTICLE 1. To reverse an on-field ruling, the replay official must be convinced beyond all doubt by indisputable video evidence through one or more video replays provided to the monitor.

SOUTHLAND FOOTBALL TELEVISION PACKAGE









Television plans for the first four weeks of the Southland Conference football season have been finalized, along with arrangements for select games throughout the remainder of the season.

For games on October 3 and beyond, the conference will reveal most TV choices 12 days prior to kickoff. This will allow for the best matchups to be selected each week for various partners. In previous years, the conference announced all television selections prior to the season, except for wild card choices in the final one or two weeks.

ESPN plans to exercise its option to make the initial choice most weeks, placing a game on ESPN3, its multi-screen network. The Southland Conference on American Sports Network will then make its selection, with those games syndicated throughout the region and beyond. Cox Sports Television is set to air a package of games as well, with those dates and times still to be determined.

Opening night falls on Thursday, September 3, and will feature a conference matchup between Southeastern Louisiana and Northwestern State. The Southland Conference on American Sports Network will carry the game on local affiliates across the country. ASN's list of partner stations will be announced later.

The season's first Saturday, September 5, will feature at least three televised games. Stephen F. Austin's opener against Northern Arizona will be available exclusively on ESPN3, while a pair of road games will also receive coverage. McNeese State meets LSU on SEC Network Alternate, while Sam Houston State visits Texas Tech on Fox Sports Net.

The Southland Conference on American Sports Network will feature four more games in the early portion of the schedule, including UIW at McNeese State (Sept. 12), Lamar at Sam Houston State (Sept. 19), Stephen F. Austin at Abilene Christian (Sept. 26) and Lamar at Southeastern Louisiana (Oct. 1). Two matchups later in the season have also been locked in for ASN: Central Arkansas at Houston Baptist (Oct. 10) and Nicholls at Southeastern Louisiana (Nov. 19).

The conference is also seeking additional broadcast opportunities. For games not selected by conference partners, individual schools will have the ability to produce broadcasts via television or online outlets. For example, Stephen F. Austin has announced a partnership that will allow all unselected home games to air on ESPN3, including the aforementioned opener vs. Northern Arizona.

1963

The Southland Conference is organized by five institutions: Abilene Christian College (Abilene Christian University), Arkansas State College (Arkansas State University) Arlington State College (University of Texas at Arlington) Lamar State College of Technology (Lamar University) and Trinity University.

1964

The Southland Conference begins football play. Lamar wins inaugural championship with a 3-0-1 league mark and falls in the Pecan Bowl to Northern Iowa, 19-17.

1965

Lamar repeats as Southland champion with a 3-1 mark (6-4 overall).

1966

Texas-Arlington and Lamar finish as co-champions with identical 3-1 marks.

1967

Texas-Arlington wins the league title with a perfect 4-0 record, and completes a 10-1 season with a 13-0 win over North Dakota State in Pecan Bowl.

Trinity defensive end Marvin Upshaw becomes the first Southland Conference player to be selected in the first round of the NFL draft, the 21st overall selection by the Cleveland Browns.

1968

The Southland Conference begins competition in the NCAA's College Division.

Arkansas State takes the Southland title with a 3-0-1 mark, but loses in the Pecan Bowl to North Dakota State, 23-14.

1969

Arkansas State repeats as league champion, sweeping through the league at 4-0. ASU caps an 8-1-1 season with a win over Drake, 29-21, in the Pecan Bowl.

1970: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Arkansas State wins the Southland title for the third consecutive year and finishes the season with a perfect 11-0 mark, winning the UPI College Division National Championship. ASU capped the year with a 38-21 win over Central Missouri State in the Pecan Bowl.

Arkansas State head coach Bennie Ellender is named the National Small College Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association.

1971

Louisiana Tech University and the University of Southwestern Louisiana (Louisiana-Lafayette) join the Southland Conference. Louisiana Tech, Trinity and Lamar share the championship with 4-1 records. Louisiana Tech caps a 9-2 season with a 14-3 win over Eastern Michigan in the Pioneer Bowl.

1972: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Louisiana Tech wins its second straight championship with a 5-0 mark, and caps off a perfect 12-0 season with a 35-0 trouncing of Tennessee Tech in the Grantland Rice Bowl. The win gives Louisiana Tech a claim to the College Division National Championship.

McNeese State University plays its first season in the Southland Conference. Abilene Christian plays its final season and withdraws from the Southland Conference.

1973: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Louisiana Tech wins the league title with a 5-0 record on the way to a 12-1 season capped off by the league's first NCAA football championship, winning the Division II title, 34-0, over Western Kentucky.

1974: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Louisiana Tech wins its fourth consecutive league crown with a 5-0 mark on the way to an 11-1 overall record. Tech is declared UPI Division II National Champion.

Louisiana Tech wide receiver Roger Carr becomes the second Southland Conference player to be selected in the first round of the NFL draft, the 24th overall pick by the Baltimore Colts.

1975

The Southland Conference begins play as an NCAA Division I league. Arkansas State wins the league with a perfect 5-0 mark and rolls through the season with an 11-0 mark as one of two unbeaten, untied teams in Division I. Because of no postseason opportunities for Arkansas State, the Southland Conference and city of Shreveport, La., develop the idea for the Independence Bowl, to be hosted by the Southland champion.

1976

McNeese State wins its first Southland title with a 4-1 mark. The Cowboys finish the season 10-2 after a 20-16 win over Tulsa in the inaugural Independence Bowl.

1977

Louisiana Tech claims its fifth Southland title with a 4-0 mark, and caps a 9-1-2 season with a 24-14 win over Louisville in the Independence Bowl.

1978

Louisiana Tech and Arkansas State share the title with 4-1 marks, and Louisiana Tech finishes a 6-5 season with a 35-13 loss to East Carolina in the Independence Bowl.

1979

McNeese State wins its second Southland title with a 5-0 league mark. McNeese finishes with an 11-1 record, losing only to Syracuse, 31-7, in the Independence Bowl.

1980

McNeese State rolls to another undefeated 5-0 conference record for its second straight title. The Cowboys lost to Southern Miss., 16-14, in the final Independence Bowl hosted by the Southland champion.

1981

Texas-Arlington wins its first league title in 14 years with a 4-1 mark on the way to a 6-5 overall record. Louisiana-Lafayette plays its final season and withdraws from the Southland Conference.

1982

The Southland Conference is re-classified into the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision, and begins participation in the NCAA Division I Playoffs. Northeast Louisiana University (Louisiana-Monroe) plays its first season in the Southland Conference. Louisiana Tech claims its seventh Southland crown with a 5-0 mark, and finishes at 10-3 after advancing to the NCAA Division I semifinals, and falling to Delaware, 17-0.

1983

North Texas plays its first season in the Southland Conference, and responds by sharing the league title with Louisiana-Monroe with a 5-1 record. North Texas loses in the opening round of the Division I Playoffs at Nevada, 20-17, in overtime. The McNeese State defensive back Leonard Smith becomes the highest Southland Conference draft choice, taken as the 17th overall selection in the first round by the St. Louis Cardinals.

1984: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Louisiana Tech wins the championship with a 5-1 mark, and finishes a 10-5 season by falling in the Division I National Championship to Montana State, 19-6.

Arkansas State also advances to the quarterfinals in the NCAA Division I playoffs, falling at Montana State, 31-14.

1985

Arkansas State claims the title with a 5-1 mark and advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAADivision I playoffs, losing at Nevada, 24-23. Texas-Arlington plays its final season after discontinuing football, and withdraws from the Southland Conference. UTA returned to the league without football during the 1987-88 academic year.

1986: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Arkansas State wins its seventh league title with a perfect 5-0 record and completes a 12-2-1 season by advancing to the Division I National Championship game, falling to Georgia Southern, 48-21.

Arkansas State, Louisiana Tech and Lamar play their final season and withdraw from the Southland Conference. Lamar returns to the league without football during the 1998-1999 academic year.

1987: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Louisiana-Monroe runs through the Southland schedule at 6-0 and finishes a 13-2 season by winning the NCAA Division I National Championship with a 43-42 win over Marshall.

North Texas advances to the NCAA Division I playoffs, falling in the first round at Louisiana-Monroe, 30-9.

Northwestern State University, Sam Houston State University, Southwest Texas State University and Stephen F. Austin State University play their first season in the Southland Conference.



Northwestern State running back John Stephens is selected 17th overall in the first round of the NFL Draft by New England, matching the highest draft selection in Southland Conference history (Leonard Smith, McNeese State, 17th pick, 1983).

1988

Northwestern State wins its first Southland championship with a perfect 6-0 mark, and completes a 10-3 season by advancing to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Idaho, 38-30. For the first time, the Southland sends three teams to postseason play as Stephen F. Austin advances to the second round before falling at Georgia Southern, 27-7. North Texas also earns a playoff bid, but loses in the first round at Marshall, 7-0.

1989: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Stephen F. Austin wins its first Southland championship with a 5-0-1 mark and completes a 12-2-1 season by advancing to the Division I National Championship game, falling at Georgia Southern, 37-34.

1990

Louisiana-Monroe wins the league with a 5-1 mark, and finishes a 7-5 season by losing in the first round of the Division I playoffs, 27-14, at Nevada.

1991


McNeese State, at 4-1-2, and Sam Houston State, at 5-2, share the conference title by virtue of identical .714 winning percentage. McNeese completes a 6-4-2 campaign with a first-round loss at Nevada, 22-16, in the NCAA Division I playoffs. Sam Houston State also earns its first bid into the NCAA Division I playoffs, but the Bearkats lose at Middle Tennessee, 20-19, in overtime. Nicholls State University plays its first season in the league.

