THE SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE

Well into its sixth decade of service, the Southland Conference continues to be a model of innovation, stability and consistent achievement as it celebrates the academic and athletic accomplishments of its member institutions and approximately 4,200 student-athletes.

Having commemorated its 50th anniversary in 2013, the Southland Conference has transformed itself into a dynamic and respected consortium of 13 member universities in three states. Beginning with a historic meeting of five institutions in Dallas on March 15, 1963, the Southland Conference set on an extraordinary course that has proven successful well into the 21st Century.

The successful transformation continued, as the Southland Conference welcomed four additional members in 2013: Abilene Christian University, Houston Baptist University, the University of Incarnate Word in San Antonio, and the University of New Orleans.

In addition to its newest members, the Southland consists of the University of Central Arkansas, Lamar University, McNeese University, Nicholls University, Northwestern State University, Sam Houston State University, Southeastern Louisiana University, Stephen F. Austin State University and Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi.

An original Southland member from 1963-73, Abilene Christian rejoined the league as one of the most decorated athletic programs in NCAA history; and the addition of Houston Baptist, UIW and New Orleans gives the Southland a regular competitive presence in the key metropolitan areas of Houston, San Antonio and New Orleans. Southland cities encompass approximately 14 million people, and six of its television markets rank among the top 100 in the U.S.

The membership of the Southland encompasses nearly 140,000 current students and an alumni base of 800,000. Famous alums from current Southland Conference schools include former CBS news anchor Dan Rather (Sam Houston State), NBA executive Joe Dumars (McNeese), ABC news anchor Robin Roberts (Southeastern Louisiana), Major League Baseball star Wade Miley (Southeastern Louisiana), NBA legend Scottie Pippen (Central Arkansas), and track and field Olympians Kenta Bell (Northwestern State), and Bobby Morrow and Billy Olson (both Abilene Christian).

Other notable alums from current members include Grammy Award-winning musicians Frank Ocean (New Orleans), Don Henley and Rodney Crowell (both Stephen F. Austin), and Ronnie Dunn (Abilene Christian), television personality and actress Ellen DeGeneres (New Orleans), current NFL standouts

Lardarius Webb (Nicholls), professional golfers Shawn Stefani and Chris Stroud (both Lamar) and Colin Montgomerie (HBU), award-winning filmmaker Richard Linklater (Sam Houston State), American Idol winner Kris Allen (Central Arkansas), NFL Hall of Famer Jackie Harris (Northwestern State), former NFL standouts Bobby Hebert (Northwestern State), Gary Barbaro (Nicholls), Wilbert Montgomery (Abilene Christian) and Gary Reasons (Northwestern State), former MLB star Kevin Millar (Lamar), NCAA football coach Charlie Strong (Central Arkansas), actors John Larroquette (New Orleans), Ricardo Chavira (UIW) and Jesse Borrego (UIW), and the late NFL coaching legend O.A. "Bum" Phillips (Lamar and Stephen F. Austin).

The Southland sponsors 17 championship sports, all at the NCAA Division I level. The eight men's sports include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track and field. The women compete for nine championships in basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball. The conference earns automatic qualification to NCAA championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, and volleyball. The Southland Bowling League, an affiliated Conference sport, originated in 2015, and four of its members filled out half of the eight-team NCAA Championship bracket, with Stephen F. Austin winning the national championship in 2016.

The Southland enjoys multiple national and regional television broadcast agreements and relationships with ESPN Networks, the American Sports Network, Cox Sports Television, Root Sports Southwest, Fox College Sports and Time Warner Cable Sports Channel. In 2015-16, the conference and its institutions were featured in an unprecedented 170 telecasts on these networks. In recent years, the Conference has won numerous broadcast awards for its quality of production.

The Southland Conference, in conjunction with the city of Frisco, Texas, and Hunt Sports Group, also serves as the host to the NCAA Division I Football Championship Game in Frisco, which has been home to the conference headquarters since 2006. The game is played at Frisco's Toyota Stadium, and after a pair of successful three-year agreements, the Southland and its partners were rewarded with a four-year renewal to serve as the national championship host site through the 2020 season.

Southland Conference football ranks among the best Football Championship Subdivision leagues in the nation, and enjoys an annual expectation of competing for the national

championship with multiple teams advancing to the NCAA playoffs each year. In 2015, two Southland teams – McNeese and Sam Houston State—both qualified for the NCAA Division I Football Championship, with the Bearkats reaching the national semifinals for the fourth time in five years. In 2011 and 2012, Sam Houston advanced to the national championship game. Also, in 2002 and 2003, McNeese finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in the nation, and advanced to the 1997 and 2002 national championship contests. The conference has been represented in eight national championship games since the league joined the FCS (formerly I-AA) in 1982. Southland teams have played in 119 Division I playoff games in 34 years, winning 59 of the contests.

Historically, the Southland's successful football heritage has sustained itself through numerous membership and classification changes. The Southland joined the NCAA College Division in 1964, and was designated as NCAA Division II in 1973 before joining Division I in 1975. The Southland was an NCAA Division I-A league from 1978-81, before joining the ranks of FCS in 1982.

During its tenure as a Division I and I-A conference, the Southland initiated the startup of the Shreveport, La.-based Independence Bowl in 1976. The Southland representative served as the host team of the bowl until 1980, compiling a 2-3 record in those contests.

The Conference can lay claim to five national championships, including College Division championships through former members Arkansas State (1970, UPI) and Louisiana Tech (1972, National Football Foundation). Louisiana Tech also won the first NCAA-sanctioned national title, winning the Division II playoffs in 1973. Tech followed that with the UPI's Division II national championship in 1974. Louisiana-Monroe won the 1987 Division I-AA national championship.

McNeese, winner of a record 14 Southland football titles, has made 16 appearances in the NCAA Division I playoffs, while Sam Houston has earned nine trips to the football playoffs. Stephen F. Austin played in the 1989 NCAA title contest and has seven playoff appearances, most recently in 2014. Northwestern State has advanced to the NCAA playoffs six times, Nicholls has participated three times in postseason, Southeastern Louisiana played in the 2013 and 2014 NCAA Championships, and Central Arkansas made consecutive playoff appearances in 2011 and 2012. On six occasions, the Southland has placed three teams in the NCAA playoffs.

The Southland has produced 181 first-team football All-Americans during its history and in 2010 Stephen F. Austin

quarterback Jeremy Moses became the first player in Southland history to receive the Walter Payton Award, which is presented annually to the most outstanding football player at the FCS level.

The Southland is one of five FCS conferences with at least 200 selections (211) in the National Football League draft. There have been 31 Southland players taken in the draft since 2000, including Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Robert Alford, who was picked as the first FCS player in the second round of the 2013 draft. There are more than 24 former Southland players on NFL rosters heading into the 2016 season.

Southland Conference alums in the NFL include Cleveland's Josh McCown (Sam Houston State), who has been in the league for the last 13 seasons, and Baltimore's Lardarius Webb, who is currently the second-longest tenured player with seven seasons of experience. Other recent NFL additions from the Southland include New England's Kevin Hughes (Southeastern Louisiana), Dallas' Dax Swanson (Sam Houston State), Seattle's Jeremy Lane (Northwestern State), Tennessee's Josh Aubrey (Stephen F. Austin), Atlanta's Robert Alford (Southeastern Louisiana) and Buffalo's Dezmin Lewis (Central Arkansas).

The Southland has seen former Nicholls players win Super Bowl rings in recent seasons, as former Colonel Antonio Robinson was a member of the Green Bay Packers' Super Bowl XLV champions. And, Nicholls-ex Webb was a member of the Super Bowl XLVII champion Baltimore Ravens.

Among the former NFL stars from the Southland include Fred Dean, who was inducted to the Professional Football Hall of Fame in 2008 to become the first former Southland Conference player to earn induction in Canton. Other great NFL players from the Southland include Super Bowl XXIX quarterback Stan Humphries, Bill Bergey, Mike Barber, Fred Barnett, Bubby Brister, Ray Brown, Roger Carr, Larry Centers, Bruce Collie, Jackie Harris, Buford Jordan, Tim McKyer, Kavika Pittman, Billy Ryckman, Rickey Sanders, Eugene Seale, Rafael Septien, Terrance Shaw, Leonard Smith, Marcus Spears, Pat Tilley and Marvin Upshaw. Both Dean and Smith are recent inductees to the College Football Hall of Fame.

The Southland Conference has also seen its share of great coaches during its history in Maxie Lambright, Ernie Duplechin, Sam Goodwin, Jack Doland, Bennie Ellender, Bobby Keasler, Larry Lacewell, Bill Davidson, Dennis Franchione, Pat Collins, and Ron Randleman.

In addition to football, the Southland Conference can point :

to a number of accomplishments in all sports.

Men's basketball has experienced a tremendous amount of success during the Southland's 53 seasons. The league has sent four teams to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen, as well as a squad to the NIT Final Four. Basketball stars Karl Malone, Joe Dumars, Jeff Foster, Dwight "Bo" Lamar, Andrew Toney, Mike Oliver and Thomas Walkup played in the Southland Conference.

In 2015-16, Stephen F. Austin won its third consecutive regular-season title after going 18-0 in league play, advancing to the NCAA tournament for the third straight year. The Lumberjacks, seeded 13th, defeated No. 4WestVirginia, 70-56, before losing a last-second contest to Notre Dame. The 2013-14 SFA squad set numerous Southland records, including marks for victories in a season (32) and consecutive wins overall (29 straight) and in Conference play (23 in a row). Playing as a 12th seed, the Lumberjacks knocked off fifth-seeded Virginia Commonwealth, 77-75, in the NCAA's Second Round. In 2006, Northwestern State, playing as the No. 14 seed in the NCAA tournament, defeated No. 3 seed lowa, 64-63, in first-round action. The league placed a record five men's basketball teams reach the postseason in 2015, sent four teams to the postseason in 2016.

Coaches such as Billy Tubbs, Mike Vining, Brad Underwood, Scotty Robertson, Jack Martin, Andy Russo, Bob Marlin, Danny Kaspar, Mike McConathy, Bobby Paschal and Pat Foster have led successful teams in the Southland.

In women's basketball, the Southland also has its share of tradition with former member Louisiana-Monroe advancing to the 1985 NCAA Women's Final Four, and Stephen F. Austin sustaining itself as one of the most successful programs in the history of the sport. In 2016, the Ladyjacks became the fifth program in NCAA Division I history to record more than 1,000 wins.

In each of the last seven seasons, at least three Southland teams reached the postseason, and in 2013, four women's squads earned postseason berths. A Southland team has played in the WNIT 15 times, including each of the last nine years. Women's basketball all-stars have included Eun Jung Lee, Lisa Ingram, Portia Hill, Deneen Parker, Katrina Price, and Joskeen Garner, and coaches such as Gary Blair, Linda Sharp, James Smith and Linda Harper.

Baseball has emerged as a constant Southland Conference strength with the league earning numerous national rankings

and NCAA tournament berths. The Southland consistently ranks among the top-10 conferences in the country. In 2011, 50 of the league's 150 non-conference victories came against the Big 12, Conference USA, Sun Belt and SEC. Major Leaguers such as Wade Miley, Paul Goldschmidt, Jace Peterson, Hunter Pence, Ben Sheets, Micah Hoffpauir, David Segui, Brian Lawrence, Ben Broussard, Chuck Finley, Jerald Clark, and Terry Matthews once played in the Southland.

In 2012, Southeastern Louisiana's Stefan Lopez became the league's second winner of the national Stopper of the Year Award, which is selected by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers. Sam Houston State's Luke Prihoda won the award in 2007. Only the Big 12 has had more players win this award.

The Southland also fares well each year in the Major League Draft, and for the first time, two Southland players were selected in the first round of the 2013 draft. Stephen F. Austin shortstop Hunter Dozier was picked eighth by the Kansas City Royals making the Southland player and hitter of the year the league's top draft pick in any sport. Later in the first round, the Texas Rangers selected Oral Roberts right-handed pitcher Alex Gonzalez, Southland pitcher of the year, with the 23rd overall pick. The Southland has had eight first-round picks in its history.

In 2016, his final season of a 39-year career, Lamar head coach Jim Gilligan became the only Southland coach to win more than 1,350 games, ranking him 16th all-time in NCAA Division coaching. The Jim Gilligan Trophy is now annually awarded to the Southland regular-season champion. Gilligan leads an impressive list of coaches who have patrolled Southland Conference dugouts, including Mark Johnson, Mike Bianco, John Cohen, Mitch Gaspard, Smoke Laval, Butch McBroom, Pat Patterson, David Pierce, Tony Robichaux, Dave Van Horn and Jim Wells.

Softball continues to enjoy success on a national level, beating nationally-ranked opponents every year since 1995, including McNeese's win at No. 1 Arizona State early in the 2012 season. In 2013, the league had six wins against ranked opponents, including wins by McNeese at No. 7 Alabama and No. 8 Texas A&M. In NCAA tournament competition, the Southland has racked up 16 wins, including McNeese's opening win against Arizona State in 2016.

The Southland also has a proud history in volleyball with former member Texas-Arlington representing the conference

numerous times in the NCAA tournament, including a run to the NCAA Volleyball Final Four in 1989.