1992

Louisiana-Monroe completes an undefeated, 7-0, conference slate for its fourth league title. The Indians advance to the quarterfinals of the playoffs, falling to Delaware, 41-18. McNeese State also earns a bid to the NCAA Division I playoffs, advancing to the quarterfinals, losing at Northern Iowa, 29-7.

1993

McNeese State rolls through the league undefeated at 7-0 and advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing to Troy State, 35-28. For the second time in league history, three Southland teams earn berths into the NCAA Division I playoffs. Louisiana-Monroe falls in the first round to Idaho, 34-31, and Stephen F. Austin loses a first-round contest at Troy State, 42-20. Louisiana-Monroe plays its final football season and withdraws its program from the Southland Conference. ULM's remaining sports continue to compete in the Southland.

1994

North Texas earns its second league crown with a 5-0-1 mark, but loses in the first round of the NCAA Division I playoffs, 24-20. McNeese State also receives a playoff bid, and the Cowboys advance to the quarterfinals, falling at Montana, 30-28. North Texas plays its final season and withdraws from the league.

1995

McNeese State completes an undefeated league schedule at 5-0, and advances to the semifinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing to Marshall, 25-15. Stephen F. Austin also receives a playoff berth and also advances to the national semifinals, falling at Montana, 70-14.

1996

The Southland Football League, a seven-team entity formed by the remaining six Southland Conference football-playing institutions and Troy State University, is formed.

In its first year of Southland competition, Troy wins the league with a 5-1 mark, and advances to the semifinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, falling at Montana, 70-7.

Nicholls, completing a miraculous turnaround from an 0-11 season in 1995, finishes 8-4, and also receives a bid to the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Montana in the first round, 48-3. Nicholls head coach Darren Barbier wins the Eddie Robinson Award, presented annually to the FCS National Coach of the Year.

1997: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

McNeese State and Northwestern State share the Southland title with 6-1 records. McNeese concludes a 13-2 season by advancing to the NCAA Division I National Championship game, falling to Youngstown State, 10-9.

Northwestern State also earns a bid to the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Eastern Washington in the first round, 40-10. Jacksonville State plays its first football season in the league.

1998

Northwestern State wins its third Southland title with a 6-1 record. The Demons advance to the semifinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs before falling to Massachusetts, 41-31. The Southland again sends three teams to postseason play. McNeese State falls in the first round to Massachusetts, 21-19, and Troy State loses in the first round at Florida A&M, 27-17.

1999

Troy and Stephen F. Austin share the league crown at 6-1, and Troy advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing to Florida A&M, 17-10. Troy deFensive tackle Al Lucas wins the Buck Buchanan Award, signifying the nation's top defensive player in the FCS.

2000

Troy wins its third Southland championship with a 7-0 record, and advances to the NCAA Division I playoffs, falling to Appalachian State, 33-30. Troy plays its final season and withdraws from the Southland Football League.

2001

Sam Houston State and McNeese State share the conference crown at 5-1. Sam Houston advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Montana, 49-24.

For the fourth time, the Southland sends three teams into postseason play. McNeese State falls to Maine, 14-10, in the first round, and Northwestern State loses in the first round at Montana, 28-19.

The year marks the final season of the Southland Football League. The SFL identity will be returned into the Southland Conference beginning with the 2002 season.

Sam Houston State head coach Ron Randleman records his 200th career coaching victory.

2002: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

McNeese State wins its record ninth Southland championship with a 6-0 mark. McNeese advances to the NCAA Division I National Championship game, falling to Western Kentucky, 34-14.

McNeese State head coach Tommy Tate is honored with the Eddie Robinson Award.

Jacksonville State plays its final season and withdraws from the Southland Football League.

Southeastern Louisiana, a member of the Southland Conference in sports other than football, announces it will revive football after discontinuing the program in 1986. Southeastern will play two seasons as and FCS independent before playing in the Southland in 2005.

2003

The Southland Conference had an all-time high seven games broadcast on Fox Sports Net affiliates during the 2003 season. In addition, 10 other contests featuring at least one Southland team were aired on the College Sports Television (CSTV), The Football Network (TFN) and COX Sports Television outlets.





Ron Randleman, Sam Houston State

McNeese State completes an undefeated 5-0 conference mark for its third consecutive league title and 10th overall. The Cowboys end the season with a streak of 16 consecutive wins in league play.

For the second year in a row, McNeese State was the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division I playoffs. The Cowboys were ranked No. 1 nationally all but one week during the regular season, but lost their first-round playoff contest.

McNeese State's Tommy Tate was named AFCA Region V Coach of the Year.

2004

Sam Houston State capped a successful season in what would turn out to be the last for 36-year head coach Ron Randleman. The Bearkats had the best turn-around season in all of Division I football, going from 2-9 in 2003 to an 11-3 mark in 2004. Sam Houston notched its third Southland Conference championship in school history. The Bearkats shared the 2004 title with Northwestern State as each compiled 4-1 league records.

Northwestern State received the league's automatic berth to the NCAA playoffs after winning the fourth regular-season title in school history. The Demons fell in the first-round of the NCAA Division I playoffs to Montana.

Sam Houston used an at-large berth to the playoffs and advanced to the semifinal round of the tournament for the first time in school history. The Bearkats opened with an impressive 54-24 win over No. 3 Western Kentucky in round one. They then had to overcome a 20-point deficit in the fourth quarter to win, 35-34, at Eastern Washington in quarterfinal action.

Up next was a trip to Missoula where Sam Houston outgained the host Grizz, but lost the turnover battle. The Bearkats had four miscues while Montana did not turn the ball over. The first three turnovers by Sam Houston led to touchdowns for Montana. Included were two interceptions in the first half, which led to a 14-6 halftime cushion for the host.

The 2004 season marked the 12th time in the last 14 years the Southland Conference was represented by multiple teams in the 16-team NCAA Division I playoff field. Sam Houston State and Northwestern State were duplicates from the 2001 playoffs in a year when the Southland sent three teams with McNeese State also advancing.

2005

Southeastern Louisiana, a member of the league in all other sports since 1997, began Southland Conference football competition. Hurricane Katrina and Hurricane Rita wrecked havoc on the 2005 schedule before Texas State and Nicholls State shared the regular-season crown for the first Southland titles for either. The two advanced to the NCAA Division I playoffs with Texas State going all the way to the semifinals before losing in overtime to Northern Iowa, 40-37.

2006

With McNeese State off to a 1-3 start, the 2006 season looked to be in trouble for success. But a turnaround happened as Matt Viator was named head coach on Sept. 13, 2006. Viator went on to lead the Cowboys to the NCAA Division I playoffs by posting a 6-2 record in his partial season. He was named both the Southland Coach of the Year and the Louisiana Sports Writers Association Coach of the Year and was a finalist in the balloting for Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

McNeese State captured its 11th Southland regularseason title and fourth in the last six years by posting a 5-1 league record in 2006 to finish one game ahead of Sam Houston State and Stephen F. Austin.

Southland newcomer Central Arkansas posted the best overall record at 8-3, but did not play a Southland schedule.

2007

McNeese State finished the regular-season 11-0, becoming the first Southland school to complete the regular-season undefeated since the Cowboys accomplished the feat in 1995. As a result, the school won its 12th Southland regular-season title. The Cowboys also hosted a first-round game in the NCAA Division I playoffs, becoming the first Southland school to host since Texas State hosted three in 2005.

The Southland won two games against FBS opponents in 2007, as Nicholls State knocked off Rice 16-14 and McNeese State defeated Louisiana-Lafayette 38-17. They were the 14th and 15th wins against the FBS for the Southland since 2000.

In the NFL Draft, the Southland had three players, McNeese State's Bryan Smith, Nicholls State's Kareem Moore and Northwestern State's Demetrius Bell all taken. Smith was taken No. 80 overall in the third round by the Philadelphia Eagles, becoming the highest Southland player to be selected since former Cowboy Keith Smith was taken No. 73 in the 2004 NFL Draft.

Lamar, a member of the Southland Conference in sports other than football, announces it will revive football after discontinuing the program in 1989. Lamar will begin play as an FCS independent in 2010 and will play a Southland Conference schedule in 2011.

2008

Texas State won its second Southland title with a 5-2 record after beating rival Sam Houston State in the regular-season finale. Central Arkansas, ineligible for the league championship during its transition to Division I from Division II, finished with a league-best 6-1 conference record. By virtue of winning the outright Southland title, Texas State earned the league's automatic bid into the NCAA Division I playoffs, where it collided with perennial power and fourth-seeded Montana. The Grizzlies went on to reach the NCAA Division I National Championship game after getting by the Bobcats 31-13 in the opening round.

Three players – Central Arkansas quarterback Nathan Brown and defensive end Larry Hart and Nicholls State defensive back Lardarius Webb – as well as Central Arkansas head coach Clint Conque finished among the top 10 in balloting for the Payton Award, the Buck Buchanan Award and the Eddie Robinson Award.

The Southland led all FCS conferences with four NFL Draft picks in April. It was the most drafted out of the league since five were taken in 2002 and brought the total number of draft selections to 25 since the 2000 season. Webb was selected in the third round by Baltimore, while the New York Giants selected Sam Houston State quarterback Rhett Bomar in the fifth round. McNeese State receiver Quinten Lawrence and Stephen F. Austin receiver Dominique Edison, were taken in the sixth round by the Kansas City Chiefs and Tennessee Titans, respectively. Another four players signed free agent contracts.