Track and field has also served as a proud asset for the Southland Conference as the league has produced numerous national champions and Olympic medalists. The Southland boasts 28 men and four women student-athletes who have won NCAA track and field national championships, including Southeastern Louisiana's Alexander Young, the 2016 NCAA men's indoor weight throw champion, Stephen F. Austin's Demi Payne, who won the 2015 women's pole vault, Northwestern State's Trecey Rew, who won the women's discus in 2011, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi's Shadrack Songok (men's 10,000-meter run) in 2007 and 2008 and McNeese's Brad Gebauer (men's pole vault) in 2007. The league has also produced U.S. Olympic track and field medalists Earl Bell, Thomas Hill, Al Joyner, Charles Austin, and Liudmila Litvinova, along with other Olympians. With the addition of 12 more All-Americans in 2016, the league continues to find national success in indoor and outdoor track and field. In the indoor circuit, the Southland boasts 69 unique all-time All-Americans that have won a combined 11 national championships. Likewise, in the outdoor season, the league has seen 169 different All-Americans, including 136 men and 33 women, who have combined to win 21 national championships.

Golf has traditionally been a strong Southland sport as exemplified by Lamar men's golfer Chris Stroud, who finished third individually at the 2003 NCAA National Championship and has 21 top ten PGA finishes since joining pro tour in 2007. Another Lamar alum, Shawn Stefani, had a pair of top seven finishes on the 2013 PGA tour. The league has sent multiple teams into postseason play on numerous occasions, including in 2012 when three Southland teams – Lamar, Southeastern Louisiana and Texas-Arlington – competed in the NCAA tournament. Additionally, during the past five seasons the Southland has sent 12 golfers to compete as individuals in regional play with five in 2009, three more in 2010, one each in 2011 and 2012 and two in 2013. Lamar won a pair of NCAA Division II national championships in 1967 and 1968.

In 2005, Lamar's Dawie Van Der Walt finished fourth individually and Lamar tied for 12th place at the NCAA Men's Golf Championship, before the Cardinals tied for ninth in 2006 and tied for third in 2007.

In women's tennis, Southeastern Louisiana won 46 consecutive conference matches during a four-year period that began in 2005, while in men's tennis Texas A&M-Corpus Christi has played in the NCAA tournament seven times in the last 10 years.

In women's soccer, Stephen F. Austin midfielder Kylie Louw became the first player in conference history to earn All-America honors when she earned third-team mention by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. A member of the South Africa Olympic team during the 2012 London Olympics, she also garnered first-team Academic All-America Honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America. In 2015, Southeastern Louisiana's goalkeeper Hope Sabadash became the second player in league history to earn All-America honors, earning a spot on the NSCAA Second Team. Abilene Christian's Brie Buschman was a first-team Academic All-American in 2013, and Stephen F. Austin's Morgan Glick earned the same honor in 2014.

In women's golf, the Southland sent two teams to 2012 NCAA regional play for the first time since the league added the sport in 2002. Lamar has a league-best seven Southland championships during that span.

The Southland Conference has repeatedly demonstrated its commitment to the academic and athletic success of its student-athletes. With the F.L. McDonald Postgraduate Scholarship Award, the league annually honors male and female scholar-athletes with a stipend for postgraduate study. The Scholar-Athlete Award is given to each institution's male and female student-athlete with the highest grade-point average. The Steve McCarty Citizenship Award, initiated in 2005-06 and named after the former Stephen F.Austin athletic director, properly recognizes accomplishments off the court

for a male and female student-athlete. Also, student-athletes with grade-point averages above 3.0 are honored on the Southland's annual All-Academic teams and Commissioner's Honor Roll. A total of 2,333 student-athletes earned a spot on the Honor Roll at the end of the fall and spring semesters during the 2015-16 academic year.

The conference continues to make great strides in the classroom. During the last decade, no other Division I league has improved its Academic Progress Rate as well as the Southland Conference has. In fact, in 2009-10, the Southland ranked 10th among the 31 Division I leagues in men's basketball APR. The academic progress the league has shown ultimately leads to higher graduation rates for our student-athletes.



Southland Conference Commissioner 15th Year

Tom Burnett was named the Southland Conference's sixth commissioner on Dec. 23, 2002, and brought a diverse background in athletics administration experience at the conference and national levels. The second-longest tenured full-time commissioner in league history, Burnett is now in his 14th year of service with the Southland, and has a conference administrative background reaching over 25 years.

Burnett has helped to enhance the Southland's membership, with the 2013 additions of Houston Baptist University, the University of New Orleans, Abilene Christian University and the University of the Incarnate Word. The new member institutions give the Southland 13 members in Texas, Louisiana and Arkansas.

The league's television exposure has advanced under his watch with the expansion of national and regional coverage, including the Southland's recent broadcast agreement with ESPN Networks that guarantees over 120 national broadcasts through 2019-20. Additionally, the Conference has recently announced new national and regional broadcasting partnerships with the American Sports Network and Cox Sports Television that will provide dozens of telecasts annually.

The award-winning Southland Conference Television Network originated in 2008, and this creative in-house broadcast venture featured over 150 unique sports and promotional telecasts to a potential viewing audience of more than 13 million television households. The Southland has also enjoyed beneficial television relationships with Fox Sports Net Southwest and Root Sports Southwest during his tenure.

Burnett also led the successful community-wide effort to bring the 2011-13 NCAA Division I Football Championship Games to the Southland's home base of Frisco, Texas, as the league serves as the host conference for the national title contests at Toyota Stadium. The NCAA has subsequently renewed the agreement twice to keep the national championship game in Frisco through the 2020 event.

Burnett also initiated the Southland's football officiating consortium with the Big 12 Conference in 2007, a first of its kind dual program that combined singular training, observation, video review and development, a model followed by many other Division I conferences today. And in 2014, the Southland became the first FCS conference to implement full NCAA football instant replay for all home games.

He is a member of the Board of Managers for College Football Officiating (CFO), LLC, and Women's College Basketball Officiating (WCBO), LLC, entities created by the NCAA and the Collegiate Commissioners Association to enhance and address officiating matters in these Division I sports. Burnett is also a member of the National Football Foundation/College Football Hall of Fame's Awards Committee, and he formerly served on the Board of Directors for NCAA Football.

A former member of both the NCAA's Division I Committee on Academic Performance and the Division I Football Academic Working Group, Burnett also served as the FCS Vice President for the Collegiate Commissioners Association (CCA) in 2007-08.

He represented the Southland Conference on the NCAA Division I Management Council in 2004-05, and served on the Division I FCS Governance Committee from 2004-06. Burnett previously served on the NCAA Playing Rules Oversight Panel, and the NCAA Baseball Rules Committee.

In 2004, Burnett began the league's renewed in-house efforts to secure corporate sponsorships. Since then, the Southland has secured sponsorship agreements with dozens of national and regional companies. In 2015, the Southland's corporate sales and marketing rights were acquired by Learfield Sports.

He also initiated efforts in 2007 to bring the Southland Conference basketball tournaments to a neutral site in the Houston area, giving the league a year-end celebration of the sport at a centralized location near much of the Southland's largest alumni and student bases. The tournament has remained in the Houston area since, and league administrators recently agreed to extend the stay at least through the 2017 event.

Prior to joining the Southland, Burnett spent nearly 11 years in a number of roles with the Sun Belt Conference in New Orleans, including stints as associate and assistant commissioner, and director of communications. He also served two years on the staff of the American South Conference, and started his career on the athletic staff at Louisiana Tech University.

Burnett, a native of Houston, is a 1988 graduate of Louisiana Tech University, where he studied journalism and spent one year as the sports editor of the school's student newspaper. He and his wife Tracy are the parents of a son, Cole, a freshman at the University of Oklahoma, and a daughter, Jesse.

Now in his 41st year in football officiating, Byron Boston begins his eighth year as Southland Conference Coordinator of Football Officials. An accomplished official at every level, Boston is in his 22nd season as a game official in the National Football League. During his NFL career, he has officiated 21 playoff games, including Super Bowl XXXIV between St. Louis and Tennessee and Super Bowl XLVII between Baltimore and San Francisco as well as nine Conference Championship games. He also worked the Pro Bowl in 2012.

Boston leads the Southland Conference in its successful football officiating consortium with the Big 12, which is entering its 10th year. The Mountain West Conference joined the consortium in 2010. Unprecedented in the annals of Division I football, the combined officiating program provides the three conferences the ability to train and develop officials in a uniform manner, and build consistent philosophies on rules interpretations and on-field mechanics. A joint summer officiating clinic and an extensive system of film review also highlight the program.

Boston began his Division I collegiate officiating career in the Southland Conference, and joined the Southwest Conference officiating staff in 1990. Prior to that, Boston was a high school official in the Dallas and Houston areas. He has also been an instructor in various collegiate and high school officiating clinics, including those conducted by the Southland Conference.

Byron is a native of Gladewater, Texas, where he was a three-sport letterman. Boston later graduated from Austin College, where he majored in economics and was a four-year football letterman and team captain. He was inducted into Austin College's Hall of Honor in 1997.

The Southland Conference announced on May 21, 2014, that it would become the first Division I FCS league to implement full NCAA instant replay at all home football games, regardless of television coverage, effective with the 2014 season. In the first succesful season, the Southland partnered with DVSport, Inc., the leader in collegiate football high-definition, to provide the league and its 11 football-playing institutions with the cutting-edge technology for instant replay.

The initiative, proposed by the Southland coaches and ratified by the league's athletic directors, was ultimately approved by the Southland's presidential Board of Directors. The Southland staffs the replay operations within a press box booth at each stadium with a replay official, a communicator, a technician and a sideline assistant.

The permanent installation of replay highlighted another positive aspect of the Southland's longstanding officiating consortium with the Big 12 and Mountain West conferences, as qualified replay officials and communicators are readily available for Southland home games.

<u> 2016 NCAA FOOT</u>BALL PLAYING RULES - RULE 12, Instant Replay

SECTION 1. Purpose and Philosophy

Purpose

ARTICLE 1. Instant replay is a process whereby video review is used to confirm, reverse or let stand certain on-field decisions (Rule 12-3) made by game officials.

Philosophy

ARTICLE 2. The instant replay process operates under the fundamental assumption that the ruling on the field is correct. The replay official may reverse a ruling if and only if the video evidence convinces him beyond all doubt that the ruling was incorrect. Without such indisputable video evidence, the replay official must allow the ruling to stand.

SECTION 2. Eligibility for Instant Replay

Participation

ARTICLE 1.

- a. Any member institution may use instant replay, but there is no requirement to do so. If instant replay is used, it must be used in full compliance with this rule.
- b. For any nonconference game, if the home team is using instant replay, the visiting team does not have the option of declining its use for that game.
- c. If the home team is not using instant replay, it is not required to honor a request by the visiting team that it be used.

SECTION 3. Reviewable Plays

Scoring Plays

ARTICLE 1. Reviewable plays involving a potential score include:

- a. A potential touchdown or safety. [Exception: Safety by penalty for fouls that are not specifically reviewable.]
- b. Field goal attempts if and only if the ball is ruled (a) below or above the crossbar or (b) inside or outside the uprights when it is lower than the top of the uprights. If the ball is higher than the top of the uprights as it crosses the end line, the play may not be reviewed.

Passes

ARTICLE 2. Reviewable plays involving passes include:

- a. Pass ruled complete, incomplete or intercepted anywhere in the field of play or an end zone.
- b. Forward pass touched by a player (eligible or ineligible) or an official.
- Forward pass or forward handing when a ball carrier is or has been beyond the neutral zone.
 - d. A forward pass or forward handing after a change of team possession.
 - e. Pass ruled forward or backward when thrown from behind the neutral zone.
- 1. If the pass is ruled forward and is incomplete, the play is reviewable only if the ball goes out of bounds or if there is clear recovery of a loose ball in the immediate continuing action after the loose ball. If the replay official does not have indisputable video evidence as to which team recovers, the ruling of incomplete pass stands.
- If the replay official reverses an incomplete forward pass ruling and the ball is recovered, it belongs to the recovering team at the spot of the recovery and any advance is nullified.
- f. Location of the passer when he is obviously in the field of play and a ruling of intentional grounding would result in a safety by penalty.

Dead Ball and Loose Ball

ARTICLE 3. Reviewable plays involving potential dead balls and loose balls include:

- a. Loose ball by a potential passer ruled a fumble.
- b. Loose ball by a passer ruled incomplete forward pass when there is clear recovery in the immediate continuing action after the loose ball.
- 1. If the replay official does not have indisputable video evidence as to which team recovers, the ruling of incomplete pass stands.
- If the replay official rules fumble, the ball belongs to the recovering team at the spot of the recovery and any advance is nullified.

- c. Live ball not ruled dead in possession of a ball carrier.
- d. Loose ball ruled dead, or live ball ruled dead in possession of a ball carrier when the clear recovery of a loose ball occurs in the immediate continuing action.
- f the ball is ruled dead and the replay official does not have indisputable video evidence as to which team recovers, the dead-ball ruling stands.
- 2. If the replay official rules that the ball was not dead, it belongs to the recovering team at the spot of the recovery and any advance is nullified.
- e. Ball carrier's forward progress, spot of fumble, or spot of out-of-bounds backward pass, with respect to a first down.
- f. Catch or recovery of a fumble by a Team A player other than the fumbler before any change of possession during fourth down or a try.
- g. Ball carrier in or out of bounds. If a ball carrier is ruled out of bounds, the play is not reviewable, except as in Rules 12-3-1-a and 12-3-3-d.
 - h. Catch, recovery or touching of a loose ball by a player inbounds or out of bounds.
- i. A loose ball touching on or beyond a sideline, goal line, or end line, touching a pylon, or breaking the plane of a goal line.
- j. Catch or recovery of a loose ball in the field of play or an end zone.
- k. Forward fumble that goes out of bounds with respect to a first down.

Kicks

ARTICLE 4. Reviewable plays involving kicks include:

- a. Touching of a kick.
- b. Player beyond the neutral zone when kicking the ball.
- c. Kicking team player advancing a ball after a potential muffed kick/fumble by the receiving team.
 - d. Scrimmage kick crossing the neutral zone.
 - e. Blocking by Team A players before they are eligible to touch the ball on an on-side kick.

Miscellaneous

ARTICLE 5. Situations that may be addressed by the replay official:

- a. The number of players on the field for either team during a live ball.
- b. Clock adjustment and status when a ruling is reviewed.
- c. Clock adjustment at the end of any quarter. (Exception: Rule 3-2-5-b)

If at the end of any quarter the game clock expires, either during a down in which it should be stopped by rule when the ball becomes dead or following the down upon a request for an available team timeout, the replay official may restore time only under these conditions:

 The replay official has indisputable video evidence that time should have remained on the game clock when the ball became dead or when the team timeout was granted;

- 2. In the second and fourth quarters only the team in possession when the ball became dead would next put the ball in play from scrimmage;
- 3. In the fourth quarter only, either the score is tied or the team that will next snap the ball is behind by eight points or fewer; and
- 4. The replay official's video evidence includes the timeout signal by an official in the case where the game clock should have stopped for a requested team timeout.
 - d. Correcting the number of a down.
- 1. This includes the result of a penalty enforcement that includes an automatic first down or loss of down.
- 2. The correction may be made at any time within that series of downs or before the ball is legally put in play after that series.
- e. Any person who is not a player interfering with live-ball action occurring in the field of play (Rule 9-2-3).
- f. The player-disqualification portion of the penalty for targeting fouls under 9-1-3 and 9-1-4. The point of forcible contact and use of the crown of the helmet are reviewable; however, the targeting action itself is not reviewable. Note that if the disqualification is reversed the 15-yard penalty remains only if there is another personal foul in conjunction with the targeting. See the Penalty at Rules 9-1-3 and 9-1-4.

Limitations on Reviewable Plays

ARTICLE 6. No other plays or officiating decisions are reviewable. However, the replay official may correct egregious errors, including those involving the game clock, whether or not a play is reviewable. This excludes fouls that are not specifically reviewable (Reviewable fouls: Rules 12-3-2-c and d, 12-3-4-b and 12-3-5-a).

SECTION 4. Instant Replay Personnel, Equipment and LocationPersonnel

ARTICLE 1. Instant replay personnel shall consist of the number of persons needed to operate the replay equipment within the necessary time constraints. There shall be a minimum of three persons to ensure that all plays are reviewed in an efficient and timely manner. Such persons are normally referred to as replay official, communicator and technician. Additional personnel may be used as needed.

Equipment

ARTICLE 2. The type of equipment used to carry out necessary instant replay duties shall be determined by each conference or member institution using instant replay.

Location

ARTICLE 3.

- a. All equipment used reviewing a play during the replay process and the personnel using that equipment shall be located in a separate, secure location in the press box. This room shall not be available or accessible to any person not directly involved in instant replay.
- b. Additional telephonic equipment needed to allow instant replay personnel to communicate with the game referee when a game has been stopped for a play review shall be located on a sideline near the field of play and preferably outside a team area. Such equipment shall provide the game referee and the replay official a secure and private means of communication.

SECTION 5. Initiating the Replay Process

Game Stop

ARTICLE 1. There are two methods to stop a game to review a ruling on the field.

- a. The replay official and his crew shall review every play of a game. He may stop a game at any time before the ball is next legally put in play (Exception: Rule 12-3-5-c) whenever he believes that:
- There is reasonable evidence to believe an error was made in the initial on-field ruling.
 - 2. The play is reviewable.
 - The outcome of a review would have a direct, competitive impact on the game.The head coach of either team may request that the game be stopped and a play be
- reviewed by challenging the on-field ruling.

 1. A head coach initiates this challenge by taking a team timeout before the ball
- is next legally put in play (Exception: Rule 12-3-5-c) and informing the referee that he is challenging the ruling of the previous play. If a head coach's challenge is successful, he retains the challenge, which he may use only once more during the game. Thus, a coach may have a total of two challenges if and only if his initial challenge is successful.
- After a review has been completed, if the on-field ruling is reversed, that team's timeout will not be charged.
- After a review has been completed, and the on-field ruling is not reversed, the charged team timeout counts as one of the three permitted that team for that half or the one permitted in that extra period.



- 4. A head coach may not challenge a ruling in which the game was stopped and a decision has already been made by the replay official.
- 5. If a head coach requests a team timeout to challenge an on-field ruling and the play being challenged is not reviewable, the timeout shall count as one of the three permitted his team during that half of the game or the one permitted in that extra period.
- 6. A head coach may not challenge an on-field ruling if all the team's timeouts have been used for that half or in that extra period.

When To Stop a Game

ARTICLE 2.

- a. A game may be stopped, either by the replay official or by a head coach's challenge, at any time before the ball is next legally put in play (Exception: Rule 12-3-5-c).
 - b. No game official may request that a game be stopped for a play to be reviewed.

SECTION 6. Reviewing an On-field Ruling

Procedures

ARTICLE 1.

- a. When a game is to be stopped either by the replay official or by a head coach's challenge, the designated officials on the field will be notified by a buzzer system or other appropriate means.
- b. If the review is initiated by the replay official, the referee shall announce:

"The ruling on the previous play is ... (brief description of ruling). The play is under further review."

If the game has been stopped due to a head coach's challenge, the referee shall announce: "The (name of institution) head coach has challenged the ruling of (state the ruling). The play is under further review."

- c. All reviews shall be based upon video evidence provided by and coming directly from the televised production of the game or from other video means available to the replay official.
- d. After the referee has conferred with the replay official and the review process has been completed, he shall make one of the following announcements:
 - 1. If the video evidence confirms the on-field ruling:

"After further review, the ruling on the field is confirmed."

- 2. If there is no indisputable (conclusive) evidence to reverse the on-field ruling: "After further review, the ruling on the field stands."
 - If the on-field ruling is reversed (Rule 12-7):

"After further review, the ruling is [followed by a brief description of the video evidence]. Therefore, [followed by a brief description of the impact of the ruling]."

e. f a ruling is reversed, the replay official shall supply the referee with all pertinent data as needed (next down, distance, yard line, position of the ball, clock status/adjustment) in order to resume play under the correct game conditions.

Restrictions

ARTICLE 2.

- a. There is no restriction on the number of times the replay official may stop a game for reviews.
 - b. The replay official is under no time limit for a review.

SECTION 7. Reversing an On-Field Ruling

Criterion for Reversal

ARTICLE 1. To reverse an on-field ruling, the replay official must be convinced beyond all doubt by indisputable video evidence through one or more video replays provided to the monitor.

SOUTHLAND TELEVISION PACKAGE









Television plans for the first five weeks of the Southland Conference football season have been finalized, along with arrangements for select games throughout the remainder of the season.

For games on Oct. 8 and beyond, the conference will reveal most television choices 12 days prior to kickoff. This will allow for the best matchups to be selected each week for various partners.

ESPN will exercise its option to make the initial choice most weeks, placing a top-tier game on ESPN3, its multi-screen network. The American Sports Network's selected game will be syndicated throughout the region and beyond. Cox Sports Television will also make several choices, scattered throughout the schedule.

Opening night falls on Thu., Sept., 1, and will feature a conference matchup between Houston Baptist and Central Arkansas. The American Sports Network will carry the game on local affiliates across the country.

Friday, Sept. 2, will showcase Northwestern State at Baylor on Fox Sports Net.

The season's first Sat., Sept. 3, will feature at least four televised games. Two matchups will be available exclusively on ESPN3: Lamar's opener against Coastal Carolina and Sam Houston State's meeting with Oklahoma Panhandle State. A pair of road games will receive coverage on Fox Sports Net, as Southeastern Louisiana visits Oklahoma State, and Stephen F. Austin goes to Texas Tech.

The American Sports Network will feature three more Southland games in the early portion of the schedule, including UIW at Northwestern State (Thu., Sept. 8), Stephen F. Austin at McNeese (Sat., Sept. 17), and Central Arkansas at Abilene Christian (Sat., Oct. 1). In addition, ASN is set to carry the River Bell Classic between Southeastern Louisiana and Nicholls at season's end (Thu., Nov. 17). American Sports Network broadcasts will be simulcast on the Southland Digital Network, available via southland.org and the Southland app.

ESPN3's early-season schedule includes the Battle of the Piney Woods. Stephen F. Austin and Sam Houston State meet Sat., Oct. 1, at Houston's NRG Stadium.

Cox Sports Television has two games among the Southland's preseason selections, featuring all four of the league's Louisiana football teams. Northwestern State visits Southeastern Louisiana in the first (Sat., Sept. 24), followed by a matchup between Nicholls and McNeese (Sat., Oct. 1). Cox Sports Television broadcasts will be simulcast on ESPN3 outside CST's territory.

For games not selected by conference partners, individual schools will have the ability to produce broadcasts via television or online outlets.

SOUTHLAND FOOTBALL HISTORY

1963

The Southland Conference is organized by five institutions: Abilene Christian College (Abilene Christian University), Arkansas State College (Arkansas State University) Arlington State College (University of Texas at Arlington) Lamar State College of Technology (Lamar University) and Trinity University.

1964

The Southland Conference begins football play. Lamar wins inaugural championship with a 3-0-1 league mark and falls in the Pecan Bowl to Northern Iowa, 19-17.

1965

Lamar repeats as Southland champion with a 3-1 mark (6-4 overall).

1966

Texas-Arlington and Lamar finish as co-champions with identical 3-1 marks.

1967

Texas-Arlington wins the league title with a perfect 4-0 record, and completes a 10-1 season with a 13-0 win over North Dakota State in Pecan Bowl.

Trinity defensive end Marvin Upshaw becomes the first Southland Conference player to be selected in the first round of the NFL draft, the 21st overall selection by the Cleveland Browns.

1968

The Southland Conference begins competition in the NCAA's College Division.

Arkansas State takes the Southland title with a 3-0-1 mark, but loses in the Pecan Bowl to North Dakota State, 23-14.

1969

Arkansas State repeats as league champion, sweeping through the league at 4-0. ASU caps an 8-1-1 season with a win over Drake, 29-21, in the Pecan Bowl.

1970: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Arkansas State wins the Southland title for the third consecutive year and finishes the season with a perfect 11-0 mark, winning the UPI College Division National Championship. ASU capped the year with a 38-21 win over Central Missouri State in the Pecan Bowl.

Arkansas State head coach Bennie Ellender is named the National Small College Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association.

1971

Louisiana Tech University and the University of Southwestern Louisiana (Louisiana-Lafayette) join the Southland Conference. Louisiana Tech, Trinity and Lamar share the championship with 4-1 records. Louisiana Tech caps a 9-2 season with a 14-3 win over Eastern Michigan in the Pioneer Bowl.

1972: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Louisiana Tech wins its second straight championship with a 5-0 mark, and caps off a perfect 12-0 season with a 35-0 trouncing of Tennessee Tech in the Grantland Rice Bowl. The win gives Louisiana Tech a claim to the College Division National Championship.

McNeese University plays its first season in the Southland Conference. Abilene Christian plays its final season and withdraws from the Southland Conference.

1973: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Louisiana Tech wins the league title with a 5-0 record on the way to a 12-1 season capped off by the league's first NCAA football championship, winning the Division II title, 34-0, over Western Kentucky.

1974: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Louisiana Tech wins its fourth consecutive league crown with a 5-0 mark on the way to an 11-1 overall record. Tech is declared UPI Division II National Champion.

Louisiana Tech wide receiver Roger Carr becomes the second Southland Conference player to be selected in the first round of the NFL draft, the 24th overall pick by the Baltimore Colts.

1975

The Southland Conference begins play as an NCAA Division I league. Arkansas State wins the league with a perfect 5-0 mark and rolls through the season with an 11-0 mark as one of two unbeaten, untied teams in Division I. Because of no postseason opportunities for Arkansas State, the Southland Conference and city of Shreveport, La., develop the idea for the Independence Bowl, to be hosted by the Southland champion.

1976

McNeese wins its first Southland title with a 4-1 mark. The Cowboys finish the season 10-2 after a 20-16 win over Tulsa in the inaugural Independence Bowl.

1977

Louisiana Tech claims its fifth Southland title with a 4-0 mark, and caps a 9-1-2 season with a 24-14 win over Louisville in the Independence Bowl.

1978

Louisiana Tech and Arkansas State share the title with 4-1 marks, and Louisiana Tech finishes a 6-5 season with a 35-13 loss to East Carolina in the Independence Bowl.

1979

McNeese wins its second Southland title with a 5-0 league mark. McNeese finishes with an 11-1 record, losing only to Syracuse, 31-7, in the Independence Bowl.

1980

McNeese rolls to another undefeated 5-0 conference record for its second straight title. The Cowboys lost to Southern Miss., 16-14, in the final Independence Bowl hosted by the Southland champion.

1981

Texas-Arlington wins its first league title in 14 years with a 4-1 mark on the way to a 6-5 overall record. Louisiana-Lafayette plays its final season and withdraws from the Southland Conference.

1982

The Southland Conference is re-classified into the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision, and begins participation in the NCAA Division I Playoffs. Northeast Louisiana University (Louisiana-Monroe) plays its first season in the Southland Conference. Louisiana Tech claims its seventh Southland crown with a 5-0 mark, and finishes at 10-3 after advancing to the NCAA Division I semifinals, and falling to Delaware, 17-0.