2009

Stephen F. Austin and McNeese State each finished 6-1 in Southland Conference play to share the conference championship. SFA won its third conference title and first since 1999, while McNeese won its 13th conference championship and its sixth since 2000. The shared titles marked the first time since 2005 the league split its championship. SFA beat McNeese, 16-13, to clinch the league's automatic berth in the NCAA playoffs. The Lumberjacks, who were 0-11 in 2007, picked up the first postseason win by the league since 2005 when Texas State reached the semifinals. In its first appearance in the playoffs since its semifinal run in 1995, SFA beat Eastern Washington at home but lost at Montana in the quarterfinals. McNeese, which was able to earn an at-large bid into the playoffs, also got a home game, but fell to New Hampshire.

Stephen F. Austin coach J.C. Harper was the runnerup for the Eddie Robinson Award, which is presented to the national coach of the year. The conference coach of the year, was just two points shy from winning the national award.



Stephen F. Austin quarterback Jeremy Moses threw for 489 yards to lead the Lumberjacks to a 36-13 victory over Northwestern State in the regular-season finale. That win, coupled with McNeese State's loss at Central Arkansas, gave SFA its first outright Southland Conference title since the 1989 season. It also marked the first time in program history that SFA won back-to-back conference titles. The Lumberjacks earned the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Division I playoffs and were awarded with a home game against Villanova, the 2009 national champion, but lost 54-24.

Moses went on to become the first Southland player to win the Walter Payton Award. The Lumberjacks' quarterback set the FCS record for completions (1,184) and finished among the subdivision's all-time top 10 in total offense (13,201), passing yards (13,401) and touchdown passes.

The Southland Conference, based in Frisco, Texas since 2006, was named the host of the 2011 NCAA Division I Football Championship Game. The Division I playoff bracket expanded from 16 teams to 20 teams and the new format pushed the championship game into January. Eastern Washington defeated Delaware, 20-19, in the first of at least three national championship games to be played at Pizza Hut Park. The venue is scheduled to also host the games following the 2011 and 2012 seasons.

Central Arkansas became a full Division I member in 2010 and was eligible for a conference championship and playoffs. Lamar, already a conference member in other sports, returned to the gridiron after a 21-year absence, but played the 2010 season as an independent. The Cardinals will rejoin the Southland in 2011 for the first time since the 1986 season. Texas State played its final football season as a league member in 2010.

2011: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Sam Houston State cruised to the 2011 Southland Conference championship, becoming the first Southland team since McNeese State in 2007 to go a perfect 11-0 during the regular season, including a 7-0 mark in conference play for its fourth league championship, but its first outright title. No other Texas team had navigated a perfect season in conference play.

The Bearkats were the only unbeaten team in the Football Championship Subdivision at the end of the regular season and were awarded the No. 1 seed in the Division I playoffs. It was Sam Houston's fifth Divison I playoff appearance. After a first-round bye, the Bearkats opened with a win over Stony Brook and followed with wins over long-time Southland nemeses Montana State and Montana to move to 14-0 and set up a date against North Dakota State in the Division I Football Championship Game. The Bison snapped the Bearkats' 16-game win streak (dating back to the 2010 season) with a 17-6 win at FC Dallas Stadium in Frisco, Texas. Both teams finished with 14-1 records. The win total set a Sam Houston State school record. The title game appearance was the Southland's first since the 2002 season, but marked the seventh time a Southland team reached the title game.

Central Arkansas, which finished second in league play at 6-1, made its first appearance in the Division I playoffs in just its second year of eligibility. Playing with an at-large berth, the Bears won the Southland's first road playoff game since 2004 with a 34-14 win at Tennessee Tech before ending its season at Montana.

2012: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Sam Houston State returned to the 2012 Division I Football Championship Game for the second consecutive year after sharing the Southland Conference regular-season title with Central Arkansas. Both schools finished 6-1 in conference, giving the Bearkats their fifth league championship and the Bears their first conference title. In 2008, UCA finished 6-1 in league play and atop the standings but was ineligible for the conference championship during its transition to Division I.

Both Central Arkansas and Sam Houston earned a spot in the postseason, marking the second time in as many years the Southland sent two teams to the postseason, with UCA and Sam Houston also representing the league in the 2011. The Bears earned an opening-round bye in the playoffs but fell to No. 5 seed Georgia Southern on the road 24-16 to finish its year 9-3 overall.

The Bearkats also received a bye in the first round and knocked off Cal Poly (18-16) at home in the second round before winning consecutive road games at Montana State (34-16) in the quarterfinals and at Eastern Washington (45-42) in the semifinals en route to their second consecutive trip to Frisco, Texas, for the championship game. The Bearkats earned a rematch against defending champion North Dakota State and fell to the Bison 39-13. Sam Houston reached the championship game for the second time in its history, and it marked the eighth time a Southland team reached the title game.

In the NFL draft, Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Robert Alford was selected in the second round by the Atlanta Falcons. His 60th overall selection was the highest draft pick of a Southland player since Stephen F. Austin's Mikhael Ricks was taken 59th overall in the 1998 draft by the San Diego Chargers.

2013

Southeastern Louisiana won its first Southland football title after posting a 10-2 overall regular-season record and a perfect 7-0 mark against league opponents. The Lions finished one game ahead of McNeese State, who ended the regular-season 10-2 overall and 6-1 in conference. This marked the first time in conference history the league has produced two 10-win teams before the start of the playoffs. The league had multiple double-digit winners in 1988 and 1995, but in both seasons, one or both teams needed the postseason to get there.

The Southland Conference placed three teams in the playoffs for the fifth time. Southeastern, McNeese and Sam Houston State represented the league. It was the first time since 2001 when Sam Houston, McNeese and Northwestern State each made the field.

The Bearkats opened the postseason against Southern Utah and posted a 51-20 win. However, Sam Houston drew Southeastern in the next round, where the Lions edged the Bearkats 30-29 in the closing seconds. It was the first FCS postseason win in Lion history. Southeastern, which earned the No. 4 national seed, fell in the quarterfinals 20-17 to New Hampshire. On the other side of the bracket, No. 6 seed McNeese lost to Jacksonville State 31-10 in the second round.

2014

Southeastern Louisiana and Sam Houston State shared the regular-season title after each school posted a 7-1 mark in conference play. The Lions and Bearkats finished two games ahead of Stephen F. Austin, Lamar and Central Arkansas, which all went 5-3 in Southland play.

For the second consecutive year, and sixth overall time in league history, the Southland sent three teams to the postseason with Sam Houston, Southeastern and SFA. However, the league co-champions, which did not face each other in the regular season, were matched up in the first round of the postseason with Sam Houston edging Southeastern 21-17. The Lumberjacks, who reached the postseason for the first time since 2010, drew Northern lowa in the first round and fell on the road to the Panthers 44-10, ending their season with an 8-5 mark.

The Bearkats, who finished the year 11-5, continued their postseason success with big road wins. In the second round, Sam Houston defeated Jacksonville State 37-26 before knocking off Villanova 34-31 in the quarterfinals. The Bearkats' road to the championship ended one game shy of Frisco with a 35-3 defeat against the eventually national champion North Dakota State.

Sam Houston finished No. 6 in both final polls while the Lions (9-4 overall) were No. 12 in the Coaches' Poll and No. 14 in the Sports Network Poll.

In the NFL draft, Northwestern State defensive tackle Deon Simons was taken in the seventh round (223 overall) by the New York Jets while Central Arkansas wide receiver Dezmin Lewis was selected 11 picks later in the seventh round (234 overall) by the Buffalo Bills.



FCS Championship Game, Sam Houston State

Coaching legends such as Eddie Robinson, Bobby Bowden, Jim Tressel, Mack Brown and Tubby Raymond and all led programs at FCS institutions during their outstanding careers.

With an expansion to 24 teams in 2013, the NCAA Division I Football Championship annually gives the FCS a superb on-the-field playoff event, culminating with a week-long celebration in Frisco, Texas. The Division I Football Championship is proving to be one of the NCAA's premiere postseason events. Frisco has played host to the game for the last three seasons and will be home to the championship game through at least the 2015 season after receiving a three-year extension in the offseason.

Since 1982, the Southland Conference, which has been based in Frisco since 2006, has been a proud and prominent member of the FCS, and has an annual expectation of competing for the Division I national championship and placing multiple teams into postseason play. In addition to winning one Division I title, the Southland has also placed teams in eight National Championship Games, including in 2011 and 2012 when Sam Houston State and North Dakota State met. As a conference, the Southland has won 54 Division I playoff games.

The Southland is one of 11 prestigious leagues that earn automatic qualification into the Division I Football Championship, a group that includes the Big Sky, Big South, Missouri Valley Football, Mid-Eastern Athletic, Northeast, Ohio Valley and Southern conference as well as the Colonial Athletic Association and the Patriot and Pioneer leagues.

Southland Schedule Moves to Nine Conference Games

After playing eight conference games in 2014, the Southland Conference has increased its league schedule to nine league games. With 11 football playing teams, every team will play nine games this season except Houston Baptist, which will only play eight due to the odd number of teams. This season, each team will miss only one opponent on its schedule, except HBU, which will miss two opponents. The lone team playing eight games will be on a rotating basis, which means HBU will not be the team playing eight league games each season. The Huskies will not play McNeese State or Northwestern State this season. The other teams not facing one another are Abilene Christian and Nicholls, Central Arkansas and UIW, Lamar and Stephen F. Austin, and Sam Houston State and Southeastern Louisiana.