1983

North Texas plays its first season in the Southland Conference, and responds by sharing the league title with Louisiana-Monroe with a 5-1 record. North Texas loses in the opening round of the Division I Playoffs at Nevada, 20-17, in overtime. The McNeese defensive back Leonard Smith becomes the highest Southland Conference draft choice, taken as the 17th overall selection in the first round by the St. Louis Cardinals.

1984: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Louisiana Tech wins the championship with a 5-1 mark, and finishes a 10-5 season by falling in the Division I National Championship to Montana State, 19-6.

Arkansas State also advances to the quarterfinals in the NCAA Division I playoffs, falling at Montana State, 31-14.

1985

Arkansas State claims the title with a 5-1 mark and advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAADivision I playoffs, losing at Nevada, 24-23. Texas-Arlington plays its final season after discontinuing football, and withdraws from the Southland Conference. UTA returned to the league without football during the 1987-88 academic year.

1986: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Arkansas State wins its seventh league title with a perfect 5-0 record and completes a 12-2-1 season by advancing to the Division I National Championship game, falling to Georgia Southern, 48-21.

Arkansas State, Louisiana Tech and Lamar play their final season and withdraw from the Southland Conference. Lamar returns to the league without football during the 1998-1999 academic year.

1987: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Louisiana-Monroe runs through the Southland schedule at 6-0 and finishes a 13-2 season by winning the NCAA Division I National Championship with a 43-42 win over Marshall.

North Texas advances to the NCAA Division I playoffs, falling in the first round at Louisiana-Monroe, 30-9.

Northwestern State University, Sam Houston State University, Southwest Texas State University and Stephen F. Austin State University play their first season in the Southland Conference.

SOUTHLAND FOOTBALL HISTORY



Northwestern State running back John Stephens is selected 17th overall in the first round of the NFL Draft by New England, matching the highest draft selection in Southland Conference history (Leonard Smith, McNeese, 17th pick, 1983).

1988

Northwestern State wins its first Southland championship with a perfect 6-0 mark, and completes a 10-3 season by advancing to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Idaho, 38-30. For the first time, the Southland sends three teams to postseason play as Stephen F. Austin advances to the second round before falling at Georgia Southern, 27-7. North Texas also earns a playoff bid, but loses in the first round at Marshall, 7-0.

1989: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Stephen F. Austin wins its first Southland championship with a 5-0-1 mark and completes a 12-2-1 season by advancing to the Division I National Championship game, falling at Georgia Southern, 37-34.

1990

Louisiana-Monroe wins the league with a 5-1 mark, and finishes a 7-5 season by losing in the first round of the Division I playoffs, 27-14, at Nevada.

1991


McNeese, at 4-1-2, and Sam Houston State, at 5-2, share the conference title by virtue of identical .714 winning percentage. McNeese completes a 6-4-2 campaign with a first-round loss at Nevada, 22-16, in the NCAA Division I playoffs. Sam Houston State also earns its first bid into the NCAA Division I playoffs, but the Bearkats lose at Middle Tennessee, 20-19, in overtime. Nicholls University plays its first season in the league.

1992

Louisiana-Monroe completes an undefeated, 7-0, conference slate for its fourth league title. The Indians advance to the quarterfinals of the playoffs, falling to Delaware, 41-18. McNeese also earns a bid to the NCAA Division I playoffs, advancing to the quarterfinals, losing at Northern lowa, 29-7.

1993

McNeese rolls through the league undefeated at 7-0 and advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing to Troy State, 35-28. For the second time in league history, three Southland teams earn berths into the NCAA Division I playoffs. Louisiana-Monroe falls in the first round to Idaho, 34-31, and Stephen F. Austin loses a first-round contest at Troy State, 42-20. Louisiana-Monroe plays its final football season and withdraws its program from the Southland Conference. ULM's remaining sports continue to compete in the Southland.

1994

North Texas earns its second league crown with a 5-0-1 mark, but loses in the first round of the NCAA Division I playoffs, 24-20. McNeese also receives a playoff bid, and the Cowboys advance to the quarterfinals, falling at Montana, 30-28. North Texas plays its final season and withdraws from the league.

1995

McNeese completes an undefeated league schedule at 5-0, and advances to the semifinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing to Marshall, 25-15. Stephen F. Austin also receives a playoff berth and also advances to the national semifinals, falling at Montana, 70-14.

1996

The Southland Football League, a seven-team entity formed by the remaining six Southland Conference football-playing institutions and Troy State University, is formed.

In its first year of Southland competition, Troy wins the league with a 5-1 mark, and advances to the semifinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, falling at Montana, 70-7.

Nicholls, completing a miraculous turnaround from an 0-11 season in 1995, finishes 8-4, and also receives a bid to the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Montana in the first round, 48-3. Nicholls head coach Darren Barbier wins the Eddie Robinson Award, presented annually to the FCS National Coach of the Year.

1997: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

McNeese and Northwestern State share the Southland title with 6-1 records. McNeese concludes a 13-2 season by advancing to the NCAA Division I National Championship game, falling to Youngstown State, 10-9.

Northwestern State also earns a bid to the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Eastern Washington in the first round, 40-10. Jacksonville State plays its first football season in the league.

1998

Northwestern State wins its third Southland title with a 6-1 record. The Demons advance to the semifinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs before falling to Massachusetts, 41-31. The Southland again sends three teams to postseason play. McNeese falls in the first round to Massachusetts, 21-19, and Troy State loses in the first round at Florida A&M, 27-17.

1999

Troy and Stephen F. Austin share the league crown at 6-1, and Troy advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing to Florida A&M, 17-10. Troy deFensive tackle Al Lucas wins the Buck Buchanan Award, signifying the nation's top defensive player in the FCS.

2000

Troy wins its third Southland championship with a 7-0 record, and advances to the NCAA Division I playoffs, falling to Appalachian State, 33-30. Troy plays its final season and withdraws from the Southland Football League.

2001

Sam Houston State and McNeese share the conference crown at 5-1. Sam Houston advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Montana, 49-24.

For the fourth time, the Southland sends three teams into postseason play. McNeese falls to Maine, 14-10, in the first round, and Northwestern State loses in the first round at Montana, 28-19.

The year marks the final season of the Southland Football League. The SFL identity will be returned into the Southland Conference beginning with the 2002 season.

Sam Houston State head coach Ron Randleman records his 200th career coaching victory.

2002: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

McNeese wins its record ninth Southland championship with a 6-0 mark. McNeese advances to the NCAA Division I National Championship game, falling to Western Kentucky, 34-14.

McNeese head coach Tommy Tate is honored with the Eddie Robinson Award.

Southeastern Louisiana, a member of the Southland Conference in sports other than football, announces it will revive football after discontinuing the program in 1986. Southeastern will play two seasons as and FCS independent before playing in the Southland in 2005.

2003

The Southland Conference had an all-time high seven games broadcast on Fox Sports Net affiliates during the 2003 season. In addition, 10 other contests featuring at least one Southland team were aired on the College Sports Television (CSTV), The Football Network (TFN) and COX Sports Television outlets.

McNeese completes an undefeated 5-0 conference mark

for its third consecutive league title and 10th overall. The Cowboys end the season with a streak of 16 consecutive wins in league play.

For the second year in a row, McNeese was the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division I playoffs. The Cowboys were ranked No. 1 nationally all but one week during the regular season, but lost their first-round playoff contest.

McNeese's Tommy Tate was named AFCA Region V Coach of the Year.

2004

Sam Houston State capped a successful season in what would turn out to be the last for 36-year head coach Ron Randleman. The Bearkats had the best turn-around season in all of Division I football, going from 2-9 in 2003 to an 11-3 mark in 2004. Sam Houston notched its third Southland Conference championship in school history. The Bearkats shared the 2004 title with Northwestern State as each compiled 4-1 league records.

Northwestern State received the league's automatic berth to the NCAA playoffs after winning the fourth regular-season title in school history. The Demons fell in the first-round of the NCAA Division I playoffs to Montana.

Sam Houston used an at-large berth to the playoffs and advanced to the semifinal round of the tournament for the first time in school history. The Bearkats opened with an impressive 54-24 win over No. 3 Western Kentucky in round one. They then had to overcome a 20-point deficit in the fourth quarter to win, 35-34, at Eastern Washington in quarterfinal action.

Up next was a trip to Missoula where Sam Houston outgained the host Grizz, but lost the turnover battle. The Bearkats had four miscues while Montana did not turn the ball over. The first three turnovers by Sam Houston led to touchdowns for Montana. Included were two interceptions in the first half, which led to a 14-6 halftime cushion for the host.

The 2004 season marked the 12th time in the last 14 years the Southland Conference was represented by multiple teams in the 16-team NCAA Division I playoff field. Sam Houston State and Northwestern State were duplicates from the 2001 playoffs in a year when the Southland sent three teams with McNeese also advancing.

2005

Southeastern Louisiana, a member of the league in all other sports since 1997, began Southland Conference football competition. Hurricane Katrina and Hurricane Rita wrecked havoc on the 2005 schedule before Texas State and Nicholls shared the regular-season crown for the first Southland titles for either. The two advanced to the NCAA Division I playoffs with Texas State going all the way to the semifinals before losing in overtime to Northern Iowa, 40-37.

2006

With McNeese off to a 1-3 start, the 2006 season looked to be in trouble for success. But a turnaround happened as Matt Viator was named head coach on Sept. 13, 2006. Viator went on to lead the Cowboys to the NCAA Division I playoffs by posting a 6-2 record in his partial season. He was named both the Southland Coach of the Year and the Louisiana Sports Writers Association Coach of the Year and was a finalist in the balloting for Eddie Robinson Coach

of the Year Award.

McNeese captured its 11th Southland regular-season title and fourth in the last six years by posting a 5-1 league record in 2006 to finish one game ahead of Sam Houston State and Stephen F. Austin.

Southland newcomer Central Arkansas posted the best overall record at 8-3, but did not play a Southland schedule.

2007

McNeese finished the regular-season 11-0, becoming the first Southland school to complete the regular-season undefeated since the Cowboys accomplished the feat in 1995. As a result, the school won its 12th Southland regular-season title. The Cowboys also hosted a first-round game in the NCAA Division I playoffs, becoming the first Southland school to host since Texas State hosted three in 2005.

The Southland won two games against FBS opponents in 2007, as Nicholls knocked off Rice 16-14 and McNeese defeated Louisiana-Lafayette 38-17. They were the 14th and 15th wins against the FBS for the Southland since 2000.

In the NFL Draft, the Southland had three players, McNeese's Bryan Smith, Nicholls's Kareem Moore and Northwestern State's Demetrius Bell all taken. Smith was taken No. 80 overall in the third round by the Philadelphia Eagles, becoming the highest Southland player to be selected since former Cowboy Keith Smith was taken No. 73 in the 2004 NFL Draft.

Lamar, a member of the Southland Conference in sports other than football, announces it will revive football after discontinuing the program in 1989. Lamar will begin play as an FCS independent in 2010 and will play a Southland Conference schedule in 2011.

2008

Texas State won its second Southland title with a 5-2 record after beating rival Sam Houston State in the regular-season finale. Central Arkansas, ineligible for the league championship during its transition to Division I from Division II, finished with a league-best 6-1 conference record. By virtue of winning the outright Southland title, Texas State earned the league's automatic bid into the NCAA Division I playoffs, where it collided with perennial power and fourth-seeded Montana. The Grizzlies went on to reach the NCAA Division I National Championship game after getting by the Bobcats 31-13 in the opening round.

Three players — Central Arkansas quarterback Nathan Brown and defensive end Larry Hart and Nicholls defensive back Lardarius Webb — as well as Central Arkansas head coach Clint Conque finished among the top 10 in balloting for the Payton Award, the Buck Buchanan Award and the Eddie Robinson Award.

The Southland led all FCS conferences with four NFL Draft picks in April. It was the most drafted out of the league since five were taken in 2002 and brought the total number of draft selections to 25 since the 2000 season. Webb was selected in the third round by Baltimore, while the New York Giants selected Sam Houston State quarterback Rhett Bomar in the fifth round. McNeese receiver Quinten Lawrence and Stephen F. Austin receiver Dominique Edison, were taken in the sixth round by the Kansas City Chiefs and Tennessee Titans, respectively. Another four players signed free agent contracts.

2009

Stephen F. Austin and McNeese each finished 6-1 in Southland Conference play to share the conference championship. SFA won its third conference title and first since 1999, while McNeese won its 13th conference championship and its sixth since 2000. The shared titles marked the first time since 2005 the league split its championship. SFA beat McNeese, 16-13, to clinch the league's automatic berth in the NCAA playoffs. The Lumberjacks, who were 0-11 in 2007, picked up the first postseason win by the league since 2005 when Texas State reached the semifinals. In its first appearance in the playoffs since its semifinal run in 1995, SFA beat Eastern Washington at home but lost at Montana in the quarterfinals. McNeese, which was able to earn an at-large bid into the playoffs, also got a home game, but fell to New Hampshire.

Stephen F. Austin coach J.C. Harper was the runnerup for the Eddie Robinson Award, which is presented to the national coach of the year. The conference coach of the year, was just two points shy from winning the national award.

2010

Stephen F. Austin quarterback Jeremy Moses threw for 489 yards to lead the Lumberjacks to a 36-13 victory over Northwestern State in the regular-season finale. That win, coupled with McNeese's loss at Central Arkansas, gave SFA its first outright Southland Conference title since the 1989 season. It also marked the first time in program history that SFA won back-to-back conference titles. The Lumberjacks earned the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Division I playoffs and were awarded with a home game against Villanova, the 2009 national champion, but lost 54-24.