Northwestern State, Southeastern Louisiana Open Conference Play Sept. 3

Northwestern State will host Southeastern Louisiana Thursday, Sept. 3, to open up the 2015 Southland Conference football season. The game, which will be televised on the American Sports Network, will kickoff at 6 p.m., CT. It will mark the first time in Northwestern State's Division I history (since 1977) that the Demons will open the season with a conference game. It will also be the first time since 1976 that the Lions have started the season with a league foe. The all-time series between the two in-state rivals is knotted at 29-29. The Lions have won the last three contests, including a 30-22 decision in Hammond in 2014. Southeastern Louisiana is 25-13 over the last three seasons under coach Ron Roberts while Northwestern State is 12-12 over the last two seasons under coach Jay Thomas.

Ten Southland Teams Take to the Field on Opening Weekend

Including the conference game between Northwestern State and Southeastern Louisiana, two other Southland teams will take to the field on the opening Thursday night of the season. Central Arkansas will travel to Southern Conference opponent Samford while Abilene Christian will go out west to take on Fresno State from the Mountain West Conference. The Bears' game time is to be determined while the Wildcats will start at 9 p.m. CT. On Saturday, six more Southland schools will begin their 2015 campaign. UIW will get things going at 2 p.m. when it hosts Texas A&M-Kingsville followed by a 6 p.m. start between Stephen F. Austin and Northern Arizona on ESPN3 in Nacogdoches. McNeese State will then travel to Baton Rouge to face LSU at 6:30 p.m. on the SEC Network. Two more games will begin at 7 p.m. when Houston Baptist hosts Bethany College and Lamar welcomes Bacone College. Sam Houston State is the final Southland team to take the field on Sept. 5, when the Bearkats visit Texas Tech in a game that has not finalized its kickoff. Nicholls begins the season with its bye week and will begin play the next week when the Colonels play at Louisiana-Monroe at 6 p.m. on ESPN3.

Sam Houston State, Southeastern Louisiana Share 2014 Football Title

For the second consecutive season, Southeastern Louisiana claimed the Southland Conference Football regular-season title, sharing the honors with Sam Houston State, which won its third title in four years. Both Southeastern and Sam Houston finished the regular season with a 7-1 conference record with the Lions reeling of its last three league games and the Bearkats, which started the season 1-3, winning their last five conference games. Both teams finished two games ahead of Stephen F. Austin, Lamar and Central Arkansas, which all tied for third with a 5-3 mark. After sharing the regular-season title, both Sam Houston State and Southeastern Louisiana were set to make another postseason trip, the fourth in a row for the Bearkats and second straight appearance for the Lions.

Southland Sends Three Teams to FCS Playoffs

The Southland Conference placed three teams in the 2014 playoffs for the second straight year and fifth time overall with Sam Houston State, Southeastern Louisiana and Stephen F. Austin. Southeastern Louisiana and Sam Houston State headed into Selection Sunday as co-champions of the league, all but assuring both teams an invite to the 24-team field for the playoffs. However, with the teams not playing each other in the regular season, the conference foes were paired up in the first round of the FCS playoffs in a de facto conference championship game. In the postseason, Sam Houston State got the better end of Southeastern Louisiana, 21-17. The Lumberjacks, who appeared in their seventh playoff appearance and first since 2010, opened on the road at Northern Iowa and fell to the Panthers 44-10. The league also placed three teams in the playoffs in 2013 (McNeese State, Sam Houston State and Southeastern Louisiana), 1998 (Northwestern State, McNeese and Troy), 1993 (McNeese, Stephen F. Austin and Louisiana-Monroe) and 1988 (Northwestern State, Stephen F. Austin and North Texas). The league has placed multiple Southland teams in the playoffs each of the last four seasons and five of the last six.

Sam Houston State Reaches FCS Semifinals

After defeating Southeastern Louisiana in the opening round of the FCS playoffs, Sam Houston State used the momentum to make another deep run into the postseason. In the second round, the Bearkats traveled to No. 3 Jacksonville State and defeated the Gamecocks 37-36 to set up a quarterfinal matchup at No. 6 Villanova. Sam Houston State scored late in the game and held off a Wildcat final effort to defeat Villanova, 34-31, and reach the semifinals for the third time in four years. The Bearkats' luck would run out in the next round, having to travel to No. 2 North Dakota State, the eventual national champion. Sam Houston State fell to the Bison, 35-3. The previous two time Sam Houston faced North Dakota State in the postseason was in the 2012 and 2013 championship game with the Bison taking the title both times.

Bearkats Dominate Preseason All-League Teams

Sam Houston State dominated the all-conference teams by placing 13 student-athletes among the two squads. The Bearkats had seven players earn first-team honors with quarterback Jared Johnson, offensive lineman Donald Jackson III, placekicker Luc Swimberghe, defensive end P.J. Hall, linebacker Myke Chatman, defensive back Trenier Orr and punter Lachlan Edwards. Southeastern Louisiana and Abilene Christian placed eight on the preseason teams followed by Central Arkansas and Northwestern State with six players. Lamar had five while McNeese State and Stephen F. Austin had four players. UIW was the remaining team with multiple selections with two while Houston Baptist and Nicholls complete the teams with one each.

Three Award Winners Return

Three of the Southland Conference's individual award winners from last year are back this season, including Central Arkansas senior defensive end Jonathan Woodard, the league's defensive player of the year, along with Stephen F. Austin junior quarterback Zach Conque, the conference's newcomer of the year, and Sam Houston State sophomore defensive end P.J. Hall, the freshman of the year a season

Nicholls Begins Season Under New Leadership

Tim Rebowe was named head football coach at Nicholls State University on Nov. 21, 2014. Rebowe, a 51-year old native of Norco, La., is the 10th head coach in the program's history. Rebowe, who coached at Louisiana-Lafayette as an assistant for 11 seasons and was a former assistant coach at Nicholls for six years, not only brings a wealth of experience coaching at the collegiate level, but has strong ties to the state of Louisiana having coached within the borders his entire career. Nicholls will be Rebowe's first head coaching position. The Colonels are coming off an 0-12 season and are looking to snap an 1-game losing skid.

Frisco Will Host FCS Title Game for Sixth Straight Year

Before the 2013 championship game, the NCAA agreed to a three-year extension with Frisco, Texas, for the Division I Football Championship title game to be held at Toyota Stadium and hosted by the Southland Conference, the city of Frisco and the Hunt Sports Group. Frisco has hosted the last five FCS title games and the 2016 championship game will be the sixth straight year of it being held in Frisco.

Twelve Games Scheduled vs. FBS in 2015

A year after playing 13 games against teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision, Southland teams will face 12 such opponents in 2015. With the conference schedule moving to nine games, open dates to schedule non-conference opponents were limited to just two weekends. The league has 22 wins against FBS teams since 2000, including two last year when Abilene Christian knocked off Sun Belt opponent Troy 38-35 and Northwestern State defeating in-state foe Louisiana Tech from Conference USA, 30-27. Nicholls and Northwestern State are the only two Southland teams to play multiple FBS opponents with the Colonels traveling to Louisiana-Monroe and Colorado while the Demons visit Louisiana-Lafayette and Mississippi State. In 2015, the Southland will play teams from the Big 12, Southeastern, Pacific 12, Mountain West, Conference USA, Mid-American and Sun Belt conferences.

CAREER RECORD 19-15 (THREE SEASONS)

RECORD AT SCHOOL 19-15 (THREE SEASONS)

The 2015 season will mark Ken Collums' fourth season as the 19th head football coach in Abilene Christian history.

In 2014 – ACU's first season as a full member of the Southland Conference at the NCAA Division I FCS level – Collums led ACU to a 6-6 overall record and a 4-4 conference mark. ACU finished tied for fifth in the league after a seasonending 37-35 road win over 24th-ranked Stephen F. Austin.

Collums coached sophomore quarterback Parker McKenzie to a spectacular season in his first year as the starter. McKenzie threw for 3,084 yards and 22 touchdowns, earning honorable mention all-conference honors and becoming the fourth ACU quarterback under Collums' tutelage to throw for more than 3,000 yards in a season.

The Wildcats were again one of the best teams in the conference and in the nation in turnover ratio as ACU was plus-9 in the category (16 turnovers and 25 takeaways). The Wildcats were among conference leaders in points per game (32.7 ppg), yards per game (438.0 ypg), passing yards per game (275.3 ypg) and rushing yards per game (162.7 ypg).

In his first season as the head coach (2012), Collums led the Wildcats to a 7-4 record in their final season as a member of NCAA Division II and the Lone Star Conference.

In 2013 – ACU's first season at the NCAA Division I FCS level – Collums' offense was one of the nation's most prolific. While he gave up play-calling duties to offensive coordinator Nathan Young, Collums still had an impact on the design and implementation of game plans and play calls each week.

Collums – the FootballScoop.com D2 Coordinator of the Year in 2010 – served as the offensive coordinator at ACU from 2005-11, directing some of the most exciting and dominant offensive units in NCAA Division II history.

Since he re-joined the ACU coaching staff prior to the 2005 season, Collums' offenses have ranked among the best in the nation. The Wildcats have ranked in the top seven in NCAA Division II football in total offense five times in the last eight years, including first in 2008, second in 2007, third in 2011 and fourth in 2006. The pass offense has ranked third twice and sixth twice, and the rushing offense has ranked as high as ninth in the nation (2008).

As a freshman at Central Arkansas, Collums led the Bears to the 1991 NAIA national championship. In four seasons as the starting quarterback, he directed his team to a combined record of 30-8-3. Collums graduated from Central Arkansas in 1995 with a B.S. in kinesiology.

He and his wife, Robyn, have two children.

STORYLINES

- The UCA Bears open the season with three road games and an open date before finally playing their first home game of the season on October 3. Included in the opening month are games at Samford, Oklahoma State and the Southland opener at Northwestern State.
- UCA must replace record-setting wide receiver Dezmin Lewis, a seventh-round draft pick of the Buffalo Bills, as well as Cole Caruthers, the Southland Offensive Lineman of the Year.

OFFENSE

- UCA returns three of its top four receivers from 2014, including juniors Desmond Smith (46 for 616, 7 TDs), Jatavious Wilson (40-415, 1TD) and Courtney Whitehead (40-415, 4 TD).
- Returning senior QB Taylor Reed completed 64.7 percent of his passes as a part-time starter in 2014.

DEFENSE

- The Bears return the Southland Defensive Player of the Year in senior end Jonathan Woodard. Woodard is second in UCA history in sacks with 25.0, just five behind the leader.
- UCA returns its Nos. 2-9 tacklers from 2014, including No. 2 DB George Odum (77 tackles), No. 3 LB Ricky Wyatt (16 TFL) and No. 4 DB Bobby Watkins (3 INT).

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Junior Jatavious Wilson was second in the Southland Conference in kickoff returns, averaging 24.8 yards per return, with a 91-yard touchdown.
- Wilson is No. 1 in season kick return yards (1,140, 2014) and No. 2 in career kick return yards at UCA (1,721). His three career TD returns is a school record.

Coach Steve Campbell, just the third head football coach at the University of Central Arkansas in the past 33 years, brought a new excitement to the program when he arrived prior to the 2014 season. He also brought an established winning tradition and an impressive resume to Conway. He led the Bears to a 6-6 record in his first season with a new coaching staff and against a brutal schedule.

Under Campbell's direction, the Bears led the Southland Conference in scoring at 40.7 points per game, were No. 2 in passing offense (282.2) and scored more than 45 points four times, including victories margins of 70-0, 52-18 and 58-35.

Campbell has won three national championships at three different schools, as a player and coach. Campbell was an All-Conference center when Troy State won an NCAA Division II national championship in 1987. As head coach at Delta State University, Campbell won another D-II national title in 2000. Campbell then coached MGCCC to the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) championship in 2007.

Campbell, who played at Southeastern Louisiana and Troy, began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Auburn University in 1988-89 under legendary coach Pat Dye, then went to Delta State as offensive line coach and offensive coordinator from 1990-92. Campbell was offensive coordinator at Nicholls State and then running backs coach and head coach at Southwest (Mississippi) Community College before taking over the Delta State program as head coach in 1999. The Statesmen went 27-8 during Campbell's tenure, including a 14-1 national championship season in 2000. DSU beat UCA 52-21 in Conway that year.

Campbell was named the AFCA National Coach of the Year following that championship season. The Statesmen set D-II championship game records of 63 points, 649 yards and 36 first downs in the 63-34 win over Bloomsberg University.

From there, Campbell was offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Middle Tennessee State in 2002, and offensive line coach under Jackie Sherrill at Mississippi State in 2003. He took over at MGCSS in 2004 and won three state juco championships and led the Bulldogs to seven straight postseason trips. MGCCC has finished ranked in the NJCAA Top 10 for eight consecutive seasons and has been nationally ranked for 115 straight weeks.

Under Campbell, the program produced 28 NJCAA All-Americans, 17 Academic All-Americans. Fifteen Bulldogs signed with four-year colleges after the 2013 season, including the No. 1 ranked junior college player in the nation.

Vic Shealy was named the first head football coach in Houston Baptist University history on April 9, 2012. Shealy won an NAIA national championship while head coach at Azusa Pacific University, and served as defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of Kansas in 2010 and 2011.

In HBU's first official season in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) and the Southland Conference in 2014, Shealy and the Huskies went 2-9 overall and 1-8 in league play. HBU's first official win came in a 72-6 road victory at Texas College on Sept. 20. The Huskies registered their first Southland win on Homecoming, defeating Nicholls, 31-21, on Oct. 25. Five student-athletes earned all-conference honors, including two second-team selections, one academic all-conference honoree and one tabbed Freshman All-America.

In 2013, the Huskies took the field for the first time, playing a seven-game developmental season and going 3-4 (record does not count toward Shealy's career total). HBU saw several bright spots in its first campaign, averaging 24.4 points per game with a balanced attack of 165.9 rushing yards per game and 161.3 passing yards per game. Running back B.J. Kelly, defensive back Taylor Thompson, and punter David Dunkin each earned national recognition.

Shealy served as defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Kansas in 2011 and was the secondary coach for the Jayhawks in 2010. He was the defensive coordinator at Richmond in 2009 and at Austin Peay in 1994. At UNLV, he was the assistant head coach from 2005-08, after serving as secondary coach at Air Force from 1999-2004. Shealy was also assistant head coach at Austin Peay from 1988-89.

Shealy was the head coach at Azusa Pacific from 1995-98, leading the Cougars to the NAIA national championship in his final season. He posted an overall record of 27-14-1 at Azusa Pacific, including a 12-2 record during the championship run. Shealy was named NAIA Coach of the Year and the Shutt National Coach of the Year in 1998.

While at Richmond, the Spiders were ranked No. 1 nationally for seven weeks and ranked ninth in scoring defense en route to an 11-2 season. Shealy helped Air Force to a pair of bowl appearances in the Silicon Valley Bowl in 2000 and the San Francisco Bowl in 2002. He also appeared with Baylor in the Liberty Bowl in 1985 and has seen six of his former players go on to careers in the National Football League.

Shealy earned a Bachelor of Science in physical education from Richmond in 1984, then a Master of Education in physical education from Baylor in 1986.

From the moment he came on board at UIW in mid-December of 2011, Larry Kennan has had a major, positive effect on the Cardinals football program. He has provided leadership and direction to a program in the transitional phase of Division I and the results are starting to play out on the field.

It only took Kennan two seasons to show a significant upgrade in the product on the field for UIW. The 2013 season proved to be the most successful in the program's short history. A 6-5 record, the first winning season for the program, and a few milestone victories along the way made it a season to remember.

The 2013 Cardinals posted the first two shutouts in school history and accumulated more school records along the way than can be reasonably written down. The two biggest wins of the season came on the road at McMurry when the team battled back from an 11-point fourth quarter deficit to win 47-43 and give Kennan his first road victory at UIW. The next came the following week at home when the Cardinals came back from a 10-point fourth quarter deficit to defeat Abilene Christian, 34-31.

The 2014 season was one that went bad from the start with the loss of starting quarterback Trent Brittain in the first quarter of the first game to a season-ending injury. An already daunting schedule that included national champion North Dakota State plus three other playoff teams became nearly untenable.

Kennan started four different quarterbacks during the season before finally settling on Jordan Scelfo. Scelfo provided the team some stability over the final four weeks of the season when the team played their best ball of the year.

Kennan patrolled the sidelines in 2012 for the first time since 1997, however he remained close to the game during that time. He was executive director of the NFL Coaches Association based in Washington, D.C. for the 13 years prior to becoming the head coach of the Cardinals.

The Cardinals were only 2-9 in Kennan's first year at the helm, but there were a number of firsts for the program. The "Forever First" class completed their eligibility and the 2012 class set a record with 25 seniors.

He has been an NFL offensive coordinator, a quarterbacks coach, a tight ends coach and a wide receivers coach. He owns a championship ring from the Los Angeles Raiders Super Bowl XVIII win. He was the head coach of the London Monarchs when they won a World Football League championship in 1991.

RECORD AT SCHOOL 26-32 (FIVE SEASONS)

Ray Woodard has been at the helm of the Lamar football program since its resurrection six years ago -- a program that has seen incredible growth under Woodard's direction. Since an impressive five-win campaign in its first season back, Cardinals' fans have been witness to the consistent growth of the program -- a growth that has come at an accelerated rate over the course of the past two seasons.

As if trying to make a statement in the 2013 season-opener, the Cardinals set nine school records in the game --which would be a sample of things to come. Lamar set or tied nearly 50 team and individual records in 2013 and had three players receive All-America honors. In addition to the three All-Americans, Lamar also had a record 10 players named to the All-Southland Conference team, including three first-team selections. Freshman running back Kade Harrington was named Southland Freshman of the Year, while senior defensive end Jesse Dickson was named league defensive player of the year by CollegeSportsMadness.com.

Woodard's young charges continued the record-setting pace in 2014, which was capped by Lamar tying a school record for wins as a four-year program. Adding to the excitement of the eight-win season, Lamar picked up the record-setting victory at rival McNeese State on a field goal with seconds remaining. The win was Lamar's first against McNeese and against a nationally-ranked opponent since the sport's return.

For Lamar, the 2013 and 2014 seasons stand as the most successful two-year stretch since the program won 13 games between 1973 and 1974. In addition to the big wins and record-setting performances, more than 20 Cardinals have been named All-Southland Conference, including five All-Americans. To cap off the Cardinals' success on the gridiron three players received invites to NFL camps.

All told, Woodard has produced 37 All-Southland selections, including four first-team players, five All-Americans -- including one Freshman All-American -- one CFPA National Punter Returner of the Year, one league Newcomer of the Year, one league freshman of the year and a conference student-athlete of the year.