Moses went on to become the first Southland player to win the Walter Payton Award. The Lumberjacks' quarter-back set the FCS record for completions (1,184) and finished among the subdivision's all-time top 10 in total offense (13,201), passing yards (13,401) and touchdown passes.

The Southland Conference, based in Frisco, Texas since 2006, was named the host of the 2011 NCAA Division I Football Championship Game. The Division I playoff bracket expanded from 16 teams to 20 teams and the new format pushed the championship game into January. Eastern Washington defeated Delaware, 20-19, in the first of at least three national championship games to be played at Pizza Hut Park. The venue is scheduled to also host the games following the 2011 and 2012 seasons.

Central Arkansas became a full Division I member in 2010 and was eligible for a conference championship and playoffs. Lamar, already a conference member in other sports, returned to the gridiron after a 21-year absence, but played the 2010 season as an independent. The Cardinals will rejoin the Southland in 2011 for the first time since the 1986 season. Texas State played its final football season as a league member in 2010.

2011: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Sam Houston State cruised to the 2011 Southland Conference championship, becoming the first Southland team since McNeese in 2007 to go a perfect 11-0 during the regular season, including a 7-0 mark in conference

play for its fourth league championship, but its first outright title. No other Texas team had navigated a perfect season in conference play.

The Bearkats were the only unbeaten team in the Football Championship Subdivision at the end of the regular season and were awarded the No. 1 seed in the Division I playoffs. It was Sam Houston's fifth Divison I playoff appearance. After a first-round bye, the Bearkats opened with a win over Stony Brook and followed with wins over long-time Southland nemeses Montana State and Montana to move to 14-0 and set up a date against North Dakota State in the Division I Football Championship Game. The Bison snapped the Bearkats' 16-game win streak (dating back to the 2010 season) with a 17-6 win at FC Dallas Stadium in Frisco, Texas. Both teams finished with 14-1 records. The win total set a Sam Houston State school record. The title game appearance was the Southland's first since the 2002 season, but marked the seventh time a Southland team reached the title game.

Central Arkansas, which finished second in league play at 6-1, made its first appearance in the Division I playoffs in just its second year of eligibility. Playing with an at-large berth, the Bears won the Southland's first road playoff game since 2004 with a 34-14 win at Tennessee Tech before ending its season at Montana.

2012: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Sam Houston State returned to the 2012 Division I Football Championship Game for the second consecutive year after sharing the Southland Conference regular-season title with Central Arkansas. Both schools finished 6-1 in conference, giving the Bearkats their fifth league championship and the Bears their first conference title. In 2008, UCA finished 6-1 in league play and atop the standings but was ineligible for the conference championship during its transition to Division I.

Both Central Arkansas and Sam Houston earned a spot in the postseason, marking the second time in as many years the Southland sent two teams to the postseason, with UCA and Sam Houston also representing the league in the 2011. The Bears earned an opening-round bye in the playoffs but fell to No. 5 seed Georgia Southern on the road 24-16 to finish its year 9-3 overall.

The Bearkats also received a bye in the first round and knocked off Cal Poly (18-16) at home in the second round before winning consecutive road games at Montana State (34-16) in the quarterfinals and at Eastern Washington (45-42) in the semifinals en route to their second consecutive trip to Frisco, Texas, for the championship game. The Bearkats earned a rematch against defending champion North Dakota State and fell to the Bison 39-13. Sam Houston reached the championship game for the second time in its history, and it marked the eighth time a Southland team reached the title game.

In the NFL draft, Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Robert Alford was selected in the second round by the Atlanta Falcons. His 60th overall selection was the highest draft pick of a Southland player since Stephen F. Austin's Mikhael Ricks was taken 59th overall in the 1998 draft by the San Diego Chargers.

2013

Southeastern Louisiana won its first Southland football title after posting a 10-2 overall regular-season record and a perfect 7-0 mark against league opponents. The Lions finished one game ahead of McNeese, who ended the regular-season 10-2 overall and 6-1 in conference. This marked the first time in conference history the league has produced two 10-win teams before the start of the playoffs. The league had multiple double-digit winners in 1988 and 1995, but in both seasons, one or both teams needed the postseason to get there.

The Southland Conference placed three teams in the playoffs for the fifth time. Southeastern, McNeese and Sam Houston State represented the league. It was the first time since 2001 when Sam Houston, McNeese and Northwestern State each made the field.

The Bearkats opened the postseason against Southern Utah and posted a 51-20 win. However, Sam Houston drew Southeastern in the next round, where the Lions edged the Bearkats 30-29 in the closing seconds. It was the first FCS postseason win in Lion history. Southeastern, which earned the No. 4 national seed, fell in the quarterfinals 20-17 to New Hampshire. On the other side of the bracket, No. 6 seed McNeese lost to Jacksonville State 31-10 in the second round.

2014

Southeastern Louisiana and Sam Houston State shared the regular-season title after each school posted a 7-1 mark in conference play. The Lions and Bearkats finished two games ahead of Stephen F. Austin, Lamar and Central Arkansas, which all went 5-3 in Southland play.

For the second consecutive year, and sixth overall time in league history, the Southland sent three teams to the postseason with Sam Houston, Southeastern and SFA. However, the league co-champions, which did not face each other in the regular season, were matched up in the first round of the postseason with Sam Houston edging Southeastern 21-17. The Lumberjacks, who reached the postseason for the first time since 2010, drew Northern lowa in the first round and fell on the road to the Panthers 44-10, ending their season with an 8-5 mark.

The Bearkats, who finished the year 11-5, continued their postseason success with big road wins. In the second round, Sam Houston defeated Jacksonville State 37-26 before knocking off Villanova 34-31 in the quarterfinals. The Bearkats' road to the championship ended one game shy of Frisco with a 35-3 defeat against the eventually national champion North Dakota State.

Sam Houston finished No. 6 in both final polls while the Lions (9-4 overall) were No. 12 in the Coaches' Poll and No. 14 in the Sports Network Poll.

In the NFL draft, Northwestern State defensive tackle Deon Simons was taken in the seventh round (223 overall) by the New York Jets while Central Arkansas wide receiver Dezmin Lewis was selected 11 picks later in the seventh round (234 overall) by the Buffalo Bills.

2015

McNeese won its 14th Southland Conference regularseason title and its first since 2009 after the Cowboys rolled through league play at 9-0. The Cowboys finished two games ahead of Central Arkansas and Sam Houston State, both of which tied for second at 7-2 in conference.

The Southland was represented by McNeese and Sam Houston in the postseason. It marked the 16th FCS postseason appearance for the Cowboys and the ninth overall and fifth consecutive appearance for the Bearkats.

McNeese received the No. 4 seed in the playoffs and was set to host the winner of the first round game between Sam Houston and Southern Utah. The Bearkats won the offensive shootout with the Thunderbirds, 42-39, to set up a rematch of the Nov. 7 meeting between McNeese, which the Cowboys won 27-10. This time around, the Bearkats came out on the winning side with a 34-29 upset of the Cowboys and put an end to the historic season in Lake Charles. McNeese finished its campaign at 10-1.

Sam Houston continued to roll through the playoffs as it hosted Colgate in the quarterfinal round. The Bearkat offense got rolling early against the Raiders as Sam Houston won 48-21 to reach the semifinals for the second straight year and for the fourth time in five seasons. The Bearkats' postseason drive came to a stop for the second straight year in the semifinals as they fell to No. 1 seed Jacksonville State, 62-10.

Sam Houston finished the year No. 3 in the STATS Poll and No. 4 in the Coaches' Poll while McNeese finished the year No. 7 and No. 9 in the two polls, respectively.

In the NFL draft, Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Harland Miller was taken in the sixth round (205 overall) by the Arizona Cardinals while Central Arkansas defensive end Jonathan Woodard followed shortly behind in the seventh round (226 overall) by the Jacksonville Jaguars. Sam Houston State punter Lachlan Edwards was the final league player drafted as he went to the New York Jets in the seventh round (235 overall).

The origin of the game's finest performers — Walter Payton, Jerry Rice, Buck Buchanan, Tony Romo, Kurt Warner, Steve McNair, Rich Gannon and Brian Westbrook — the FCS annually proves itself as fertile ground for talent and the development of future stars and professional Hall of Famers. Coaching legends such as Eddie Robinson, Bobby Bowden, Jim Tressel, Mack Brown and Tubby Raymond and all led programs at FCS institutions during their outstanding careers.

With an expansion to 24 teams in 2013, the NCAA Division I Football Championship annually gives the FCS a superb on-the-field playoff event, culminating with a week-long celebration in Frisco, Texas. The Division I Football Championship is proving to be one of the NCAA's premiere postseason events. Frisco has played host to the game for the last three seasons and will be home to the championship game through at least the 2020 season after receiving a four-year extension before the 2016 game.

Since 1982, the Southland Conference, which has been based in Frisco since 2006, has been a proud and prominent member of the FCS, and has an annual expectation of competing for the Division I national championship and placing multiple teams into postseason play. In addition to winning one Division I title, the Southland has also placed teams in eight National Championship Games, including in 2011 and 2012 when Sam Houston State and North Dakota State met. As a conference, the Southland has won 59 Division I playoff games.

The Southland is one of 11 prestigious leagues that earn automatic qualification into the Division I Football Championship, a group that includes the Big Sky, Big South, Missouri Valley Football, Mid-Eastern Athletic, Northeast, Ohio Valley and Southern conference as well as the Colonial Athletic Association and the Patriot and Pioneer leagues.

Central Arkansas, Houston Baptist Open Conference Play Sept. 1

Central Arkansas will host Houston Baptist Thursday, Sept. 1, to open up the 2016 Southland Conference football season. The game, which will be televised on the American Sports Network, will kickoff at 6 p.m., CT. It will mark the second consecutive season a league contest will open up the football season with Southeastern Louisiana knocking off Northwestern State 34-20 to open up the 2015 campaign. Houston Baptist is starting its third year in the Southland and is 0-2 all-time against Central Arkansas. Last season, the Bears defeated the Huskies 43-7 in Houston.

Ten Southland Teams Take to the Field on Opening Weekend

Northwestern State will be the third league team to kick off the 2016 season as the Demons open play Friday, Sept. 2 at Baylor. Kickoff is set for 6:30 p.m. on Fox Sports Network. Seven schools will begin play Saturday, starting with Abilene Christian at Air Force at 1 p.m. on the Mountain West Network followed by Southeastern Louisiana at Oklahoma State at 2:30 p.m. on FSN. Three games kick off at 6 p.m. with UIW hosting Texas A&M-Kingsville, McNeese welcoming Tarleton State to Lake Charles, and Sam Houston playing Oklahoma Panhandle State in Huntsville. Sam Houston will broadcast its game on ESPN3. At 7 p.m., Lamar will host Coastal Carolina on ESPN3 while Stephen F. Austin visits Texas Tech on FSN. Nicholls opens the season with its bye week and will begin play the next week when the Colonels play at Georgia at 11 a.m. on the SEC Network.

Lamar's Harrington Returns after Record-Breaking 2015 Campaign

Harrington completed the 2015 regular season as the all-time single-season rushing leader in league history with 2,092 yards, which led the FCS by more than 300 yards and set the conference record by more than 400 yards. The senior from Kingwood, Texas, finished second in the STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Year voting after leading the nation in all-purpose yards per game (213.36), rushing touchdowns (21) and rushing yards per game (190.2) while finishing second in scoring (12.5) and third in rush yards per carry (7.86).

Southland, Ohio Valley Propose Permanent 12-Game Schedule

The Southland and Ohio Valley conferences will propose legislation for a permanent 12th football game in the NCAA Division I Football Championship subdivision. The proposal, that would permissively lift the current restriction of 11 regular season games in most seasons, is scheduled for submission into the 2016-17 NCAA Division I legislative cycle. Currently, FCS programs are only permitted a 12th game in years when there are 13 weekends between Labor Day Weekend and the weekend prior to Thanksgiving, something that will naturally occur just four times over the next 15 seasons. The permissive proposal will call for the weekend prior to the Labor Day weekend to become available for the initial games of an FCS season. FCS teams, like other Division I programs, are normally restricted to starting a

season the Thursday prior to Labor Day, except those teams in the annual FCS Kickoff Game, a nationally-televised contest played on the earlier weekend, also referred to as "Week Zero." Without a proposal and subsequent approval, FCS will only have a 12th game opportunity in 2019, 2024, 2025 and 2030. During these four seasons, or others that naturally allow 12 games, the proposal would not apply.

McNeese Claims League-Record 14th Southland Title, Rolls Through Schedule Unblemished

McNeese claimed its 14th regular-season title and first since 2009 after the Cowboys finished 9-0 in conference play and 10-0 overall. The Cowboys were the only team in FCS to finish the regular season without a loss. Sam Houston State and Central Arkansas tied for second with a 7-2 mark in league play. The 2015 season was the first time the conference played nine league contests in a season.

Southland Sends Two Teams to FCS Playoffs

The Southland Conference placed two teams in the 2015 playoffs with McNeese and Sam Houston State. McNeese headed into Selection Sunday as champions of the league, and earned the No. 4 overall seed in the field of 24. However, the bracket set up to have the Cowboys play the winner of the first round game between Sam Houston State and Southern Utah. The Bearkats won the offensive battle between the Thunderbirds 42-39 to set up a rematch between McNeese. Earlier in the season, the Cowboys upended the Bearkats 27-10. This time around, the Bearkats would prove too much as they advanced to the quarterfinals with a 34-29 victory. Sam Houston would then reach the semifinals for the fourth time in five years after cruising by Colgate 48-21. Unfortunately, the Bearkats' postseason run would come up one-game short of the championship as they fell to No. 1 Jacksonville State, 62-10.