Woodard's troops have made a habit of rewriting the LU record books during his time in Beaumont. In 2011, the Cardinals set seven individual and six team records. The 2011 season marked the first year Lamar was able to compete as a full member of the Southland Conference and Woodard guided the Cards to a pair of conference road wins on their way to a 4-7 overall record and a 2-5 league mark.

STORYLINES

- Quarterback Daniel Sams appears to be the man behind center heading into the 2015 season. Sams led the team in rushing with 711 yards on 104 carries and completed 46 of 97 passes for 624 yards in playing part-time.
- The Cowboys will look to replace three of their starting defensive linemen with first-team all-conference picks Kevin Dorn, Sean Brown and Everett Ellefsen. Those three combined for eight sacks and 19 tackles for a loss during the season while holding opponents to 112.5 yards rushing per game.

OFFENSE

- Cowboys return all four running backs, including sophomore Ryan Ross, who ranked second on the team with 599 yards rushing and seven TDs last season as a true freshman. Senior Derrick Milton ran for 387 yards, senior Kelvin Bennett 354 and senior Dylan Long 346.
- Combined, McNeese returns a group of backs that rushed for 2,397 yards and 27 TDs in 2014.

DEFENSE

 The DBs will be led by senior Brent Spikes, who led the Cowboys with 83 tackles and four pass interceptions last season while his 156 pass interception return yards set a new school singleseason record.

SPECIAL TEAMS

• Punter and place kicker Jean Breaux returns for his senior season and is on the verge of rewritting the McNeese record book. The Cowboys will debut a new full-time field goal kicker and PAT guy with the loss of Alex Kjellsten who transferred to another school. Breaux was 2-for-3 in FGs last season. Redshirt freshman Trent Manuel will be in the running as the field goal kicker.

RECORD AT SCHOOL 68-32 (NINE SEASONS)

One of the most successful coaches in the NCAA's FCS division, McNeese's Matt Viator has guided the Cowboys to winning seasons in all nine of his years at the helm and is one of three head coaches in school history to never post a losing season, joining Les DeVall (1957-65) and Ernie Duplechin (1979-81).

He's the only coach in Southland Conference history to have a winning season each year in his career with a minimum of nine seasons under his belt.

In his nine seasons, Viator has compiled a 68-32 record for a winning percentage of .680, passing legendary head coach Jack Doland last season as the No. 2 winningest coach in school history. He needs 10 wins to tie leader Bobby Keasler (78 wins). He's recorded a league mark of 45-18 (.714), has won three conference championships and made four FCS playoff appearances, including a second round showing in 2013.

That 2013 season saw the Cowboys post its second 10-win regular season under Viator, eighth in school history, when they finished 10-3, including a 6-1 mark in the conference. For the second consecutive year, McNeese defeated an FBS opponent when it handled South Florida 53-21. It was the first win for McNeese over a BCS conference opponent.


That win set an NCAA record, and the 53 points scored by the Cowboys were the most scored by a FCS squad over a BCS team. The 32-point margin of victory was also an NCAA record.

As a result of the team's success, Viator was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award as the FCS National Coach of the Year. It was the third time in his career to be named a finalist (2006, 2007).

The 2014 Cowboys appeared to be well on their way to another playoff appearance and possible championship as they cruised to a 6-2 record through the first eight games. Injuries then struck the Cowboys as they went on to lose their final three games of the season. It was the first three-game skid since 2011.

The Cowboy coach, a graduate of McNeese, had served as an assistant coach on the staff for eight years before stepping into the top job four games deep into the 2006 season. Taking over a squad that had won one of its first four games, he led the team to a 6-2 record the rest of the way that year, won the SLC title and put his team into the NCAA championship playoffs.

Viator is the 14th head coach in McNeese history.





ABOUT THE COLONELS



STORYLINES

- Nicholls will begin a new era under Tim Rebowe, who officially became the Colonels' 10th head coach in program history on Nov. 21, 2014.
- The Colonels are coming off their second winless campaign in program history. The team went 0-11 in 1995, but put together one of the best turnarounds in FCS history, going 8-4 in the next season which included an appearance in the playoffs.

OFFENSE

- While the Colonels lose both QBs from last season, returning to the offense is redshirt junior Tuskani Figaro. Before redshirting last season, Figaro received the majority of the snaps in 2013, going on to pass and rush for more than 1,000 yards.
- For the first time in program history, Nicholls will have two 1,000-yard rushers in the same backfield. After Figaro accomplished the feat in 2013, running back Michael Henry became the third Colonel in program history to surpass 1,000 yards after rushing for 1,005 yards last season.

DEFENSE

• The Colonels return three of their top four tacklers from last season. Linebacker Kameryon Brown is the leading returning tackler with 89 stops in 2014, followed by safety B.T. Sanders (79) and linebacker Ronnie Walker (76). Sanders tied defensive back Josh Singleton, who also returns, for the team-high with two interceptions last season, while Walker recorded a team-best five tackles for loss.

SPECIAL TEAMS

• The Colonels will need to replace a huge void in their return game with the loss of Keenan Canty, who earned All-Southland honorable mention as an allpurpose player. Along with finishing third on the team in receiving, Canty handled all the punt return duties and fielded 55 of the Colonels' 71 kick returns.

Tim Rebowe was named head football coach at Nicholls State University on Nov. 21, 2014.

Rebowe, a 51-year old native of Norco, La., is the 10th head coach in the program's history. Rebowe, who coached at Louisiana-Lafayette as an assistant for 11 seasons and was a former assistant coach at Nicholls for six years, not only brings a wealth of experience coaching at the collegiate level, also has strong ties to the state of Louisiana having coached within the borders his entire career.

Rebowe helped lead the Ragin' Cajun program to four consecutive New Orleans Bowl victories and a conference championship under head coach Mark Hudspeth. During his tenure at ULL, Rebowe has served as the safeties coach (2004-07, 2011-14) and linebackers coach (2008-10).

Last season, ULL's defense ranked first in the Sun Belt in rushing yards allowed and red zone defense, while ranking second in points allowed. The defense finished with seven interceptions on the year, including two by cornerback Corey Trim, who was named All-Sun Belt Second Team Defense.

Under Rebowe's tutelage in 2013, the Cajuns tied for the conference lead with 14 interceptions.

Rebowe's group had a stellar year in his first season as defensive backs coach in 2004 as the defense ranked 11th in the nation in passing yards allowed. Both of his starting safeties that year, C.C. Brown and Antwain Spann, would go on to the NFL. The following season, the pass defense finished 23rd in the nation in yards allowed.

As a linebackers coach, Rebowe guided the team's leading tackler in all three seasons and also had two players earn All-Sun Belt recognition.

In 1995, Rebowe took his first collegiate job, joining Darren Barbier's staff at Nicholls. From '95-'99, he served as defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator before coaching the receivers in 2000. Rebowe was part of the biggest turnaround in FCS history as the Colonels went 0-11 in '95 before earning a playoff spot the very next season with an 8-4 mark.

Rebowe began his coaching career in 1988 at his alma mater, Destrehan High School. While at Destrehan, he coached future NFL Hall of Famer Ed Reed.

Following his stint with Nicholls, Rebowe coached the cornerbacks at ULM from 2001-03.

Rebowe earned his bachelor of science in physical education from LSU in 1987. He is married to the former Kim Robichaux and they have two children.

STORYLINES

- Northwestern State will open the season with a conference game (at home, Sept. 3 vs. Southeastern Louisiana) for the first time as a Division I FCS member.
- The Demons broke or tied 30 school records last season, including marks set by 2015 seniors Ed Eagan (6) and Chris Moore (4).

OFFENSE

- Northwestern State enters fall practice with half a dozen contenders to start at quarterback, including sophomore J.D. Almond and junior Daniel Hazlewood.
- NSU was second in the country with a 67.2 completion percentage in 2014, the first season with Ben Norton as offensive coordinator. But 2014 senior QB Zach Adkins threw all but seven of those 390 passes.

DEFENSE

- The Purple Swarm defense will have its fourth coordinator in four years with Daryl Daye making the call for the NSU defense this season.
- While only three starters are back from 2014 (safeties Adam Jones and Chase Collins, defensive end Leroy Armstrong), among their 25 defensive lettermen returning, the Demons have six players who started at least once last season, including 2013 Freshman All-American end JeMarcus Marshall.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- For the third straight season, the Demons have the same return specialist (All-American all-purpose player Ed Eagan), kicker (Chris Moore) and punter (Andy Wickman), all seniors.
- Eagan was second in FCS in all-purpose yardage at 180.5 per game, 17th in punt returns (10.0 average) and 36th in kickoff returns (23.2). He led the country in combined kick return yards (1,254).

CAREER RECORD 39-47 (8 SEASONS)

RECORD AT SCHOOL 12-12 (TWO SEASONS)

Jay Thomas has produced the best back-to-back seasons in a decade, and much more, for Northwestern State football during his first two years in charge of the Demons. As a result, he received a two-year contract extension and established the foundation for extended success.

A key: his deep knowledge of the Southland Conference gained through 16 seasons in the league, including six as head coach at Nicholls. He was finalist for national coach of the year honors in a 2005 playoff season by the Colonels.

Key No. 2: a rock-solid approach to every phase of the program, including a significant surge in academic performance with a 960 single-year APR for 2013-14 in the 2015 report. A combined 27 players graduated in NSU's two commencement exercises during 2014-15.