Bearkats Dominate Preseason All-League Teams

Sam Houston State dominated the all-conference teams by placing 14 student-athletes among the two squads. The Bearkats had eight players earn first-team honors with six coming on the offensive side of the ball. Junior Yedidiah Louis led the way for the Bearkats after picking up first team honors as a wide receiver and all-purpose player. Joining Louis were junior running back Cory Avery, senior offensive linemen Bridge Blunt and Curtise Riser, senior placekicker Luc Swimberghe, junior defensive end P.J. Hall and senior defensive back Darion Sanders.

Two Award Winners Return

Two of the Southland Conference's individual award winners from last year are back this season, including Lamar running back Kade Harrington, the league's player of the year, along with Abilene Christian defensive back Jabari Butler, the freshman of the year a season ago. Harrington, who finished second in the STATS FCS Player of the Year voting, set a league record with 2,092 rushing yards. Butler, who was a finalist for the STATS FCS Freshman of the Year, led the league with six interceptions and ranked second with 15 passes defended last season.

McNeese Looks to Defend Title under New Leadership

Lance Guidry was named the 15th head coach in McNeese history on Dec. 16, 2015. Guidry is a 1995 graduate of McNeese. He replaces Matt Viator who left to become the head coach at Louisiana-Monroe. In 2015, Guidry helped McNeese win its 14th Southland Conference championship, a league record, while the team posted a perfect regular season. His defense ranked 12th nationally in total defense (allowing 300.2 yards per game), third in both scoring defense and red zone defense, and fourth in rushing defense. In addition, the Cowboys' defense ranked second in 4th-down conversion defense sixth in first downs defense, and seventh in 3rd-down conversion defense. McNeese will represent Guidry's first full-time head coaching job at the collegiate level. He acted as interim head coach at Miami University (Ohio) in 2010 and Western Kentucky University in 2012, leading both teams into postseason bowl games. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at McNeese in 1994 then returned as the school's defensive coordinator from 2000-04, and in 2008, coached the defensive backs.

Frisco Will Host FCS Title Game for Seventh Straight Year

Before the 2016 championship game, the NCAA agreed to a four-year extension with Frisco, Texas, for the Division I Football Championship title game to be held at Toyota Stadium and hosted by the Southland Conference, the city of Frisco and the Hunt Sports Group. Frisco has hosted the last six FCS title games and with the championship guaranteed to return through at least the 2020 championship.

Eleven Games Scheduled vs. FBS in 2015

A year after playing 12 games against teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision, Southland teams will face 11 such opponents in 2016. With the conference schedule at nine games, open dates to schedule non-conference opponents were limited to just two weekends. The league has 22 wins against FBS teams since 2000, and will look for some more wins against FBS foes since being shutout in 2015. In 2014, the league picked up two wins against FBS opponents with Abilene Christian knocking off Troy (38-35) and Northwestern State upsetting Louisiana Tech (30-27). Nicholls and Houston Baptist are the only two Southland teams to play multiple FBS opponents with the Colonels traveling to Georgia and South Alabama while the Huskies visit Western Kentucky and UTEP. In 2016, the Southland will play teams from the American Athletic, Big 12, Southeastern, Mountain West, Conference USA and Sun Belt conferences.



- The Wildcats will return starters Austin Hisler (center), Chance Rieken (guard) and Dakota Laws (guard) to the offensive line, and will welcome back Mayfield (tackle), who missed the 2015 season with a knee injury.
- Junior RB De'Andre Brown closed with a flourish with 176 yards rushing in the final game of the 2015 season to finish with 735 rushing yards. He's the sixth returning rusher in the league and needs 82 carries, 362 yards and 9 TDs to break into ACU's career top 10 in each category.

DEFENSE

- The Wildcats return junior LB Sam Denmark, who led FCS football in total tackles (138) and tackles per game (12.5).
- The Wildcats also return sophomore CB Jabari Butler, who finished with a league-leading 6 INTs in 2015 and was voted the league's Freshman of the Year.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Austin Kilcullen returns as the Wildcats' punter and will be looking to rebound from a season that saw him average just 38.6 yards per punt in 2015.

CAREER RECORD 22-23 (FOUR SEASONS)

RECORD AT SCHOOL 22-23 (FOUR SEASONS)

The 2016 season will mark Ken Collums' fifth season as the 19th head football coach in ACU history.

In 2015, ACU finished 3-8 overall after a spate of injuries devoured the Wildcats, at one point forcing them to play two games while missing as many as 17 players on the original two-deep.

In 2014 – ACU's first season as a full member of the Southland Conference at the NCAA Division I FCS level – Collums led ACU to a 6-6 overall record and a 4-4 conference mark. ACU finished tied for fifth in the league after a seasonending 37-35 road win over 24th-ranked Stephen F. Austin.

Collums coached sophomore quarterback Parker McKenzie to a spectacular season in his first year as the starter. McKenzie threw for 3,084 yards and 22 touchdowns, earning honorable mention all-conference honors and becoming the fourth ACU quarterback under Collums' tutelage to throw for more than 3,000 yards in a season.

The Wildcats were again one of the best teams in the conference and in the nation in turnover ratio as ACU was plus-9 in the category (16 turnovers and 25 takeaways). The Wildcats were among conference leaders in points per game (32.7 ppg), yards per game (438.0 ypg), passing yards per game (275.3 ypg) and rushing yards per game (162.7 ypg).

In his first season as the head coach (2012), he led the Wildcats to a 7-4 record in their final season as a member of NCAA Division II and the Lone Star Conference.

Since he re-joined the ACU coaching staff prior to the 2005 season, Collums' offenses have ranked among the best in the nation. The Wildcats have ranked in the top seven in NCAA Division II football in total offense five times in the last eight years, including first in 2008, second in 2007, third in 2011 and fourth in 2006. The pass offense has ranked third twice and sixth twice, and the rushing offense has ranked as high as ninth in the nation (2008).

While coaching at Central Arkansas, Collums led the Bears to some of the greatest offensive seasons in school history. In 2002 – Collums' first year as offensive coordinator – the Bears were No. 8 nationally in points per game (37.5), No. 3 in passing yards per game (310.5) and No. 9 in total offense (446 yards per game). In 2004, UCA featured a balanced attack that racked up 38 points per game (No. 14), 477.7 yards per game (No. 6), 269 passing yards per game (No. 19) and 208.5 rushing yards per game (No. 26).

As a freshman at Central Arkansas, Collums led the Bears to the 1991 NAIA national championship.

- The UCA Bears open the season with three consecutive home games and four straight within the state of Arkansas (Game 4 at Arkansas State). UCA did not play a home game until Oct. 3 last season
- UCA must replace NFL draftee Jonathan Woodard (Jacksonville Jaguars) on the defensive front, along with five senior offensive linemen lost to graduation.

OFFENSE

- · UCA returns junior quarterback Hayden Hildebrand, along with its top three three receivers (Desmond Smith, Jatavious Wilson, Brandon Cox) from a year ago. Smith, a senior from Bentonville, Ark., led the SLC in receptions per game and receiving yards per game last season.
- . The Bears had the No. 4 scoring offense in the league a year ago, averaging 28.7 points per game, and No. 4 total offense, averaging 415.2 yards per game. UCA was also No. 1 in turnover margin at +9.

DEFENSE

- The top returnees on the defensive side of the ball are cornerback Tremon Smith, leading tackler DB Devin Spurlock, LB/DB George Odum (No. 3 tackler) and LB Garrett Sharp (No. 5 tackler). Smith ranked second in the SLC in interceptions with five.
- . UCA was third in the Southland in scoring defense in 2015, allowing 25.2 points per game. The Bears were also second in rushing defense, giving up just 133.5 yards per game on the ground.

Coach Steve Campbell, just the third head football coach at the University of Central Arkansas in the past 34 years, brought a new excitement to the program when he arrived prior to the 2014 season. He also brought an established winning tradition and an impressive resume to Conway.

He led the Bears to a 6-6 record in his first season with a new coaching staff and against a brutal schedule, and to a 7-4 mark and a second-place finish in the Southland Conference in Year Two.

Under Campbell's direction, the Bears led the Southland Conference in scoring at 40.7 points per game, were No. 2 in passing offense (282.2) and scored more than 45 points four times, including victories margins of 70-0, 52-18 and 58-35 in 2014. In 2015, the Bears were fourth in the SLC in total offense and total defense, and second in rushing defense and third and scoring defense.

Campbell has won three national championships at three different schools, as a player and coach. Campbell was an All-Conference center when Troy State won an NCAA Division II national championship in 1987. As head coach at Delta State University, Campbell won another D-II national title in 2000. Campbell then coached Mississippi Gulf Coast CC (MGCCC) to the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) championship in 2007.

Campbell, who played at Southeastern Louisiana and Troy, began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Auburn University in 1988-89 under legendary coach Pat Dye, then went to Delta State as offensive line coach and offensive coordinator from 1990-92. Campbell was offensive coordinator at Nicholls State and then running backs coach and head coach at Southwest (Mississippi) Community College before taking over the Delta State program as head coach in 1999.

The Statesmen went 27-8 during Campbell's tenure, including a 14-1 national championship season in 2000. DSU beat UCA 52-21 in Conway that year. Campbell was named the AFCA National Coach of the Year following that championship season. The Statesmen set D-II championship game records of 63 points, 649 yards and 36 first downs in the 63-34 win over Bloomsberg University.

Campbell was offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Middle Tennessee State in 2002, and offensive line coach under Jackie Sherrill at Mississippi State in 2003. He took over at MGCSS in 2004 and won three state JUCO championships and led the Bulldogs to seven straight postseason trips.

CAREER RECORD 31-32-1 (SIX SEASONS)

RECORD AT SCHOOL 4-18 (TWO SEASONS)

Vic Shealy was named the first head football coach in Houston Baptist University history on April 9, 2012. Shealy won an NAIA national championship while head coach at Azusa Pacific University and served as defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of Kansas prior to arriving at HBU.

In addition to serving as head coach at Azusa Pacific, Shealy, 50, was an assistant at Kansas, Richmond, UNLV, Air Force, Austin Peay State, Mars Hill College and a graduate assistant at Baylor.

In HBU's first official season in 2014, the Huskies registered their first Southland Conference win on Homecoming, defeating Nicholls, 31-21, on Oct. 25. Five student-athletes earned all-conference honors, including two second-team selections, one academic all-conference honoree and one tabbed Freshman All-America. In Shealy's second year, two more Huskies earned all-conference honors and one was named to the academic all-conference team. Linebacker Garrett Dolan ranked among the top 10 nationally in tackles per game and punter Christian Guzman ranked among the top 10 nationally in yards per punt.

Shealy served as defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Kansas, was the defensive coordinator at Richmond in 2009 and a Austin Peay in 1994. At UNLV, he was the assistant head coach from 2005-08, after serving as secondary coach at Air Force from 1999-2004. Shealy was also assistant head coach at Austin Peay from 1988-89.

As the head coach at Azusa Pacific from 1995-98, Shealy led the Cougars to the NAIA national championship in his final season. He posted an overall record of 27-14-1 at Azusa Pacific, including a 12-2 record during the championship run. His first team went 4-4-1, followed by a 7-3 season in 1996, the program's first winning season in seven years. Shealy was named NAIA Coach of the Year and the Shutt National Coach of the Year in 1998.

While at Richmond, the Spiders were ranked No. 1 nationally for seven weeks and ranked ninth in scoring defense en route to an 11-2 season. Shealy helped Air Force to a pair of bowl appearances in the Silicon Valley Bowl in 2000 and the San Francisco Bowl in 2002. He also appeared with Baylor in the Liberty Bowl in 1985 and has seen six of his former players go on to careers in the National Football League.

Shealy earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Richmond in 1984, then a Master's degree in physical education from Baylor in 1986.

Veteran head coach Larry Kennan has quickly raised the profile of the University of the Incarnate Word football program in his first four years at the helm. Since coming on board in December of 2011, Kennan has brought a positive attitude to his position every single day.

Kennan, a former NFL assistant coach and World Football League head coach, has the Cardinals on the cusp of being a major contender for a Southland Conference championship. Entering the final year of the transition from Division II to Division I, the Cardinals are ready to compete against the top teams in the conference. Kennan led UIW to a fourth place finish and a winning record in the Southland in 2015.

The 2015 team went 6-5 overall and led all Division I programs in the state of Texas in yards allowed per game. The big names on the team were outside linebacker Myke Tavarres, tight end Cole Wick and quarterback Trent Brittain. Tavarres was the Southland Conference Newcomer of the Year, AFCA First Team All-America, STATS First Team All-America and AP Second Team All-America while setting school records for tackles, tackles for loss and sacks in a season. Wick was a first team all-conference selection and Brittain rewrote the record books for passing stats.

It only took Kennan two seasons to show a significant upgrade in the product on the field for UIW. The 2013 season proved to a best in the program's first five years of existence. A 6-5 record, the first winning season for the program, and a few milestone victories made it a memorable season.

The 2014 season was one that went bad from the start with the loss of starting quarterback Trent Brittain in the first quarter of the first game to a season-ending injury. Despite the loss of Brittain and a few other starters to season-ending injuries, Kennan remained upbeat and the Cardinals improved throughout the season.

Kennan patrolled the sidelines in 2012 for the first time since 1997, however he remained close to the game during his time away from coaching. He was executive director of the NFL Coaches Association based in Washington, D.C. for the 13 years prior to becoming the head coach of the Cardinals. The Cardinals were only 2-9 in Kennan's first year at the helm.

Prior to his career in the NFL, Kennan was an offensive coordinator for three years at both Nevada-Las Vegas and SMU. He took over as head coach at Lamar University in 1979 and spent three years in the Southland Conference. He went 13-17-3 before moving on to the NFL.

Ray Woodard has been at the helm of the Lamar University football program since its resurrection seven years ago. Since an impressive five-win campaign in its first season back, Cardinals' fans have been witness to the consistent growth of the program.

Woodard's young charges continued a record-setting pace in 2014, which was capped by LU tying a school record for wins as a four-year program. Adding to the excitement of the eight-win season, the Cards picked up the record-setting victory at rival McNeese on a field goal with seconds remaining. The win was Lamar's first against McNeese and against a nationally ranked opponent since the sport's return to Beaumont.

For an encore, the Cardinals recorded one of their biggest wins in program history with an upset at No. 3 Sam Houston State the following season. Junior running back Kade Harrington capped the 2015 season by becoming the first player in program history to be named Southland Player of the Year. He ended the season by being runner-up in the balloting for the STATS FCS National Offensive Player of the Year award.

All told, Woodard has produced 43 All-SLC selections, including nine first-team players, 10 All-Americans -- including one Freshman All-American – one CFPA National Punter Returner of the Year, one SLC Player of the Year, one league newcomer of the year, one conference freshman of the year and an SLC Student-Athlete of the Year.

LU made its historic return to the gridiron in 2010. Woodard guided the Cardinals to a 5-6 overall record that season, which included a 4-2 mark in newly refurbished Provost Umphrey Stadium while playing in front of capacity crowds in their first four home games.

Woodard was named the eighth football coach at LU by president Dr. James Simmons and then athletics director Billy Tubbs on May 19, 2008. He came to Beaumont after serving three seasons at Navarro College - the final as head coach.

Woodard also had a successful playing career, from his days at Corrigan-Camden HS to Kilgore College and the University of Texas to five years in the NFL. After earning 13 letters in four sports at Corrigan-Camden from 1975-79, he walked on at Kilgore College then went on to become a two-time All-America selection as a defensive tackle from 1980-81.

Woodard received his bachelor's degree in kinesiology and history from Sam Houston State in 1988 and his master's in education from the University of Texas at Tyler in 1991. Woodard received his Doctorate in Educational Leadership in October 2014.





• Former defensive coordinator Lance Guidry was promoted to head coach during the offseason and has broadened his DWA style (Defense With Attitude) to the entire team. Guidry will be starting his 10th season on the coaching staff

On December 16, 2015, Lance Guidry was named the 15th head coach in school history while challenging the Mc-Neese Faithful to "Cowboy Up."

In 2015, Guidry helped McNeese win its 14th Southland Conference championship, a league record, while the team posted a perfect regular season.

His defense ranked 12th nationally in total defense (allowing a tad over 300 yards per game), third in both scoring defense and red zone defense, and fourth in rushing defense. In addition, the Cowboys' defense ranked second in 4th-down conversion defense sixth in first downs defense, and seventh in 3rd-down conversion defense.

McNeese represents Guidry's first full-time head coaching job at the collegiate level. He acted as interim head coach at Miami University (Ohio) in 2010 and Western Kentucky University in 2012, leading both teams into postseason bowl games.

He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at McNeese in 1994 then returned as the school's defensive coordinator from 2000-04, and in 2008, coached the defensive backs.

In his 10 combined years on the McNeese staff, the Cowboys have compiled an 86-35 record, including a 50-16 mark in Southland Conference games. During that time McNeese has won four conference championships (2001-03, 2015), made six FCS playoff appearances (1994, 2000-03, 2013, 2015) and played in the 2002 FCS National Championship game.

Before returning to McNeese, Guidry served as defensive coordinator at Western Kentucky in 2011 and 2012 and was named interim head coach on Dec. 8 of 2012 to lead WKU against Central Michigan in the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl in Detroit, Mich., a game the Hilltoppers dropped 24-21.

Guidry joined the Miami staff after serving as the defensive secondary coach at McNeese in 2008 and led the Redhawks to a 35-21 victory over Middle Tennessee as the interim head coach in the 2011 GoDaddy.com Bowl, helping Miami finish off a 10-4 season after going 1-11 the previous year.

A veteran coach in Louisiana football's high school ranks, Guidry served as secondary coach at Leesville High School in 1995 and 1996, helping lead the Wampus Cats to the state championship game in 1995. He also coached defensive backs at Carencro (La.) High School (1997-99), then returned years later to serve as the Golden Bears' head coach (2005-07).

In between his stints at Carencro, Guidry served as defensive coordinator and coached the secondary at McNeese (2000-04).

- The Colonel offense will be led by senior quarterback Tuskani Figaro. After redshirting in 2014, Figaro started the first nine games last year before suffering a season-ending injury.
- While Nicholls loses a big chunk in the backfield, the Colonels return three of their four top receivers from last season. Senior C.J. Bates had a breakout season in 2015 after transferring from Louisiana-Lafayette as he hauled in a team-best 28 catches for 395 yards and three touchdowns.

DEFENSE

• The Colonels ended last season ranked sixth in the league in total defense and seventh in scoring defense. The defense also proved to be one of the league's toughest to throw against, allowing an SLC-best 178.2 passing yards per game.

SPECIAL TEAMS

 Nicholls will only have one returnee in special teams as junior Tyler St. Germain comes back after being the Colonels' primary punter in 2015. Listed atop the depth chart for kicker is junior David McKey, who has been the Colonels' backup since 2014. Nicholls will need to replace its kick returners as just one of 42 kicks were fielded by a player on the 2016 roster.

CAREER RECORD 3-8 (ONE SEASON)

RECORD AT SCHOOL 3-8 (ONE SEASON)

In his first season as head coach at Nicholls, Rebowe revived the Colonel program, which had went winless in 2014, by leading the team to a 3-8 record. Rebowe quickly turned things around as the team nearly won two of its first three conference games before ending a lengthy losing streak with a victory over Houston Baptist. With their first taste of victory since 2013, the Colonels went on to close out the season with two more wins in its final three games - highlighted by a thrilling 27-24 victory in the River Bell Classic at Southeastern Louisiana.

Rebowe, a 53-year old native of Norco, La., was named head football coach on Nov. 21, 2014, becoming the 10th in the program's history. Rebowe, who coached at Louisiana-Lafayette as an assistant for 11 seasons and was a former assistant coach at Nicholls for six years, not only brought a wealth of experience coaching at the collegiate level, but has strong ties to the state of Louisiana having coached within the borders his entire career.

Rebowe helped lead the Ragin' Cajun program to four consecutive New Orleans Bowl victories and a conference championship under head coach Mark Hudspeth. During his tenure at ULL, Rebowe served as the safeties coach (2004-07, 2011-14) and linebackers coach (2008-10).

In 2014, ULL's defense ranked first in the Sun Belt in rushing yards allowed and red zone defense, while ranking second in points allowed. The defense finished with seven interceptions on the year, including two by cornerback Corey Trim, who was named All-Sun Belt Second Team Defense. Under Rebowe's tutelage in 2013, the Cajuns tied for the conference lead with 14 interceptions. Two years prior, his safeties combined for five interceptions, with three returned for touchdowns.

Rebowe's group had a stellar year in his first season as defensive backs coach in 2004 as the defense ranked 11th in the nation in passing yards allowed. Both of his starting safeties that year, C.C. Brown and Antwain Spann, would go on to the NFL. The following season, the pass defense finished 23rd in the nation in yards allowed.

In 1995, Rebowe took his first collegiate job, joining Darren Barbier's staff at Nicholls. From '95-'99, he served as defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator before coaching the receivers in 2000.

Rebowe began his coaching career in 1988 at his alma mater, Destrehan High School.

Following his stint with Nicholls, Rebowe coached the cornerbacks at ULM from 2001-03.

STORYLINES

• For the second straight year, a graduate transfer is a prime candidate to be NSU's starting quarterback. Brooks Haack graduated from UL Lafayette after starting eight games in his junior season. Juniors J.D. Almond and Joel Blumenthal are also candidates to compete for the starting role.

OFFENSE

- The Demons have veteran stalwarts up front in right guard Terrance Boyd and left tackle Korliss Johnson. Boyd has 26 career starts entering his senior season and Johnson, a junior, has 20.
- Senior running back De'Mard Llorens has developed from a walk-on to one of the most productive backs in school history. Llorens has 21 career touchdowns and 1,528 career rushing yards on 310 career carries, needing 725 yards to break into NSU's career top 10.

DEFENSE

• Senior safety Adam Jones is aiming to regain the production of his sophomore season, when he had 74 tackles, 5 interceptions and a fumble recovery. Missing the first two games in 2015, his numbers dropped to 49 tackles, 1 interception and 2 recoveries.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- The Demons lost two special teams All-Americans, 2014 all-purpose man Ed Eagan and 2015 kicker Chris Moore, to graduation. They and graduated punter Andy Wickman all were three-year starting specialists.
- The projected replacement for Eagan as return specialist is senior receiver Shakeir Ryan, who has only two career kickoff returns (both last year), but has quietly compiled 108 career receptions (7 TDs), fifth in school history.

HEAD COACH FOURTH SEASON SOUTHERN MISS, 1988

CAREER RECORD 43-54 (NINE SEASONS)

RECORD AT SCHOOL 16-19 (THREE SEASONS)

For all the progress Jay Thomas has made while building a rock-solid foundation in his first three seasons as the Northwestern State football coach, he's eager for a breakthrough.

After he produced the best back-to-back seasons in a decade, and much more, for Demon football during his first two years in charge, he received a two-year contract extension from veteran athletics director Greg Burke. The third season in 2015, front-loaded with a brutal opening month, began unsuccessfully. But there was no panic, reflective of the steady leadership by Thomas, and success followed once again.

Riding the momentum of four wins in the last six games in 2015, the losses coming to the Southland's FCS playoff entries, the needle is definitely pointing forward for NSU. Thomas believes the Demons are on the path to challenging for the Southland Conference title and FCS playoff berths.

A key: his deep knowledge of the Southland gained through 17 seasons in the league, including six (2004-09) as head coach at Nicholls. He was finalist for national coach of the year honors in a 2005 playoff season by the Colonels.

Along with last year's strong finish, the 2014 season included noteworthy wins over Conference USA runner-up Louisiana Tech and FCS semifinalist and Southland co-champion Sam Houston State.

Thomas, 55, had been defensive coordinator and assistant head coach in 2012 at Division II Missouri Southern, following two seasons as the Demons' defensive line coach and assistant head coach in 2010 and 2011.

Previously, Thomas spent 14 seasons at Nicholls State, the last six (2004-2009) as head coach. Despite hurricanes that interrupted preseason or the regular season in three years, he had an overall 27-35 record that included Nicholls' only Southland Conference championship (2005 co-championship) and wins over four nationally-ranked teams and FBS foe Rice. His Colonels finished the 2005 season ranked 17th in the Sports Network's FCS Top 25, and reached a school-record high ranking of 13th in 2007.

Thomas guided Nicholls to a pair of winning seasons and a .500 record in a third season in a program that had only one season of .500 or better in the previous seven campaigns. His three .500 or better seasons gave Nicholls three of only four at that level in the past 14 years.

He was defensive line coach at Southeast Missouri State from 1993-99 and was a graduate assistant coach under the legendary Pete Jenkins at LSU from 1988-90.



STORYLINES

- Sam Houston is one of only three teams that have earned NCAA Division I Football Championship playoff berths each of the last five years (the other two are North Dakota State and New Hampshire). The Kats have reached the semi-finals four of the last five seasons, advancing to the Championship Game in Frisco in both 2011 and 2012.
- Sam Houston leads all Texas Division I football teams in victories during the last five seasons (since 2011). The Kats have won 56 games followed by Baylor 50, Houston 48, TCU 45 and Texas A&M 43.

OFFENSE

- Running back Corey Avery rushed for 1,483 yards as a sophomore last year, the third highest single season total in school history.
- In only two years, wide receiver Yedidiah Louis has climbed to No. 6 in Sam Houston career receiving with 142 catches for 1,797 yards. He ranks No. 16 in career all-purpose yards with 2,362.

DEFENSE

• Defensive end P. J. Hall has been named to five All-America teams in his two years as a Bearkat. He was a STATS FCS second team and AP third team selection in 2015. He placed 15th in the balloting for the STATS FCS "Defensive Player of the Year." The two-time All-Southland first teamer is the program's all-time leader in tackles for losses (52 for 205 yards) and is second all-time at SHSU in career sacks (23).

SPECIAL TEAMS

• Kicker Luc Swimberghe begins his senior season ranked No. 2 in Sam Houston career kicking points with 179 PATs and 31 field goals for 272 points. He is 53 points away from passing all-time leader Miquel Antonio (324 points in 2009 through 2012).

CAREER RECORD 196-82-1 (22 SEASONS)

RECORD AT SCHOOL 22-9 (TWO SEASONS)

In two seasons as head coach at Sam Houston State University, K. C. Keeler directed the Bearkats to a 22-9 record that includes five victories over top 10 ranked opponents and six wins in NCAA post-season action. His SHSU teams have made back-to-back FCS semifinals appearances and won a Southland Conference championship.

During 22 years as a head football coach, Keeler has produced a record of 196 victories, only 82 losses and one tie. His teams at Rowan University, Delaware and Sam Houston State have combined for 13 NCAA post-season playoff appearances, eight conference championships and played in eight national championship games.

Keeler was named as Sam Houston's 15th head football coach on January 23, 2014. He has coached five National Football League draft picks including Super Bowl XLVII MVP quarterback Joe Flacco. He has tutored 76 All-America players and 21 student-athletes who have earned either national or district CoSIDA Academic All-America honors.