The Demons have restored the roar to the Purple Swarm defense while making significant rewrites to the NSU offensive record book, shattering 30 marks in 2014. Last year's season included noteworthy wins over Conference USA runner-up Louisiana Tech and FCS semifinalist and Southland co-champion Sam Houston State. Three one-score losses in league play and another in the season opener denied them a breakthrough season against a schedule ranked 10th strongest in the country.

Thomas, 54, had been defensive coordinator and assistant head coach in 2012 alongside his close friend Darryl Daye at Division II Missouri Southern in Joplin, following two seasons as the Demons' defensive line coach and assistant head coach in 2010 and 2011. Now they're together again as Daye returned to his home state this spring as the Demons' defensive coordinator and assistant head coach.

Previously, Thomas spent 14 seasons at Nicholls, the last six (2004-2009) as head coach. He had an overall 27-35 record that included Nicholls' only Southland Conference championship (2005 co-championship) and wins over four nationally-ranked teams and FBS foe Rice. His Colonels finished the 2005 season ranked 17th in the Sports Network's FCS Top 25, and reached a school-record high ranking of 13th in 2007.

During his tenure as head coach, Thomas instituted academic emphasis which resulted in the Nicholls team's APR improving from 746 to 930 over his five seasons.

Thomas guided Nicholls to a pair of winning seasons and a .500 record in a third season in a program that had only one season of .500 or better in the previous seven campaigns. His three .500 or better seasons gave Nicholls three of only four at that level in the past 14 years.

STORYLINES

- Sam Houston will kick off its 100th season of college football in 2015. Starting in 1912, the Bearkast missed playing only the war years in 1918 and 1943-45.
- K. C. Keeler is the only head football coach to take three different programs to the final four of the NCAA playoffs. Standing 33-11 in post-season games (14-4 in FCS playoffs), he holds the highest number of playoff wins by any current FCS head coach.

OFFENSE

- Sam Houston returns 5,830 yards of total offense (2,543 rushing, 3,287 passing) including players who had a hand in 45 touchdowns last year.
- Quarterback Jared Johnson set a Sam Houston record for most yards passing by a sophomore with 3,054 yards for 21 touchdowns. Johnson also rushed for 1,131 yards and six scores to post 4,267 yards total offense.

DEFENSE

- P. J. Hall, the Southland's Freshman of the Year in 2014, was the highest ranked defensive player in the voting for last year's Jerry Rice Award (FCS Player of the Year). He finished third. Hall totalled 29 tackles for loss, one short of the school season record.
- Cornerback Trenier Orr joined Hall as a first team All-Southland Conference defender in 2014. Orr was co-leader for the team with four interceptions including a 55-yard touchdown at EWU.

SPECIAL TEAMS

 Australian punter Lachlan Edwards earned FCS All-American and first team All-Southland Conference honors after leading the league and ranking No. 6 nationally with a 44.4 average. Edwards has posted punts of 50 or more yards 30 times including a career long of 70 yards.

RECORD AT SCHOOL 11-5 (ONE SEASON)

In his first season as head coach at Sam Houston, K. C. Keeler directed the Bearkats to an 11-5 record, the Southland Conference championship and the program's third NCAA FCS playoff semifinals appearance in the past four seasons.

During 21 years as a head football coach, Keeler has produced a record of 185 victories, only 78 losses and one tie. His teams at Rowan University, Delaware and Sam Houston State have combined for 12 NCAA post-season playoff appearances, eight conference championships and played in eight national championship games.

Keeler was named as Sam Houston's 15th head football coach on Jan., 23, 2014. He has coached five National Football League draft picks and has tutored 76 All-America players and 21 student-athletes who have earned either national or district CoSIDA Academic All-America honors.


The only head football coach to take three different programs to an NCAA playoff final four appearance, Keeler's 185 victories rank No. 20 among the 597 head coaches at all NCAA levels (FBS, FCS, Division II and III). He ranks 78th in victories among all college football coaches, past and present.

With a 33-11 won-lost record in 11 NCAA post-season playoff appearances, Keeler has directed his team to more national championship games (8) than any current football head coach. His teams at Rowan, Delaware and Sam Houston have combined to make 11 final four appearances. He has the highest number of post-season playoff wins and the highest post-season playoff winning percentage by any current FCS head coach.

As head coach at Delaware, Keeler rolled up an 86-52 record in 11 seasons from 2002 to 2012. His Fightin' Blue Hens won the FCS national championship in 2003 and reached the national championship game in 2007 and 2010. His squads won Atlantic 10 Conference titles in 2003 and 2004 and the Colonial Athletic Association championship in 2010. Delaware went 11-3 in the program's four trips to the FCS playoffs.

At Rowan University in Glassboro, N. J., Keeler produced an 88-21-1 record from 1993 to 2001 that included seven NCAA Division III playoff appearances including five trips to the National Championship game. His teams posted a 21-7 record in NCAA Division III playoff action.

Among Keeler's coaching honors are selections as AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year, Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year, Maxwell Club Tri-State Coach of the Year and the All-America Football Foundation Johnny Vaught Head Coach Award.

STORYLINES

• Southeastern will be looking to win its thirdstraight Southland Conference championship in 2015, after winning the league title outright in 2013 and sharing with Sam Houston State last season. The Lions have not won three straight conference championships since 1952-54 as members of the Gulf States Conference.

OFFENSE

- D'Shaie Landor enters fall as the top candidate to replace Bryan Bennett. After transferring from Louisiana-Lafayette, Landor played in seven games as a reserve and rushed for three touchdowns in 2014.
- Jeff Smiley, who finished with 39 catches for 601 yards and seven touchdowns in 2014, is the top returner in the Lion receiving corps. The Lion pass catching group will be bolstered by the return of Isaiah Kepley, who missed all of 2014 with an injury, and the addition of transfer Brandon Acker.

DEFENSE

- The Lions return 22 letterwinners from a defense that led the Southland Conference in scoring and total defense in 2014.
- The majority of the key players in the SLU secondary return after helping the Lions lead the FCS in pass defensive efficiency. The top returner in the back end is Harlan Miller, a returning All-American. Miller is one of four returning All-Southland defensive backs for the Lions, along with Denzel Thompson, Micah Eugene and Jordan Batiste.

• Xavier Roberson returns after earning All-American kick returner honors for the second straight season. The dynamic playmaker was the third in the nation with a 30.8 kickoff return average in 2014.

RECORD AT SCHOOL 25-13 (THREE SEASONS)

In just three years at the helm of the Southeastern Louisiana football program, head coach Ron Roberts has helped the Lions reach new heights.

In his first three seasons, Roberts has led the Lions to a 25-13 overall record and a 19-3 Southland mark. In 2013, Roberts was named the Southland Conference, AFCA Region 5 and Louisiana Coach of the Year and was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, given to the top coach in the FCS.

The 2014 Lions repeated as Southland Conference champions, sharing the regular season title with Sam Houston State, who defeated SLU in the first round of the playoffs. Senior linebacker Isiah Corbett, junior defensive back Harlan Miller and junior kick returner Xavier Roberson earned All-America honors for a Lion team that finished the season ranked 12th and 14th in the final Football Championship Subdivision polls.

For the third straight season under Roberts, the Lions swept in-state Southland Conference opponents Northwestern State, McNeese State and Nicholls. SLU also picked up conference wins over UIW, HBU, Central Arkansas and Lamar on the way to its second straight league title.

Under Roberts, the 2013 Lions won their first Southland Conference championship and their first league title of any kind since 1961. Southeastern finished with an 11-3 overall record and 7-0 mark in league play, earning its first FCS playoff berth and the No. 4 national seed. The single-season school record victory total propelled the Lions to a No. 6 ranking in the final FCS Coaches and Sports Network polls.

In his inaugural season in Hammond, Roberts guided Southeastern to a 5-6 record, which equaled the combined wins by the Lions in 2010-11. Southeastern's 5-2 record in Southland Conference action in 2012 marked the most wins in conference play since 1978.

Named the 16th head coach in school history on Dec.19, 2011, Roberts brought a proven record of success to Hammond after a successful five-year tenure at Division II Delta State University.

At DSU, Roberts led the Statesmen to a 47-16 record, four 10-win seasons and two NCAA Super Region II titles that included an appearance in the 2010 NCAA Division II national championship game and the 2011 semifinals.

Prior to joining DSU, Roberts served one season as head coach at Mount Whitney (Calif.) HS, and the 2003 season as defensive coordinator at Texas State. He has also spent time at Tusculum College, Greensboro College and Burroughs High School (Calif.).



Clint Conque enters his second season as the Lumberjacks' head coach, already setting a precedent for the success of SFA football.

In his first season in Nacogdoches, Conque led SFA to an 8-5 record, a five-win improvement from 2013, as the 2014 squad became the 13th team in program history to reach the eight-win plateau. Picked to finish sixth in the preseason Southland Conference standings, SFA went 5-3 in league play, including wins at sixth-ranked McNeese State and against eighth-ranked Southeasten Louisiana, tying for third in the conference standings.

SFA cracked the FCS Coaches Poll Top-25 twice in 2014, marking the first time the Lumberjacks had been ranked in the nation's top-25 since 2010. Conque helped guide the 'Jacks to their first NCAA playoff appearance since 2010, earning Southland Coach of the Year honors for the third time in his career and was a finalist for the FCS Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year for the fourth time.

Under Conque's guidance, senior running back Gus Johnson had the best rushing season in program history, setting six SFA rushing records as well as setting the Southland Conference record for rushing yards in a season. Johnson was named the conference player of the year and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award while sophomore quarterback Zach Conque was named the Southland Newcomer of the Year.

Conque brought to Nacogdoches an impressive coaching resume built on success, posting an overall career record of 105-59 during his 14 seasons as the head coach at Central Arkansas. He departs as the all-time winningest coach in Bear program history while becoming just the second collegiate head coach in the state of Arkansas to amass 100 career victories, sitting behind legendary Razorback coach Frank Broyles.

Central Arkansas established itself as one of the top teams both regionally and nationally during Conque's tenure, capturing the Southland Conference title in 2008 and 2012, advancing to the FCS playoffs in both 2011 and 2012.

During the eight seasons in which Central Arkansas competed in the Southland Conference, Conque has posted a 33-16 record in Southland play (.673), being named the Southland's Coach of the Year in 2008 and 2012 in addition to the same honor in 2005. The NCAA FCS Region 5 Coach of the Year in 2008, Conque has also been a three-time finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year award with his teams boasting seven top-25 finishes since 2001.

SOUTHEASTERN LA., SAM HOUSTON SHARE FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

For the second consecutive season, Southeastern Louisiana claimed the Southland Conference Football regularseason title, sharing the honors with Sam Houston State, which won its third title in four years. Both Southeastern and Sam Houston finished the regular season with a 7-1 conference record with the Lions reeling of its last three league games and the Bearkats, which started the season 1-3, winning their last five conference games. Both teams finished two games ahead of Stephen F. Austin, Lamar and Central Arkansas, which all tied for third with a 5-3 mark.

Southeastern Louisiana and Sam Houston State headed into Selection Sunday as co-champions of the league, all but assuring both teams an invite to the 24-team field for the playoffs. However, with the teams not playing each other in the regular season, the conference foes were paired up in the first round of the FCS playoffs in a de facto conference championship game. In the postseason, Sam Houston State got the better end of Southeastern Louisiana, 21-17, in Huntsville. The Bearkats used that momentum to make a run deep in the postseason by defeating No. 3 seed Jacksonville State 37-36 in the second round followed by the quarterfinal win at No. 6 Villanova, 34-31. Sam Houston's hopes to make its third national championship game in four years halted in the semifinals when it fell to eventual national champion No. 2 North Dakota State, 35-3.

For the second year in a row and the sixth time in conference history, the Southland sent three teams to the postseason with Stephen F. Austin also earning an at-large bid. It was the Lumberjacks' seventh playoff appearance and first since 2010. SFA opened on the road at Northern lowa, the only team to defeat North Dakota State since 2012, and fell to the Panthers 44-10.

The Lions and Bearkats dominated the all-conference teams, claiming 20 of the 58 spots on the two teams. The Lions landed five players on the first team, including senior quarterback Bryan Bennett, the league's offensive player of the year. The Bearkats placed a league-high six players on the first team with defensive end P.J. Hall, the freshman of the year, leading the way. Stephen F. Austin senior running back Gus Johnson was named player of the year while SFA sophomore quarterback Zach Conque was newcomer of the year and head coach Clint Conque was coach of the year. Johnson set the Lumberiack and Southland Conference single-season rushing record with 1.683 yards while racking up 23 rushing touchdowns, a SFA program record. Rounding out the individual conference honors, Central Arkansas defensive end Jonathan Woodard was named the league's defensive player of the year and teammate Cole Carruthers was tabbed offensive lineman of the year.

Additionally, four Southland players earned first-team All-America honors including Johnson, Carruthers, Northwestern State defensive back Imoan Claiborne and Southeastern Louisiana defensive tackle Marquel Combs.

Southeastern Louisiana senior linebacker Isiah Corbett was named the Southland Conference Football Student-Athlete of the Year. Corbett, a first-time all-academic selection, is the first Southeastern Louisiana player to be named the Southland football student-athlete of the year. Corbett is two-time dean's list recipient and graduated in December with a 3.24 grade-point average in general studies.

A native of Belle Glade, Fla., Corbett was a first-team all-conference selections after leading the league's top defense with 12 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks and four interceptions. The Lions allowed only 17.4 points per game and 295.2 yards per game, both of which led the league. Corbett was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award, which is given annually to the top defender in FCS. Corbett started all 12 games for the Lions and had 65 total tackles, including 35 solo.

Ten of the 11 Southland football member institutions are represented on the all-academic team with Central Arkansas and UIW both recording a conference-best four members. Lamar, Sam Houston State and Southeastern Louisiana each had three selections, while Abilene Christian and Stephen F. Austin had two members. Houston Baptist, McNeese State and Nicholls had one representative apiece.

There were 11 automatic selections on the Southland all-academic team. To be an automatic selection, a student-athlete must be a first-team All-Southland Conference honoree, a Capital One CoSIDA Academic All-District selection or named to the FCS Athletic Directors Association Academic All-Star Team, which was announced this week leading up to the national championship game.

The Southland had five CoSIDA selections with Lamar sophomore running back Kade Harrington, Southeastern Louisiana junior offensive lineman Joe Graves and senior defensive lineman Jacob Newman, UIW junior linebacker Padyn Giebler and Abilene Christian senior defensive back Angel Lopez. Graves and Newman were named to the All-District 6 Team while Wick, Giebler and Lopez earned a spot on the All-District 7 Team.

Two players were named to the FCS ADA Academic All-Star Team this season with Southeastern Louisiana's Graves and Lamar senior quarterback Caleb Berry. Graves posted a 3.83 GPA in chemistry while Berry boasted a 3.50 in educational technology leadership.



SOUTHLAND IN THE NFL

One of the premiere leagues in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision, the Southland Conference continues to emerge as a breeding ground for the future stars of the National Football League. From groundbreaking players such as Pro Football Hall of Famer Fred Dean to the league's newest crop of first-year hopefuls, the conference boasts a rich tradition of sending impact players to the NFL.

For each of the Southland's NFL-bound alumni, professional success starts in the classrooms and on the gridiron of the league's 11 active competing universities.

In the 2013 NFL Draft, another Southland player was selected to join the league as Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Robert Alford was picked in the second round (60th overall) by the Atlanta Falcons. Alford became the first Lion player ever to be drafted in the NFL and the league's highest draft pick since Stephen F. Austin's Mikhael Ricks was selected 59th overall by the San Diego Chargers in 1998.

A total of 15 former Southland Conference players appeared on NFL rosters heading into 2015 training camp. The Southland is one of five FCS conferences with at least 200 selections (208) in the NFL draft.

The Southland Conference led all FCS conferences with four selections in the 2009 draft and sent 11 players into preseason camps that summer. Only in 2002, when five players were among the more than 250 selections, were more Southland alumni drafted in the same season this decade.

Former Sam Houston State quarterback Josh McCown is the conference's most experienced alumni in the NFL. Northwestern State's Terrance McGee completed 13 seasons in the NFL, with various teams. McCown enters the 2015 season as a member of the Cleveland Browns. He has played in every season since graduating Sam Houston except

the 2010 season. He is one of two active Southland stars heading into the 2015 campaign with at least five years of NFL experience. Former Nicholls cornerback Lardarius Webb has played the last seven years in the NFL all with the Baltimore Ravens.

Former Northwestern State cornerback Terrance McGee, an All-American kick returner during his tenure with the Demons, is one of 10 players from the Southland Conference to have taken part in the Pro Bowl. He was selected to the AFC squad as the league's special teams' representative in 2005. Only Stephen F. Austin alumnus Jeremiah Trotter has played in the Pro Bowl more recently than McGee.

The Lumberjacks' former pass-rushing star retired in 2007 having taken part in four Pro Bowls as a representative of the Philadelphia Eagles, the last of which came in 2006. Former Arkansas State star Bill Bergey, who played in a combined five Pro Bowls, including one with the Cincinnati Bengals, also represented the Eagles in four Pro Bowls.

The conference's other four-time Pro Bowler is Fred Dean, arguably the most successful professional football player in the history of the Southland Conference. Dean, a four-time Pro Bowler, was a two-time Southland Defensive Player of the Year and a first-team all-Southland selection all four years of his career at Louisiana Tech. He is one of only five Southland players to earn that distinction. In all, Dean played for 11 seasons in the NFL, recording 93 sacks in 141 games for the San Diego Chargers and San Francisco 49ers. He twice hoisted the Vince Lombardi Trophy as a Super Bowl Champion alongside Joe Montana and in 2009 became the first Southland football player to be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio.

Like Dean, former Texas State standout Ricky Sanders won a pair of Super Bowl rings with the Washington Redskins during his seven-year career. The owner of multiple Super Bowl records, including most receiving yards (193), most total yards (235), most touchdowns in one quarter (two), most receiving yards in one quarter (168), and the longest touchdown reception (80, tie), Sanders joins Dean and 29 other former Southland players as members of at least one Super Bowl championship roster.

The Southland has seen former Nicholls players win Super Bowl rings in two of the last four seasons, as former Colonel Antonio Robinson was a member of the Green Bay Packers' Super Bowl XLVI champions. And, Webb was a member of the Super Bowl XLVII champion Baltimore Ravens. A total of 49 former players from the Southland have 67 Super Bowl appearances between them. Former Northwestern State cornerback is the most recent Southland player to appear in the Super Bowl, reaching the most recent two with the Seattle Seahawks and winning one in 2013.

More former NFL stars from the Southland include Stan Humphries, Fred Barnett, Roger Carr, Marvin Upshaw, Mike Barber, Bruce Collie, Tim McKyer, Pat Tilley, Jackie Harris, Eugene Seale, Bubby Brister, Leonard Smith, Billy Ryckman, Rafael Septien, Buford Jordan and Ray Brown, among many others.