As head coach at Delaware, Keeler rolled up an 86-52 record in 11 seasons from 2002 to 2012. His Fightin' Blue Hens won the FCS national championship in 2003 and reached the national championship game in 2007 and 2010. His squads won Atlantic 10 Conference titles in 2003 and 2004 and the Colonial Athletic Association championship in 2010. Delaware went 11-3 in the program's four trips to the FCS playoffs.

At Rowan University in Glassboro, N. J., Keeler produced an 88-21-1 record from 1993 to 2001 that included seven NCAA Division III playoff appearances with five trips to the National Championship game. His teams posted a 21-7 record in NCAA Division III playoff action.

Among Keeler's coaching honors are AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year, Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year, Maxwell Club Tri-State Coach of the Year and the All-America Football Foundation Johnny Vaught Head Coach Award.

Keeler began his coaching career as an assistant at Amherst College in Massachusetts in 1981, then moved to Rowan University in 1986. He was named head coach at Rowan in 1993. The Profs won four New Jersey Athletic Conference championships and finished as runner-up in the league twice in Keeler's nine seasons.

Kurt Charles "K. C." Keeler was born July 26, 1959, in Emmaus, Pa. He and his wife Janice are the parents of daughter Kate and son Jackson.

CAREER RECORD 76-35 (NINE SEASONS)

RECORD AT SCHOOL 29-20 (FOUR SEASONS)

In just four years at the helm of the Southeastern Louisiana football program, head coach Ron Roberts has helped the Lions reach new heights.

In his first four seasons, Roberts has led the Lions to a 29-20 overall record and a 22-9 Southland Conference mark. In 2013, Roberts was named the Southland Conference, AFCA Region 5 and Louisiana Coach of the Year and was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award.

The 2015 Lions were led by senior defensive back Harlan Miller, who was a finalist for the FCS Defensive Player of the Year and a Senior Bowl participant, and named All-America by STATS and the Associated Press. Miller was one of nine of Roberts' players to earn All-Southland Conference honors. Senior offensive lineman Joe Graves was named an FCS Academic All-Star and he was joined by senior defensive back Denzel Thompson on the Southland All-Academic team.

The 2014 Lions repeated as Southland Conference champions, sharing the regular season title with Sam Houston State, who defeated SLU in the first round of the playoffs. Miller, senior linebacker Isiah Corbett and junior kick returner Xavier Roberson earned All-America honors for a Lion team that finished the season ranked 12th and 14th in the final Football Championship Subdivision polls.

Under Roberts, the 2013 Lions won their first Southland Conference championship and their first league title of any kind since 1961. Southeastern finished with an 11-3 overall record and 7-0 mark in league play, earning its first-ever FCS playoff berth and the No. 4 national seed. The single-season school record victory total propelled the Lions to a No. 6 ranking in the final FCS Coaches and Sports Network polls.

In his inaugural season in Hammond, Roberts guided Southeastern to a 5-6 record, which equaled the combined wins by the Lions in 2010-11. Southeastern's 5-2 record in Southland Conference action in 2012 marked the most wins in conference play since 1978 when former coach Billy Brewer guided the Lions to a 5-1-1 mark in the Division II Gulf South Conference.

Named the 16th head coach in school history on December 19, 2011, Roberts brought a proven record of success to Hammond after a successful five-year tenure at Division II Delta State University.

At DSU, Roberts led the Statesmen to a 47-16 record, four 10-win seasons and two NCAA Super Region II titles that included an appearance in the 2010 NCAA Division II national championship game and the 2011 semifinals.

CAREER RECORD 117-71 (16 SEASONS)

RECORD AT SCHOOL 12-12 (TWO SEASONS)

Clint Conque is in his third season as the Lumberjacks' head coach, already setting a precedent for the success of SFA football.

In his first two seasons, Conque has posted a 12-12 record at the helm of the Lumberjacks, including a 9-8 record in Southland Conference play. Those wins have included three victories over nationally-ranked programs, including a 28-27 win at 21st-ranked Southeastern Louisiana in 2015.

During his first two years, Conque has mentored five All-SLC players, including second-team defensive end John Franklin in 2015. In addition, offensive linemen Terran Vaughn and Byron Williams both signed free agent contracts with the Oakland Raiders following the season.

In his first season in Nacogdoches, Conque led SFA to an 8-5 record, a five-win improvement from 2013, as the 2014 squad became just the 13th team in program history to reach the eight-win plateau. Picked to finish sixth in the preseason Southland Conference standings, SFA went 5-3 in SLC play, tying for third in the conference standings and earning a bid to the 2014 NCAA FCS playoffs.

SFA cracked the FCS Coaches Poll Top-25 twice in 2014, marking the first time the Lumberjacks had been ranked in the nation's top-25 since 2010. Conque helped guide the 'Jacks to their first NCAA playoff appearance since 2010, earning SLC Coach of the Year honors for the third time in his career and was a finalist for the FCS Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year for the fourth time.

Under Conque's guidance, senior running back Gus Johnson had the best rushing season in program history, setting six SFA rushing records and was named the SLC Player of the Year and while sophomore quarterback Zach Conque was named the SLC Newcomer of the Year.

Conque brought to Nacogdoches an impressive coaching resume built on success, posting an overall career record of 105-59 (.640) during his 14 seasons as the head coach at Central Arkansas. He departs as the all-time winningest coach in Bear program history while becoming just the second collegiate head coach in the state of Arkansas to amass 100 career victories.

Prior to being named the head coach at Central Arkansas, Conque spent 20 years as an assistant coach, including the offensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech for seven seasons. Conque's coaching career also includes stops at Samford, McNeese, St. Thomas More and Rayne High Schools.

MCNEESE RUNS THROUGH REGULAR SEASON UNDEFEATED

McNeese won its 14th Southland Conference regular-season title and its first since 2009 after the Cowboys rolled through league play at 9-0. The Cowboys finished two games ahead of Central Arkansas and Sam Houston State, both of which tied for second at 7-2 in conference.

The Southland was represented by McNeese and Sam Houston in the postseason. It marked the 16th FCS postseason appearance for the Cowboys and the ninth overall and fifth consecutive appearance for the Bearkats.

McNeese received the No. 4 seed in the playoffs and was set to host the winner of the first round game between Sam Houston and Southern Utah. The Bearkats won the offensive shootout with the Thunderbirds, 42-39, to set up a rematch of the Nov. 7 meeting between McNeese, which the Cowboys won 27-10. This time around, the Bearkats came out on the winning side with a 34-29 upset of the Cowboys and put an end to the historic season in Lake Charles. McNeese finished its campaign at 10-1.

Sam Houston continued to roll through the playoffs as it hosted Colgate in the quarterfinal round. The Bearkat offense got rolling early against the Raiders as Sam Houston won 48-21 to reach the semifinals for the second straight year and for the fourth time in five seasons. The Bearkats' postseason drive came to a stop for the second straight year in the semifinals as they fell to No. 1 seed Jacksonville State, 62-10.

Sam Houston finished the year No. 3 in the STATS Poll and No. 4 in the Coaches' Poll while McNeese finished the year No. 7 and No. 9 in the two polls, respectively.

Lamar junior running back Kade Harrington shattered single-season records as he finished second in the STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Year voting. The league's player of the year rushed for a school and conference record 2,092 yards, which leads the FCS by more than 300 yards and broke the conference mark by more than 400 yards. Harrington also finished the year ranked first in the nation in all-purpose yards per game (213.36), rushing touchdowns (21) and rushing yards per game (190.2) while finishing second in scoring (12.5) and third in rush yards per carry (7.86). Harrington set a school record with eight straight games of at least 100 yards rushing and rushed for at least 200 yards in six of the 11 games on the year. He set the league's single-game rushing record with 347 yards against Abilene Christian and has two of the top 10 single-game rushing marks in league history.

Three Southland players earned first-team All-America honors including Harrington, McNeese defensive back Wallace Scott, UIW linebacker Myke Tavarres and Sam Houston offensive lineman Donald Jackson, III.

be named the Southland football student-athlete of the year. Denmark holds an impressive 3.75 grade-point average in engineering. A native of Las Cruces, N.M., Denmark was a first-team all-conference selections after leading the league and the FCS in takcles (138), solo tackles (88) and solo tackles per game (8.0). He led the conference in tackles per game (12.5), which ranked him fourth in the FCS. Denmark ended the season third in ACU history in total tackles in a single season.

All 11 Southland football member institutions are represented on the all-academic team with Central Arkansas and UIW both recording a conference-best five members. Sam Houston State had four selections while Nicholls, Northwestern State, Southeastern Louisiana and Stephen F. Austin each had two members. The Southland had six CoSIDA selections with Central Arkansas senior offensive lineman Kyle Stouffer and Nicholls junior linebacker Geoffrey Hebert were named to the All-District 6 Team while Sam Houston State senior wide receiver Josh Reynolds, UIW junior defensive back Daryl Irby, Stephen F. Austin sophomore defensive back Marlon Walls and UIW senior linebacker Padyn Giebler earned a spot on the All-District 7 Team. Giebler and Hebert also represented the league on the 2015 Academic All-America First Team.



SOUTHLAND IN THE NFL

One of the premiere leagues in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision, the Southland Conference continues to emerge as a breeding ground for the future stars of the National Football League. From groundbreaking players such as Pro Football Hall of Famer Fred Dean to the league's newest crop of first-year hopefuls, the conference boasts a rich tradition of sending impact players to the NFL.

For each of the Southland's NFL-bound alumni, professional success starts in the classrooms and on the gridiron of the league's 11 active competing universities.

In 2016, three Southland players were selected in the NFL Draft, the most from the conference since four players were picked in 2009. Southeastern Louisiana's Harlan Miller was selected in the sixth round by the Arizona Cardinals followed by Central Arkansas' Jonathan Woodard and Sam Houston State's Lachlan Edwards, both of whom were taken in the seventh round.

In the 2013 NFL Draft, another Southland player joined the league as Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Robert Alford was picked in the second round (60th overall) by the Atlanta Falcons. Alford became the first Lion player ever to be drafted in the NFL and the league's highest draft pick since Stephen F. Austin's Mikhael Ricks was selected 59th overall by the San Diego Chargers in 1998.

A total of 24 former Southland Conference players appeared on NFL rosters heading into 2016 training camp. The Southland is one of five FCS conferences with at least 200 selections (211) in the NFL draft.

The Southland Conference led all FCS conferences with four selections in the 2009 draft and sent 11 players into preseason camps that summer. Only in 2002, when five players were among the more than 250 selections, were more Southland alumni drafted in the same season since 2000.

Former Sam Houston State quarterback Josh McCown is the conference's most experienced alumni in the NFL. Northwestern State's Terrance McGee completed 13 seasons in the NFL, with various teams. McCown enters the 2015 season as a member of the Cleveland Browns. He has played in every season since graduating from Sam Houston except

the 2010 season. He is one of two active Southland stars heading into the 2016 campaign with at least five years of NFL experience. Former Nicholls cornerback Lardarius Webb has played the last seven years in the NFL all with the Baltimore Ravens.

Former Northwestern State cornerback Terrance McGee, an All-American kick returner during his tenure with the Demons, is one of 10 players from the Southland Conference to have taken part in the Pro Bowl. He was selected to the AFC squad as the league's special teams' representative in 2005. Only Stephen F. Austin alumnus Jeremiah Trotter has played in the Pro Bowl more recently than McGee.

The Lumberjacks' former pass-rushing star retired in 2007 having taken part in four Pro Bowls as a representative of the Philadelphia Eagles, the last of which came in 2006. Former Arkansas State star Bill Bergey, who played in a five Pro Bowls, including one with the Cincinnati Bengals, also represented the Eagles in four Pro Bowls.

The conference's other four-time Pro Bowler is Fred Dean, arguably the most successful professional football player in the history of the Southland Conference. Dean, a four-time Pro Bowler, was a two-time Southland Defensive Player of the Year and a first-team all-Southland selection all four years of his career at Louisiana Tech. He is one of only five Southland players to earn that distinction. In all, Dean played for 11 seasons in the NFL, recording 93 sacks in 141 games for the San Diego Chargers and San Francisco 49ers. He twice hoisted the Vince Lombardi Trophy as a Super Bowl Champion alongside Joe Montana and in 2009 became the first Southland football player to be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio.

Like Dean, former Texas State standout Ricky Sanders won a pair of Super Bowl rings with the Washington Redskins during his seven-year career. The owner of multiple Super Bowl records, including most receiving yards (193), most total yards (235), most touchdowns in one quarter (two), most receiving yards in one quarter (168), and the longest touchdown reception (80, tie), Sanders joins Dean and 29 other former Southland players as members of at least one Super Bowl championship roster.

The Southland has seen former Nicholls players win Super Bowl rings in two of the last four seasons, as former Colonel Antonio Robinson was a member of the Green Bay Packers' Super Bowl XLVI champions. And, Webb was a member of the Super Bowl XLVII champion Baltimore Ravens. A total of 49 former players from the Southland have 67 Super Bowl appearances. Former Northwestern State cornerback is the most recent Southland player to appear in the Super Bowl, reaching the most recent two with the Seattle Seahawks and winning one in 2013.

More former NFL stars from the Southland include Stan Humphries, Fred Barnett, Roger Carr, Marvin Upshaw, Mike Barber, Bruce Collie, Tim McKyer, Pat Tilley, Jackie Harris, Eugene Seale, Bubby Brister, Leonard Smith, Billy Ryckman, Rafael Septien, Buford Jordan and Ray Brown, among many others.






